Perfunctory Session

TUESDAY, MARCH 14, 2017

At the hour of 2:38 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced, read by title a first time, ordered reproduced and placed in the Committee on Rules:

HOUSE BILL 4011. Introduced by Representative Lang, AN ACT concerning government.

HOUSE BILL 4012. Introduced by Representatives Lang - McSweeney - Feigenholtz - Harris, Greg - McDermed, Cassidy, Gabel, Chapa LaVia, Currie, Willis, Harper, Flowers, Mah, Welch, Fine, McAsey and Moeller, AN ACT concerning appropriations.

HOUSE BILL 4013. Introduced by Representative Crespo, AN ACT making appropriations.

HOUSE BILL 4014. Introduced by Representative Bryant, AN ACT concerning appropriations.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 204

Offered by Representative Butler:

WHEREAS, Clara Barton and a circle of her acquaintances founded the American Red Cross in Washington, D.C. on May 21, 1881 after hearing of the Swiss-inspired global Red Cross network while visiting Europe following the American Civil War; and

WHEREAS, The American Red Cross is one of the largest humanitarian social service organizations in the country; it was first chartered by the United States Congress in 1900; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Williams T. Lewis and a group of local friends and colleagues held the first meeting of the Red Cross in Springfield at 503 South 7th street during the fall of 1916; and

WHEREAS, The group had 1,300 enrollments and was recognized as an official chapter on March 30, 1917; and

WHEREAS, The Sangamon Valley Chapter of the American Red Cross increased area membership to 12,980 volunteers that same year; volunteers of this group provided support and assistance to the Mattoon/Charleston area in the aftermath of a May 1917 tornado, its first disaster response; and

WHEREAS, Area Red Cross members provided care for more than 300 patients during the 1918 influenza epidemic and successfully started two war funds that raised \$90,971.71 and \$132,962.37 respectfully in 1918; and

WHEREAS, The tireless efforts of Red Cross volunteers continue in our community, our State, and in our Nation during disasters, when someone needs lifesaving blood, or around-the-clock support to members of the military and their families; and

WHEREAS, Volunteer assistance and financial contributions are needed now more than ever before to respond to the nearly 64,000 disasters that occur across our nation annually; and

WHEREAS, For these past 100 years, the American Red Cross has had a long history of helping neighbors in need and it continues to be part of the greater Springfield community, helping citizens to learn, to help, and to care; and

WHEREAS, The American Red Cross is a full partner with the State of Illinois; during times of disaster it is the lead agency providing care to our citizens; it supports our Illinois military personnel by providing biomedical supplies on a 24 hour non-stop basis, and is a charter member of the Illinois Terrorism Task Force, IN which they continue to participate to ensure the security of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, More than 90% of the Red Cross mission is delivered through the work and support of volunteers; the Red Cross depends on local heroes to deliver help during disasters both near and far; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare March 30, 2017 as Red Cross Centennial Day in the State of Illinois, and we urge all residents to donate their time and their resources in support of the American Red Cross; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a community celebration will be held at 503 South 7th Street, where the Springfield Red Cross will show appreciation for 100 years of service to the community and further dedicate themselves to ensure that its mission remains strong and vital for the next 100 years in Springfield and in the United States; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Springfield chapter of the Red Cross.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 205

Offered by Representative Jimenez:

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders can affect all individuals regardless of racial, ethnic, economic, or social group; and

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders are more common than pediatric cancer, diabetes, and AIDS combined; and

WHEREAS, The cause of autism spectrum disorders is still unknown, but research strongly suggests that it is caused by certain factors that affect brain development; and

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders have increased tenfold in the last decade and now occur in some form in one in 42 boys in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Autism, which is five times more common among boys than girls, usually appears during the first three years of life; and

WHEREAS, Early diagnosis, research, training, education, and therapies are vital to reducing the effects of autism; and

WHEREAS, Current research suspects that there is not a single cause that will ultimately be discovered, but rather a cluster of factors which include genetics, pregnancy/birth complications, viral infections, metabolic disorders, congenital anomaly syndrome (birth defects), and environmental toxins; and

WHEREAS, In 2003, The Hope Institute for Children and Families worked with the General Assembly to create The Autism Program of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The Autism Program of Illinois has grown to become the nation's largest statewide network that not only helps families affected by autism, but also trains educators, and links healthcare providers and others to understand, communicate with and support children diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare April of 2017 as Autism Awareness Month in the State of Illinois for the purpose of urging both government entities and the citizenry to become aware and educated on the subject of autism spectrum disorders; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Autism Program of Illinois.
