WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to learn of the death of Robert A. "Bob" Helman of Hyde Park, who passed away on October 4, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Bob Helman was born to Nathan and Ester (Weiss) Helman in 1934 and grew up on the West Side of Chicago; he graduated from Austin High School and attended the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign; he received his bachelor's degree and juris doctor from Northwestern University; he was discharged from the United States Army in 1958 and married Janet Williams; and

WHEREAS, Bob Helman began his legal career after his military discharge, joining Isham, Lincoln and Beale as its first Jewish lawyer; he moved his practice to Mayer Brown in 1967, serving as chairman from 1984 to 1998; he led the firm through a period of significant challenges and drove Mayer Brown to diversify and grow; it more than doubled in size under his leadership, and he remained a partner through 2023; throughout his career, he took pride in devoting time to civic and charitable causes, embracing his responsibility as a citizen and member of the community; and
