# HISTORY OF ILLINOIS LEGISLATORS' COMPENSATION AND EXPENSE ALLOWANCES

### Overview

The Legislative article of the 1970 Constitution says "A member shall receive a salary and allowances as provided by law, but changes in the salary of a member shall not take effect during the term for which he has been elected." Legislative salaries are now proposed by a Compensation Review Board, subject to disapproval by both houses of the General Assembly. Legislative leaders have received additional compensation since 1967, and committee chairmen and minority spokesmen since 1989. Legislators' salaries have been indexed for inflation since 1991, although they have rejected those increases for inflation in recent years. Their office allowances have been indexed since 2002.

### Salary

Until 1897, Illinois legislators got no salary; they were paid by the number of days in session. Under the 1848 Constitution they were paid \$2 a day for the first 42 days in attendance, dropping to \$1 a day thereafter—plus a travel allowance of 10¢ per mile.<sup>2</sup> The 1870 Constitution said legislators were to be paid \$5 a day, with no limit on number of days, until provided otherwise by law.<sup>3</sup> The General Assembly did not provide otherwise until 1897, when the \$5 per diem was replaced with a biennial salary of \$1,000.<sup>4</sup> Legislators were paid \$700 at the start of each General Assembly and \$300 when they adjourned *sine die*. This was not changed until 1909, when the salary was raised to \$1,000 a year.<sup>5</sup> Later salaries were as follows:

- The 1970 Constitution, Art. 4, sec. 11 prohibits salary increases during the term for which a member is elected; so any salary increase takes effect on the first day of the next General Assembly in January of the next odd-numbered year (or later if specified). Senators serving 4-year terms when an increase takes effect do not get the increase until they are re-elected and begin new terms.
- The 1870 Constitution set a \$50 limit on legislators' allowance for "postage, stationery, newspapers, and all other incidental expenses and perquisites" for the biennium. The 1970 Constitution sets no such limit.
