LEGISLATIVE SESSION DAYS SINCE 1951 AND SPECIAL SESSION DAYS SINCE 1971

Tables 1 and 2 on the following pages show the number of regular session days in each General Assembly from the 67th (1951-52) through the 2008 spring session of the 95th General Assembly. They show the number of special session days in each General Assembly from the 77th (1971-72) through August 13, 2008 of the 95th. Each table shows numbers of perfunctory days (during both regular and special sessions) in parentheses. The Senate Rules did not provide for perfunctory days until 1993.

Table 2 addresses special sessions, showing the subject of each session and whether it was called by the Governor or the legislative leaders. Numbers of special session days that were neither perfunctory, nor concurrent with regular session days, are indicated by bold numerals in parentheses. For example, "19(3)(1)" means that a special session lasted a total of 19 session days; three were perfunctory; and one was neither perfunctory nor concurrent with a regular session.

The Senate did not officially have perfunctory sessions until 1993. The Illinois Constitution, Art. 4, sec. 10 was amended at the November 1994 election by changing the intended last spring session date from June 30 to May 31.

- † The House also held a perfunctory session on January 3, 2002.
- ‡ Both houses held perfunctory sessions on October 23, 2003, and the Senate did so on October 29, 2003.
- # The Senate held a perfunctory session on January 6, 2004; the House held such sessions on January 6, 8, and 13 of that year.
- ♦ The Senate held a perfunctory session on November 5, 2004; the House did so on various days from July 26 through November 5, 2004.
- § The 2007 regular session continued intermittently, along with numerous special sessions, through the months of July, August, and September. The dates listed for adjournment were the last days each house met in regular session until the veto session began on October 2, as listed in the House and Senate Calendars. Also, August 1, 2007 was a regular session day for the Senate, along with a perfunctory session lasting from 4:06 to 4:11 p.m. Since the entire day was not listed as perfunctory, it is not included in parentheses as a perfunctory day. The Senate also held perfunctory sessions on September 19 and 26 (which are included in the totals for the regular session from January 10 to September 18).

The first number shown, not in parentheses, for each house is that house's total days of regular (not special) sessions, including both substantive and perfunctory session days. Each number in parentheses enumerates perfunctory session days; they are included in the first number.
