**HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 767**

Offered by Representative May:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has 11 operating nuclear power reactors and more radioactive spent fuel than any other state in the nation; and

WHEREAS, An equipment malfunction, fire, human error, natural disaster, or terrorist attack could, separately or in combination, lead to a nuclear catastrophe with potentially devastating human, environmental, and economic consequences for the citizens of Illinois, the region, and nation; and

WHEREAS, The March 2011 nuclear accident at the Fukushima Daiichi plant in Japan has resulted in significant radiation exposure for countless Japanese citizens, billions of dollars in economic losses, and unimaginable hardship for thousands of Japanese families who have lost their homes and way of life; and

WHEREAS, All but one of the nuclear power plants in Illinois have reported groundwater leaks; and

WHEREAS, The LaSalle and Clinton power plants have suffered year-plus outages due to mechanical malfunctions and safety failures; and

WHEREAS, The earthquake risk at the Dresden nuclear power plant has been determined by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to exceed the capacity of its design; and

WHEREAS, Braidwood, Byron, Clinton, Dresden, LaSalle, and Quad Cities nuclear power plants do not periodically review their voluntary but critical Severe Accident Management Guidelines (SAMGs), according to a Nuclear Regulatory Commission audit conducted after the Fukushima disaster; and

WHEREAS, According to many independent experts, there are well-documented safety and security shortcomings at the nation's 104 operating nuclear reactors that can and should be corrected to improve public health and safety; and

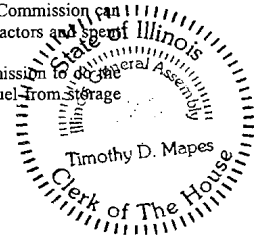
WHEREAS, The residents of Illinois have an inalienable right to have their voices heard regarding possible threats to the health, safety, and general well-being of themselves, their families, their property, and the surrounding environment arising from the State's nuclear power plants; and

WHEREAS, The people of Illinois want a safe and secure energy supply for themselves and future generations; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois General Assembly takes its responsibility to represent its citizens with utmost seriousness; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, which has complete jurisdiction over U.S. nuclear power safety and security matters, must ensure that concrete steps are taken now to address serious shortcomings in nuclear plant safety and security that have been evident for years, however no technology can be made perfectly safe, but the Nuclear Regulatory Commission can and must do more to guard against accidents as well as the threat of terrorist attacks on reactors and spent fuel pools; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois General Assembly urges the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to do the following: (1) require Illinois nuclear power plant owners to transfer radioactive spent fuel from storage

pools to much safer dry casks as soon after 5 years of cooling as possible; (2) ensure that everyone at significant risk from a severe accident, not just people within the arbitrary 10-mile zone currently used for emergency planning, is protected; (3) extend the scope of its regulations to include the prevention and mitigation of severe accidents; and (4) improve protection of the nation's nuclear power plants against terrorist attacks; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we further direct the House clerk, upon passage of this resolution, to send copies to all 5 Commissioners on the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the Governor of Illinois, the Illinois Congressional Delegation, and to the CEO of Exelon, the company that owns all Illinois nuclear power plants, with an accompanying cover letter stating the date this resolution was passed by the General Assembly in the State of Illinois.

## HOUSE RESOLUTION 770

Offered by Representative Flowers:

WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells was a seminal figure in Post-Reconstruction America and one of the great pioneering activists for civil rights for African-Americans long before the Civil Rights Movement, as it has come to be known in history; her achievements have not received the attention they deserve as she was a fierce activist for both African-Americans and women, challenging traditional power structures as well as leadership within activist movements, and as a journalist reporting first-hand and publicizing the widespread atrocity of lynching; and

WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells was born into slavery on July 16, 1862, in Holly Springs, Mississippi, 6 months before President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation; her parents, Jim and Elizabeth, taught her the value of education and of speaking her mind; she was orphaned at 16 and left college to become a teacher to care for her 5 remaining siblings and keep them together; and

WHEREAS, At a time when black teachers made \$30 per month and white teachers made \$80 per month, Ida B. Wells moved to Memphis, Tennessee, embarking on a career as a journalist and civil rights activist; in September 1883, she preceded Rosa Parks' historic bus ride by 72 years, refusing to give up her seat on a train car and being forcibly removed at the age of 21; and

WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells stepped outside the traditional roles of a woman and of an African-American at the turn of the century by speaking out about unsavory topics; she is considered to be the single most powerful leader in the anti-lynching campaign in America; and

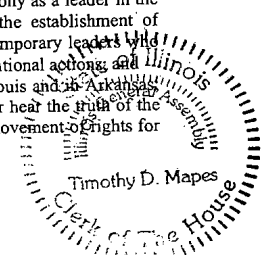
WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells became the editor and owner of her own newspaper, and when her newspaper office was destroyed in an angry response to her outspoken writings, she was exiled from Memphis and stayed away from the South for over 30 years, moving to New York and then Chicago; in 1893 and 1894, she traveled across the United States and throughout the United Kingdom, passionately writing and speaking out against lynching; and

WHEREAS, Between 1880 and 1930, approximately 3,220 black Americans were reported lynched, with many hundreds more unreported African-Americans killed and whites as well; following Wells' campaigns, legislation against lynching was enacted in parts of the South and the numbers of lynchings went down, from a peak of 235 in 1892 to 107 by 1899; and

WHEREAS, In 1895, Ida B. Wells married Ferdinand L. Barnett, an attorney and owner of The Conservator, one of Chicago's black newspapers; he and Ida had 4 children together; and she continued her activism while juggling motherhood and her many civil rights commitments; and

WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells was one of the founders of several organizations, including the NAACP, the Negro Fellowship League to assist black men and boys who were excluded from the YMCA, and the Alpha Suffrage Club, an organization of black women who worked to obtain the right to vote; she assisted the National Association of Colored Women and the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters and served as the secretary of the African-American Press Association; she worked with Susan B. Anthony as a leader in the movement for women's suffrage and with Jane Addams in Chicago to prevent the establishment of segregated public schools; and even within these organizations, she challenged contemporary leaders who advocated for appeasement and accommodation in favor of uncompromising confrontational action; and

WHEREAS, In 1918, Ida B. Wells covered race riots and lynchings in East St. Louis and in Arkansas; in 1928, she began writing her autobiography, fearing future generations would never hear the truth of the injustices that were happening at the time; in 1930, out of frustration with the slow movement of rights for



African-Americans and the stalemate of the 2 parties in government, Ida B. Wells became the first African-American woman to run for the Illinois State Senate; and

WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells passed away after a sudden illness on March 25, 1931 at the age of 68; her husband passed the following year, and they are interred together in Chicago's Oak Woods Cemetery; in 1940, she was honored by having the first public housing development for African-Americans in Chicago, The Ida B. Wells Homes, named after her, which stood for over 60 years; and

WHEREAS, Ida B. Wells' tireless work and great dedication to the civil rights movement is deserving of the greatest honor; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate the date of March 25, 2012 as Ida B. Wells Day in the State of Illinois in honor of Ida B. Wells and her great work with the civil rights movement; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Michelle Duster, great-granddaughter of Ida B. Wells for efforts to protect her legacy.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 774

Offered by Representative Eddy:

WHEREAS, The American Psychological Association has warned against the detrimental effects of violent video games on adolescents; and

WHEREAS, Studies have showed a correlation between violent video games and increased attention deficit problems, violence, and addiction; and

WHEREAS, 72% of American households play computer or video games, as reported by the Entertainment Software Association; and

WHEREAS, 91% of American children aged 2 to 17 play computer or video games, as reported by the NPD Group; and

WHEREAS, Since 2009, there has been a 9% increase of American children aged 2 to 17 that play video games, with an approximate 65 million children currently playing video games, as reported by the NPD Group; and

WHEREAS, The American Psychological Association has reported that, on average, boys spend 13 hours playing video games a week and girls spend 5 hours playing video games a week; and

WHEREAS, The Entertainment Software Ratings Board rates games bases on their age appropriateness; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge parents to carefully monitor their children's use of all media and encourage that they assist in controlling the video games that their children play.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 775

Offered by Representative Bill Mitchell:

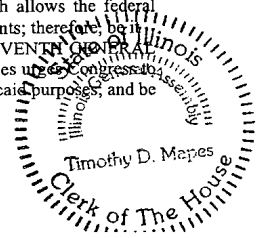
WHEREAS, The growth in State and federal spending for Medicaid and welfare entitlements are significantly increasing budget costs; and

WHEREAS, The growth in Medicaid and welfare entitlement costs will not be controlled until Illinois has the ability to manage the programs to allow the residents of the State to benefit from the programs; and

WHEREAS, Block grants will allow Illinois to design and develop innovative, efficient, and productive Medicaid and welfare programs that will meet the needs of our residents; and

WHEREAS, The United States House of Representatives passed a budget which allows the federal government to give states block grants to pay for Medicaid and other welfare entitlements; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Illinois House of Representatives urge Congress to pass federal funds on to States via block grants to be used for public welfare and Medicaid purposes; and be





it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor and to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 776

Offered by Representative Brauer:

WHEREAS, The Illinois public pension systems are estimated to have an unfunded liability of over \$80 billion, and the State's contribution to those systems is increasing each year; and

WHEREAS, The Pew Center issued a study on state pensions, titled "The Trillion Dollar Gap", which reported that Illinois has the worst-funded pension systems in the nation; and

WHEREAS, The current funding schedule that Illinois uses is not adequate to meet the funding needs of the pension systems; and

WHEREAS, The longer Illinois waits to fix the problem of funding the pension systems, the worse the problem gets; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability study the impact of time and interest on the underfunding of the State Employees' Retirement System of Illinois, the Judges Retirement System of Illinois, the General Assembly Retirement System, the State Universities Retirement System, and the Teachers' Retirement System of the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability release its report, report to the General Assembly and Governor, and publish on its website all findings by April 30, 2012.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 778

Offered by Representative Monique Davis:

WHEREAS, Former Surgeon General C. Everett Koop reported when he appeared before the U.S. Senate's Subcommittee on Nutrition in 1989 that breastfeeding should be actively promoted in all maternal and child health programs; health experts worldwide agree that breastfeeding is the optimal way to nurture infants and should be practiced wherever possible; and

WHEREAS, Human milk is a unique species-specific source of infant nutrition and not only allows birth to occur at an early stage of development, but also allows a time of intense maternal-infant interaction to facilitate early behavioral development; and

WHEREAS, Breastfeeding offers many important benefits for mothers and babies and also for society; there is abundant evidence that human milk is designed to enhance optimally the growth, development, and well-being of an infant; a mother's milk provides the best protection for her infant against specific infections; this cannot be duplicated in infant formula; therefore, be it

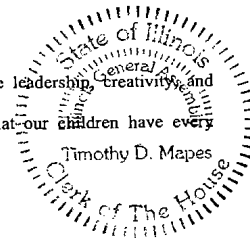
RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge every department that assists families and children to offer and strongly promote educational material on the importance of breastfeeding.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 781

Offered by Representative Brady:

WHEREAS, The children of Illinois are our future and will provide the leadership, creativity, and productivity to strengthen and sustain the quality of life in our State; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has the responsibility for ensuring that our children have every



possible opportunity for school and future success; and

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to be challenged academically and prepared for college, meaningful employment in our global economy, and lifelong success; and

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to be supported by qualified, caring adults and receive access to personalized learning; and

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to learn about and practice a healthy lifestyle; and

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to learn in an environment that is physically and emotionally safe; and

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to be actively engaged in learning and connected to the school and broader community; and

WHEREAS, The consequences of not ensuring our young people are challenged, supported, healthy, safe, and engaged are clear; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has the highest dropout rate of any state in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, The cost to the State in lost wages, taxes, and productivity over the lifetime of these students is more than \$10.1 billion; and

WHEREAS, 19% of Illinois children were in poverty in 2010; and

WHEREAS, 35% of children ages 3-5 were not enrolled in nursery school, preschool, or kindergarten in 2010; and

WHEREAS, 35% of Illinois children and teens ages 10-17 are overweight or obese; and

WHEREAS, Research indicates that more than 20% of students report there is no adult at their school who cares about them or knows them well; and

WHEREAS, According to the Indicators of School Crime and Safety report of 2010, 32% of middle and high school students reported being bullied during the 2007 school year; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize March as "Illinois Whole Child Month"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recognize the value of assuring that each student is challenged, supported, healthy, safe, and engaged; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage parents, educators, and community members to support a whole child approach to education for each student; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage every Illinois school to celebrate Whole Child Month by adopting at least one of the whole child tenets to promote and encourage throughout the month.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 783

Offered by Representative Nekritz:

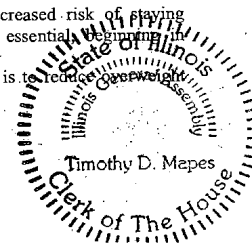
WHEREAS, Obesity, physical inactivity, and poor nutrition are major risk factors for cancer, second only to tobacco use; approximately one third of U.S. (186,000) and Illinois (22,223) cancer deaths this year can be attributed to poor diet, physical inactivity, and overweight and obesity; and

WHEREAS, Overweight and obesity are associated with increased risk for several common cancers, including colorectal, esophageal, kidney, endometrial, pancreatic, and postmenopausal breast cancers; research also suggests that overweight and obesity may also be associated with increased risk of liver, cervical, ovarian, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, multiple myeloma, and aggressive prostate cancers; the biological link between overweight and obesity and cancer is believed to be related to multiple effects on fat and sugar metabolism, immune function, hormone levels and proteins that affect hormone levels, and other factors related to cell proliferation and growth; and

WHEREAS, National and Illinois adult overweight and obesity percentages are similar in that 2 out of 3 adults are overweight or obese; nationally, 31.6% of children ages 10 to 17 are considered to be overweight or obese; in Illinois, 34.9% of children ages 10 to 17 are overweight or obese; and

WHEREAS, Overweight and obese children and adolescents are at an increased risk of staying overweight or obese as they grow older; therefore, prevention of obesity is essential beginning in childhood; and

WHEREAS, An American Cancer Society, Illinois Division mission priority is to reduce overweight and obesity rates in Illinois' youth by 25% by 2015; and

WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society recommends consuming a healthy diet, with an emphasis on plant foods, in order to reduce cancer risks; recommendations include choosing foods and beverages in amounts that achieve and maintain a healthy weight, limiting consumption of processed and red meats, and consuming fruits and vegetables and whole grains instead of refined grain products; and

WHEREAS, Regular and intentional physical activity helps maintain a healthy body weight; independent of body weight, physical activity may also reduce the risk of breast, colon, endometrium, and advanced prostate cancer, and possibly pancreatic cancer; and

WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society recommends that adults engage in at least 150 minutes of moderate intensity or 75 minutes of vigorous intensity activity each week and that children and adolescents engage in at least one hour of moderate or vigorous intensity activity each day; and

WHEREAS, Despite the evidence linking overweight and obesity, poor nutrition, and physical inactivity to increased cancer risk, the majority of Illinoisans are not meeting nutrition and physical activity recommendations; social, economic, environmental, and cultural factors strongly influence individual choices about diet and physical activity; and

WHEREAS, Reversing obesity trends and reducing the associated cancer risk will require a broad range of strategies that include policy and environmental changes that make it easier for individuals to regularly make healthy diet and physical activity choices; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage that the following be supported:

- (1) policies aimed at increasing access to affordable healthy foods in communities, worksites, and schools, and decreasing access to and marketing of foods and beverages of low nutritional value, particularly to youth;
- (2) changing school environments to promote health through a coordinated strategy addressing key components such as physical education, health education, nutrition services, staff wellness, and family and community involvement;
- (3) daily, quality physical education for early childhood education programs and all students in grades K-12; physical education can be supplemented with additional school-based physical activity opportunities, such as recess, physical activity in the classroom, classroom breaks, intramural sports, and walk-to-school programs; and
- (4) ensuring all users-pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, and transit riders of all ages and abilities have safe access to a community's streets.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 788

Offered by Representative Costello:

WHEREAS, The purpose of the State's space utilization program is to effect maximum efficient utilization of State-owned and controlled space; and

WHEREAS, One mechanism for facilitating efficient utilization of State-owned and controlled space is the submission of Annual Real Property Utilization Reports by State agencies to the Department of Central Management Services; and

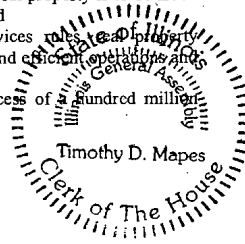
WHEREAS, State agencies are required to identify excess and surplus real property under their control in such reports; and

WHEREAS, The Annual Real Property Utilization Reports are to be screened by the Department of Central Management Services to identify real property that might be used by other State agencies and agency space requests are to be concurrent with excess real property reports; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Department of Central Management Services rules, if one agency's excess real property can reasonably fulfill another agency's space request, then that excess real property is to be made available to the agency needing space in preference to obtaining leased space; and

WHEREAS, Also pursuant to Department of Central Management Services rules, real property inventories are to be maintained at the minimum necessary to ensure economic and efficient operations and property that is not needed for future agency purposes is to be declared surplus; and

WHEREAS, According to Comptroller records, the State has spent in excess of one hundred million dollars for real property rental to date; therefore, be it



RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Auditor General is directed to conduct a management audit of the Department of Central Management Services' administration of the State's space utilization program; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the audit include, but not be limited to, the following determinations:  
Whether procedures are in place to adequately identify excess and surplus real property;  
Whether such procedures ensure that excess and surplus real property is reasonably considered in fulfilling State agencies' property needs; and  
Whether the process of disposing of surplus real property is adequate and timely; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Central Management Services and any other entity that may have relevant information pertaining to this audit cooperate fully and promptly with the Auditor General's Office in the conduct of this audit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Auditor General commence this audit as soon as possible and report his findings and recommendations upon completion in accordance with the provisions of Section 3-14 of the Illinois State Auditing Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Central Management Services shall sell or lease the parcels of land listed in the report or identified by the audit that are not currently being utilized; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Central Management Services shall provide the House of Representatives an up-to-date master record of State occupied property.

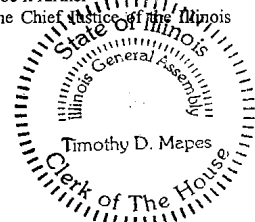

RESOLVED, That the Teachers' Retirement System, the State Universities Retirement System, the State Employees' Retirement System, the Judges Retirement System, the General Assembly Retirement System, and any other entity having information relevant to this audit cooperate fully and promptly with the Auditor General's Office in the conduct of this audit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Auditor General commence this audit as soon as possible and report his findings and recommendations upon completion in accordance with the provisions of Section 3-14 of the Illinois State Auditing Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Auditor General and the boards of the Teachers' Retirement System, the State Universities Retirement System, the State Employees' Retirement System, the Judges Retirement System, and the General Assembly Retirement System.

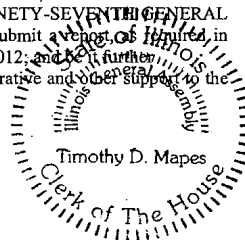

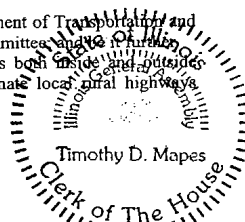

RESOLVED, That the Committee shall be staffed by the staff of the Department of Transportation and shall receive no pay except to reimburse the expenses of the members of the Committee, and the members

RESOLVED, That the Committee shall investigate the trend in rural areas both inside and outside Illinois for local governments, including counties and townships, to re-designate local rural highways



including but not limited to highways commonly designated as "farm-to-market roads", from paved-highway to unpaved status; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Committee shall meet at the call of the chair and prepare a report containing:

- (a) information on how much money per mile, in annual upkeep costs, is saved by taxpayers through transitioning a two-lane highway from pavement to gravel;
- (b) the disadvantages to local Illinois citizens of transitioning a road from pavement to gravel;
- (c) information on the most recent annual totals representing motor fuel taxes and State sales taxes on motor fuel paid for by Illinois purchasers at points of sale located outside the Chicago-Naperville-Joliet Metropolitan Statistical Area; and
- (d) a recommendation on what changes, if any, to the Motor Fuel Tax Fund allocation formula would suffice to prevent rural roads from being re-designated from pavement to gravel in future years; and be it further

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 809**

Offered by Representative William Davis:

WHEREAS, The Paul Simon Public Policy Institute is honoring Alexander Lane, the first African-American male student at Southern Illinois University-Carbondale, who enrolled in 1876; and

WHEREAS, Historian Pamela Smoot's research on Lane's life began at SIU-Carbondale's Morris Library and included trips to Chicago, Springfield, and Mississippi; the research shows that Lane was born into slavery in pre-Civil War Mississippi and later migrated to Illinois as a young boy, where he was taken in by a southern Illinois farming family who helped assure he had the opportunity to gain an education at what was then Southern Illinois Normal University; and

WHEREAS, Alexander Lane served as the first principal of Carbondale's East Side School for Negroes, which later became Attucks School; and

WHEREAS, Alexander Lane married the former Isabelle Holland, who also attended SIU-Carbondale, and together they had one son before moving to Chicago in the early 1890s in order to attend Rush Medical College, from which he graduated in 1895; and

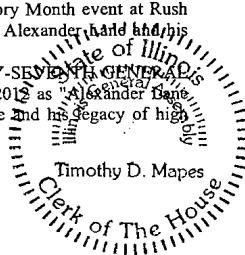
WHEREAS, Alexander Lane was appointed assistant physician of Cook County and had a private practice at 1937 S. Archer Avenue in Chicago; he entered politics in 1906 by running for and winning a seat in the Illinois House of Representatives as a Republican, where he became the ninth African-American elected to the Illinois General Assembly; he was reelected in 1908 and served until his death in November 1911; and

WHEREAS, To honor his legacy, the Paul Simon Public Policy Institute has established the Alexander Lane Internship Program to foster civic engagement opportunities for students at Southern Illinois University to work with members of the Illinois General Assembly and the Legislative Black Caucus; and

WHEREAS, Alexander Lane was a trailblazer for first generation college students, the disadvantaged, African-Americans in education, medicine, public health, public service, and elected politics, and African-American State legislators; and

WHEREAS, The Paul Simon Public Policy Institute is hosting a Black History Month event at Rush University Medical Center in Chicago on Monday, February 27, 2012 to honor Alexander Lane and his many accomplishments; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate February 27, 2012 as "Alexander Lane Day" in the State of Illinois in honor of the Honorable Dr. Alexander M. Lane and his legacy of high achievement against significant challenges; and be it further



RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the family of Alexander Lane as a symbol of our esteem and respect of their revered ancestor and to the Paul Simon Public Policy Institute at Southern Illinois University Carbondale in tribute to its dedication to the telling of the Alexander Lane story.

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall conduct in-depth research to identify the railroad tracks and bridges that are in need of repair so that the necessary infrastructure repairs can be done; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Secretary of Transportation shall serve as the chair of the Task Force; the Task Force shall meet at the call of the chair; the members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation shall provide staffing support to the Task Force and shall administer and prepare all reports deemed necessary in conjunction with the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall issue a report with its recommendations to the members of the Illinois House of Representatives on or before December 31, 2013.

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the entire north-south stretch of the thoroughfare, including the aforementioned sections of Crawford Avenue, shall be designated as Pulaski Road; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State regulations, plaques or signs giving notice of the name of Pulaski Road; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation, the Village of Lincolnwood, the Village of Skokie, the City of Evanston, the Village of Wilmette, and the City of Chicago.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 833

Offered by Representative Cross:

WHEREAS, It is essential that the State of Illinois resumes the task of creating new jobs and attracting new capital investment; Illinois was the highest-unemployment state in the Midwest with a seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 9.8% at the end of 2011; and

WHEREAS, Former State and federal policies, such as the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981, created accelerated depreciation schedules and tax credits for the purchase of capital machinery and infrastructure, including heavy trucks; many of these benefits, although created by federal law, also affected Illinois tax law through the interconnection of federal and state definitions of taxable income; and

WHEREAS, Because some of these laws have expired, and the State of Illinois has "decoupled" itself from others, many of these depreciation schedules and tax credits are no longer available to Illinois taxpayers; and

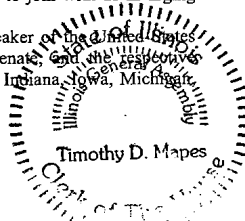
WHEREAS, Investment in heavy trucks and other transportation equipment creates many jobs, not only by stimulating employment in the manufacture of trucks and truck components themselves, but also by enhancing the just-in-time delivery capabilities of a wide variety of Illinois manufacturers and service providers, and in creating jobs for those who drive the trucks themselves; and

WHEREAS, Key existing federal and state capital-goods tax incentives, such as the so-called "bonus depreciation" law, are scheduled to expire and sunset at the end of 2012, and are not currently scheduled to be an incentive for decisions involving American investment in 2013 and following years; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress to enact a comprehensive new program to amend federal tax laws to enact incentives to encourage the purchase and lease, in 2013 and following years, of heavy trucks, machinery, capital goods, and other essential elements of the private-sector infrastructure of the United States; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge our fellow legislatures of the Great Lakes states of the United States, including Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio, and Wisconsin, to join with us in urging Congress to prioritize this policy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President pro tempore of the United States Senate, and the respective Speakers and presiding officers of the House of Representatives and Senate of Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio, and Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, The Joint Manufacturing and Technology Center at the arsenal is one of the world's largest weapons manufacturing facilities; the arsenal and its employees have repeatedly proven that, for small-quantity orders and specialty jobs, it has the expertise, equipment, and dedication to the defense of the United States that cannot be equaled in private industry; and

WHEREAS, A reduction at the Rock Island Arsenal would not only threaten the local economy, but would also jeopardize the readiness of United States forces to quickly respond in the war on terror or in any future conflict; therefore, be it

WHEREAS, Equal pay is a priority for all women and for our society at large; therefore, be it

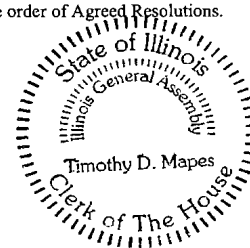

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 40

WHEREAS, Interstate 64 is a major thoroughfare in the United States interstate system of roads which, in part, connects rural Southern Illinois with St. Louis, Missouri; and

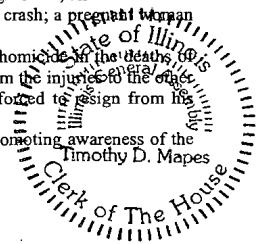
WHEREAS, On November 23, 2007, the day after Thanksgiving, Jessica and Kelli Uhl were traveling home from visiting with their father and stepmother; while traveling on Interstate 64 in heavy traffic, the girls were struck by an oncoming Illinois State Police vehicle that was traveling at an estimated speed of 126 miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, The trooper operating the vehicle at this high rate of speed was reportedly using his onboard computer and cellular phone when he crossed the median and struck the girls' car; and

WHEREAS, Both 18 year old Jessica and 13 year old Kelli were killed in the crash; a pregnant woman and her husband in another vehicle were also struck and sustained injuries; and

WHEREAS, The State trooper was convicted of 2 felony counts of reckless homicide in the deaths of Jessica and Kelli, and 2 felony counts of aggravated reckless driving resulting from the injuries to the other couple involved in the accident; as a result of the felony convictions he was forced to resign from his position as a State trooper and had his driver's license revoked for 24 months; and

WHEREAS, The girls' mother, Kim Schlau, has left her career to focus on promoting awareness of the



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dangers of distracted driving and now works with recruit classes and police organizations around the country; her goal is to offer a personal account of the repercussions and dangers of negligent pursuit driving in an effort to educate officers and first responders, and prevent these tragedies from happening to other families; and

WHEREAS, Since the accident, the Illinois State Police have limited the use of personal cellular telephones by on-duty troopers and have implemented a four-tier system specifying how fast troopers may travel while responding to emergency calls; and

WHEREAS, A memorial has been placed on Highway 158 in honor of Jessica and Kelli under the fatal accident memorial marker program; the memorial contains Jessica and Kelli's names and admonishes drivers that "Reckless Driving Costs Lives"; however, the sign is not visible from Interstate 64 and will be removed in 2 years unless legislation is passed to make the memorials permanent; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that this body join in honoring the memory of Jessica and Kelli Uhl and in promoting awareness of the dangers of reckless driving; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that the section of Interstate 64 between Exit 19A at Illinois Route 158 and Exit 23 at Illinois Route 4 be renamed the Jessica and Kelli Uhl Memorial Highway; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name of the Jessica and Kelli Uhl Memorial Highway; and be it further

WHEREAS, HCV is 4 times more prevalent than HIV/AIDS and led to more than 15,000 deaths in the United States in 2007; 350,000 people die each year due to hepatitis C-related liver disease worldwide; and

WHEREAS, Two of every 3 people with chronic hepatitis C in this country are baby boomers born between 1945 and 1965 who were infected decades ago; and

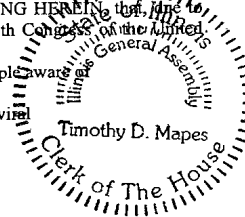
WHEREAS, HCV disproportionately affects minorities; African Americans, who make up 14% of the population, account for 22% of HCV cases in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, The Hispanic community also bears a heavier burden; chronic HCV is more aggressive and carries a higher risk of cirrhosis for Hispanics than for any other ethnic group; and

WHEREAS, The costs for HCV patients are projected to more than double over the next 20 years, from \$30,000,000,000 to \$85,000,000,000 per year; therefore, be it

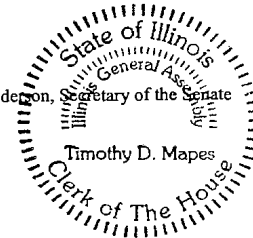

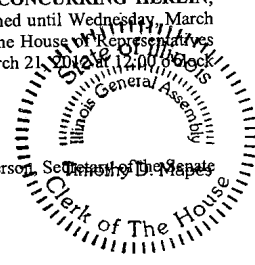

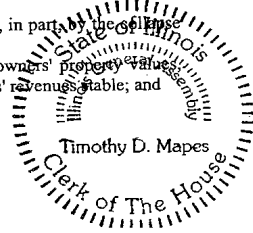
**HOUSE RESOLUTION 847**

Offered by Representative Mussman:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives recognize the hardships Illinois property owners face in the economic climate of today; and

WHEREAS, The National and State economies are in a recession which began, in part, by the collapse of the housing market; and

WHEREAS, This collapse has resulted in the fall of many Illinois property owners' property values, which has triggered property tax rates to increase to keep Illinois local governments' revenues stable; and





WHEREAS, Illinois local governments rely heavily on property taxes as revenue; in 2007, property taxes accounted for 68% of local governments' general own-source revenue; and

WHEREAS, The condition of property values decreasing and property taxes increasing is causing financial problems for many Illinois property owners, and is resulting in many homeowners losing or being at risk of losing their homes; and

WHEREAS, The 96th General Assembly passed and Governor signed into law Public Act 96-1418 in response to the concerns of Illinois property owners; and

WHEREAS, The goals of Public Act 96-1418 included expanding the Returning Veterans Homestead Exemption to reduce the property tax liability of a returning veteran in the year after the veteran has returned home; lowering the service-connected disability requirement for the Disabled Veterans Standard Homestead Exemption to 70% from 75% to increase the number of veterans who are eligible for the exemption; and extending the Alternative General Homestead Exemption for 3 more years; and

WHEREAS, In addition, Public Act 96-1418 requires: (i) county boards of review to make their rules and procedures available to the public; (ii) county assessors to make a plain-English explanation of equalization factors available to the public; and (iii) county assessors to make an additional set of disclosures with a change in assessment notice; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 96-1418 also created 7 Taxpayer Action Boards; and

WHEREAS, Taxpayer Action Boards have the following goals: (i) to oversee the implementation of P.A. 96-122 with an emphasis on the transparency and disclosure provisions of that Public Act; (ii) to make recommendations about other useful disclosures in addition to those required by P.A. 96-122; and (iii) to make recommendations concerning the implementation of the transparency reform provisions of P.A. 96-122 in their respective counties; and

WHEREAS, Each Taxpayer Action Board is required to conduct a study that critically evaluates the manner in which its county assesses residential property and examines the accuracy of computer-assisted mass appraisal; as part of its study, each Board shall conduct at least 2 public hearings; and

WHEREAS, Each Taxpayer Action Board must report to the Governor and the General Assembly summarizing its findings, must maintain and administer a website cataloguing taxpayer assistance information linked to the Department of Revenue's website, must propose to its county government changes to property tax policies and procedures, if appropriate, and must propose to the Department of Revenue changes to property tax policies and procedures, if appropriate; and

WHEREAS, A Taxpayer Action Board was to be established in each of the following counties: Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, McHenry, and Will; each Board was to be composed of 7 members; and

WHEREAS, The 7 members of each board are to be named by the Governor and serve 2-years terms; and

WHEREAS, As of February 14, 2012 there have been no appointments made by Governor Quinn to any of the 7 boards; and

WHEREAS, No studies, reports, or findings have been published; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we call on Governor Quinn to immediately appoint members to the Taxpayer Action Boards to research the property tax system in each of their respective counties to help identify ways to make the systems more transparent; and be it further

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 858**

Offered by Representative Greg Harris:

WHEREAS, No resident of Illinois should have to be food-insecure; and  
 WHEREAS, 1,873,010, or 1 in 7 residents of the State of Illinois are experiencing food insecurity, meaning they lack access to adequate nutritious food for a healthy lifestyle; and  
 WHEREAS, 745,310, or just under 1 in 4 children in the State of Illinois are experiencing food insecurity; and  
 WHEREAS, Food insecurity is experienced in every county in the State of Illinois; and  
 WHEREAS, Feeding Illinois food banks have seen a 73% increase in requests for emergency food assistance over the past 3 years; and  
 WHEREAS, Hunger increases health care costs, lowers workers' productivity, harms children's development, and diminishes children's educational performance; and  
 WHEREAS, Fighting hunger is a public-private partnership; in Illinois, a strong private network exists that has provided 1.4 million people in Illinois with more than 127 million pounds of food in 2010; however, private charity cannot do it alone and a strong federal hunger relief safety net is required; and  
 WHEREAS, The Illinois General Assembly established the Commission to End Hunger in 2010 in recognition of the need to end food insecurity in the State of Illinois; and  
 WHEREAS, The Commission to End Hunger acknowledges in its recommendations the critical importance of federal programs that address food and nutrition; and  
 WHEREAS, The federal Farm Bill establishes the funding and policy for vital food and nutrition programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP), and the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP); SNAP is the cornerstone of the nutrition safety net, with 1.9 million, or 1 in 6, Illinois residents enrolled in the program; just under half of those utilizing the program are children; and  
 WHEREAS, Any reduction in funding of the SNAP Program will increase the number of food-insecure people in Illinois; and  
 WHEREAS, Maintaining the current model of 100% federal funding of SNAP assistance is essential to retaining the program's effectiveness in fighting hunger; and  
 WHEREAS, TEFAP is a means-tested federal program that provides food commodities at no cost to Illinoisans in need of short-term hunger relief through organizations like food banks, pantries, soup kitchens, and emergency shelters; and  
 WHEREAS, CSFP leverages government buying power to provide nutritious food packages to 17,473 vulnerable individuals in Illinois in Fiscal Year 2011, nearly 97% of which are seniors; and  
 WHEREAS, The decisions made in developing the next Farm Bill will impact the ability of food-insecure Illinoisans to access the food and nutrition safety they need; and  
 WHEREAS, The City of Chicago, in partnership with the Greater Chicago Food Depository and other anti-hunger advocates, wants to fully support addressing food insecurity in the City of Chicago; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETEEN SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress to develop the 2012 Farm Bill with a strong Title IV that protects and strengthens federal food and nutrition programs; and be it further,



RESOLVED, That we state our belief that the 2012 Farm Bill must oppose proposals to cap or reduce funding for SNAP; oppose proposals to restrict eligibility or reduce benefits; support proposals to increase benefit adequacy to ensure that households have the resources to purchase a nutritionally adequate diet; support proposals that would make mandatory funding for TEFAP food more responsive to changes in need; enhance the United States Secretary of Agriculture's authority to purchase bonus commodities in times of high need for emergency food relief in addition to times of low commodity prices; reauthorize funding for TEFAP Storage and Distribution and TEFAP Infrastructure grants; and protect funding for CSFP while transitioning the program to a senior-only program and grandfathering in current participants; and be it further
