**HOUSE RESOLUTION**

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 353**

Offered by Representative Madigan:

WHEREAS, Section 11 of Article V of the Illinois Constitution authorizes the Governor, by Executive Order, to reassign functions among or reorganize executive agencies that are directly responsible to the Governor; and

WHEREAS, The Governor has issued Executive Order 2017-01, which in part proposes to reorganize the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum as an independent State agency, separate and apart from the Historic Preservation Agency; and

WHEREAS, The Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, a world-class institution that immerses visitors into the life and history of Abraham Lincoln, recognizes the importance of the legacy of Abraham Lincoln to the State and the nation's historical and cultural heritage; and

WHEREAS, The Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum serves as the leading repository of academic works pertaining to Abraham Lincoln, and is the premier destination for historians who want to conduct research on President Lincoln; and

WHEREAS, Operating the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum as a subordinate component of the Historical Preservation Agency has stifled the full potential of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum; and

WHEREAS, Establishing the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum as an independent State agency recognizes the institution's unique importance to our State and our nation and will enable it to create more effective long-term plans, craft stronger partnerships with State and non-State organizations, accomplish internal efficiencies, and identify independent sources of support; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we hereby approve the action taken by the Governor through Executive Order 2017-01; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor and the President of the Senate.

WHEREAS, The Department of Homeland Security considers the following sectors to be critical infrastructure: (1) Chemical; (2) Commercial Facilities; (3) Communications; (4) Critical Manufacturing; (5) Dams; (6) Defense Industrial Base; (7) Emergency Services; (8) Energy; (9) Financial Services; (10) Food and Agriculture; (11) Government Facilities; (12) Healthcare and Public Health; (13) Information Technology; (14) Nuclear Reactors, Materials, and Waste; (15) Sector-Specific Agencies; (16) Transportation Systems; and (17) Water and Wastewater Systems; and

WHEREAS, The Presidential Policy Directive-21 (PPD-21), "Critical Infrastructure Security and Resilience" provides the policy for how the federal government builds trusted partnerships and "advances a national unity of effort to strengthen and maintain secure, functioning, and resilient critical infrastructure"; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has a strategic and vital role in every one of the above listed critical infrastructure sectors, along with being the fifth largest state per population and home to the third largest city in the country; Illinois has a global impact and is one of the economic engines of the Midwest; and

WHEREAS, The Government Facilities Sector includes a wide variety of buildings, located in the United States and overseas, that are owned or leased by federal, State, local, and tribal governments; many government facilities are open to the public for business activities, commercial transactions, and recreational activities while others that are not open to the public contain highly sensitive information, materials, processes, and equipment; these facilities include general-use office buildings and special-use military installations, embassies, courthouses, national laboratories, and structures that may house critical equipment, systems, networks, and functions; in addition to physical structures, the sector includes cyber elements that contribute to the protection of sector assets as well as individuals who perform essential functions or possess tactical, operational, or strategic knowledge; and

WHEREAS, The Old State Capitol located in downtown Springfield is considered to be critical infrastructure; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States government, specifically the Department of Homeland Security, to consider the Capitol Complex and its crown jewel, the State Capitol Building, as critical infrastructure based upon the guidelines of the Government Facilities Sector; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to United States Senators Richard Durbin and Tammy Duckworth, and the entire Illinois Congressional Delegation.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 350

Offered by Representative Mussman:

WHEREAS, Lyme disease is a bacterial disease transmitted by infected ticks; and

WHEREAS, Lyme disease was first recognized in the United States in 1975 after a mysterious outbreak of arthritis near Old Lyme, Connecticut; since then, reports of Lyme disease have increased dramatically, and the disease has become an important public health concern; and

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention states that the reported Lyme disease cases are numbered at 30,000 a year in the United States, but the actual burden of Lyme disease may actually be as high as 300,000 cases a year throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, The signs and symptoms of Lyme disease can vary greatly from one person to another; symptoms can also vary with the length of time a person has been infected; the initial symptoms of Lyme disease are similar to those of more common diseases, such as a flu-like illness without a cough or mononucleosis, and many infected persons do not recall a tick bite; further symptoms can develop over time, including fever, severe headache and stiff neck, certain heart irregularities, temporary paralysis of facial muscles, pain with numbness or weakness in the arms or legs, loss of concentration or memory problems, and, most commonly, Lyme arthritis; and

WHEREAS, Not all ticks carry the bacterium of Lyme disease, and a bite does not always result in the development of Lyme disease, however, since it is impossible to tell by sight which ticks are infected, it is important to avoid tick bites whenever possible and to perform regular tick checks when traversing in tick-infested areas of the United States, any wooded areas, or any areas with tall grass and weeds; and

WHEREAS, While Lyme disease has been associated with outdoor activities that involve being in the woods or in areas with tall grass and weeds, recent reports have connected Lyme disease transmission with the growing incidence of infestations of mice in homes, as mice carry ticks that carry Lyme disease bacterium; a single mouse may have 60 to 100 ticks covering its ears and face; and

WHEREAS, As Lyme disease is a complex illness with both acute and chronic manifestation, there continues to be a need to increase funding for Lyme disease treatment and prevention; in 2015, the first major research program devoted to the causes and cures of Lyme disease was established at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine as the Lyme Disease Clinical Research Center; and

WHEREAS, Initial funding from federal grants has been able to start research known as the Study of Lyme Disease Immunology and Clinical Events (SLICE); the federal 21st Century Cures Act created a working group within the United States Department of Health and Human Services to improve outcomes of Lyme disease and to develop a plan for improving diagnosis, treatment, and prevention; however, there is still a need for more research on Lyme disease and efforts to promote awareness of its signs and symptoms; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage increased awareness of Lyme disease in Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the Director of the Department of Public Health, all constitutional officers, and all members of the General Assembly in order to raise awareness of Lyme disease.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 351

Offered by Representative Flowers:

WHEREAS, May 17, 2017 will be the 63rd anniversary of the 1954 landmark United States Supreme Court decision in *Brown v. Board of Education*, which found that "separate educational facilities are inherently unequal" and banned separate public schools for black and white students; and

WHEREAS, Despite this landmark ruling, many schools and districts throughout the United States have been alleged to still be "separate" due, in part, to racially and economically isolated housing patterns in many areas; and

WHEREAS, According to a 2013 Economic Policy Institute report entitled "For Public Schools, Segregation Then, Segregation Since", "[t]oday, African American students are more isolated than they were 40 years ago, while most education policymakers and reformers have abandoned integration as a cause"; and

WHEREAS, A considerable body of research indicates that racial and economic diversity in schools is one of the few education reforms that is proven to improve the educational achievement and life opportunities of minority and low-income children systemically; and

WHEREAS, The best way to ensure that public educational resources are equitably distributed among all children is to allow all children access to the same resources in the same schools; and

WHEREAS, Diverse schools promote better educational outcomes and provide benefits for all students; research has confirmed that African-American and Hispanic students perform better on tests in schools that are diverse, while school diversity has no negative impact on the test scores of white students; in addition, studies have found that prolonged contact with racially diverse students may have significant effects on students' complex thinking, and a more diverse classroom environment encourages critical thinking in all students, as well as improves high school graduation and college matriculation rates for minority students at those schools; and

WHEREAS, Beyond educational benefits, diverse schools provide other societal advantages, including improving cross-racial understanding and reducing racial prejudice; diverse schools also improve the potential for reducing residential lack of diversity; and

WHEREAS, For FY 2018, the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability estimates that Illinois will generate \$33.991 billion, including federal and State Sources; with regard to the Subtotal of General Funds generated for FY 2018, the Commission estimates that the State will have \$31.147 billion in total general revenues once allocations are made to the Refund Fund, Fund for Advancement of Education, and the Commitment to Human Services Fund; and

WHEREAS, The Governor's Office of Management and Budget reports in their revenue estimate that for FY 2018: Illinois will generate a total of \$34.401 billion when including total federal and State sources; with regard to the Subtotal of General Funds generated for FY 2018, the Office estimates that the State will have \$31.476 billion in total general revenues once allocations are made to the Refund Fund, Fund for Advancement of Education, and the Commitment to Human Services Fund; the Office has included two key assumptions in the budget book, including \$300 Million to be received from the sale of the Thompson Center and \$942 in Fund for Advancement of Education and Commitment to Human Services Fund re-classification under general funds definitions; and

WHEREAS, The legislature has a proper basis from which to adopt a revenue estimate for FY 2018, with the figures provided by the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability and the Governor's Office of Management and Budget; and

WHEREAS, The legislature needs to adopt a revenue estimate that combines that the figures provided by the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability and the Governor's Office of Management and Budget; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that General Assembly will adopt an FY 2018 revenue estimate that is inclusive of the figures provided by the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability and the Governor's Office of Management and Budget and outlines the funds that will be available during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, for the purposes of meeting the constitutional obligation set forth in subsection (b) of Section 2 of Article VIII of the Illinois Constitution; and be it further
