SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 5/234

Amends the Illinois Income Tax Act. In provisions concerning volunteer emergency workers, provides that, for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2026, "volunteer emergency worker" also includes a community policing volunteer, a volunteer auxiliary police officer, or a volunteer auxiliary deputy. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning revenue.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by changing Section 234 as follows:
- 6 (35 ILCS 5/234)
- 7 Sec. 234. Volunteer emergency workers.
- 8 (a) For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 9 2023 and beginning prior to January 1, 2028, each individual who (i) serves as a volunteer emergency worker for at least 9 10 months during the taxable year and (ii) does not receive 11 compensation for his or her services as a volunteer emergency 12 worker of more than \$5,000 for the taxable year may apply to 13 14 the Department for a credit against the taxes imposed by subsections (a) and (b) of Section 201. The amount of the 15 16 credit shall be \$500 per eligible individual. If a taxpayer described in this subsection (a) is a volunteer member of a 17 county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency 18 19 under the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, then the 20 taxpayer must serve as a volunteer emergency worker with the 21 county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency for 22 at least 100 hours during the taxable year. The aggregate amount of all tax credits awarded by the Department under this 2.3

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- 1 Section in any calendar year may not exceed \$5,000,000.
- 2 Credits shall be awarded on a first-come first-served basis.
- 3 (b) A credit under this Section may not reduce a taxpayer's liability to less than zero.
 - (c) By January 24 of each year, the Office of the State Fire Marshal shall provide the Department of Revenue an electronic file with the names of volunteer emergency workers, other than volunteer emergency workers who are volunteer members of a county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency under the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, who (i) volunteered for at least 9 months during the immediately preceding calendar year, (ii) did not receive compensation for their services as a volunteer emergency worker of more than \$5,000 during the immediately preceding calendar year, and (iii) are registered with the Office of the State Fire Marshal as of January 12 of the current year as meeting the requirements of items (i) and (ii) for the immediately preceding calendar year. The chief of the fire department, fire protection district, or fire protection association shall be responsible for notifying the State Fire Marshal of the volunteer emergency workers who met the requirements of items (i) and (ii) during the immediately preceding calendar year by January 12 of the current year. Notification shall be required in the format required by the State Fire Marshal. The chief of the fire department, fire protection district, or fire protection association shall be

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responsible for the verification and accuracy of their submission to the State Fire Marshal under this subsection.

By January 24, 2025, and by January 24 of each year thereafter, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security shall provide the Department of Revenue an electronic file with the names of volunteer emergency workers who (A) volunteered with a county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency pursuant to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act for at least 9 months during the immediately preceding calendar year, (B) did not receive compensation for their services as a volunteer emergency worker of more than \$5,000 during the immediately preceding calendar year, (C) volunteered with a county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency pursuant to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act for at least 100 hours during the immediately preceding calendar year, and (D) are registered with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security as of January 12 of the current year as meeting the requirements of items (A), (B), and (C) for the immediately preceding calendar year. The coordinator of the emergency services and disaster agency shall be responsible for notifying the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security of the volunteer emergency workers who met the requirements of items (A), (B), and (C) during the immediately preceding calendar year by January 12 of the current year. Notification shall be in the

- format required by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency
 and Office of Homeland Security. The coordinator of the
 emergency services and disaster agency shall be responsible
 for the verification and accuracy of their submission to the
 Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland
 Security under this subsection.
- (d) As used in this Section, "volunteer emergency worker" 7 8 means a person who serves as a member, other than on a 9 full-time career basis, of a fire department, fire protection 10 district, or fire protection association that has a Fire 11 Department Identification Number issued by the Office of the 12 State Fire Marshal and who does not serve as a member on a 13 full-time career basis for another fire department, protection district, fire protection 14 association, 15 governmental entity. For taxable years beginning on or after 16 January 1, 2024, "volunteer emergency worker" also means a 17 person who is a volunteer member of a county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency pursuant to the 18 19 Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act. For taxable years 20 beginning on or after January 1, 2026, "volunteer emergency 21 worker" also means a community policing volunteer, a volunteer 22 auxiliary police officer, or a volunteer auxiliary deputy.
- 23 (e) The Department shall adopt rules to implement and 24 administer this Section, including rules concerning 25 applications for the tax credit.
