### 41ST LEGISLATIVE DAY

### **Perfunctory Session**

### **FRIDAY, APRIL 28, 2017**

At the hour of 2:54 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 357**

Offered by Representative Mah:

WHEREAS, It is appropriate and right to celebrate a diversity of cultures and heritages; this celebration serves as a reminder that despite our differing backgrounds, everyone in Illinois is bound by a common hope for a better and more inclusive future for our children; and

WHEREAS, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are among the fastest growing ethnic groups in Illinois; Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders make up over 5% of the population of Illinois; the community grew by over 40% between 2000 and 2010; and

WHEREAS, The Asian American and Pacific Islander community has a long and integral history in the United States; in recognition and celebration of that history, the United States Congress established Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week in 1978; that week was extended to the full month of May with the signature of President George H. W. Bush in 1990; and

WHEREAS, May is an appropriate month for the observation of Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month: May 7, 1843 was the arrival date of Nakahama Manjiro, the first Japanese immigrant to the United States; it was on May 10, 1869 that the United States was united coast to coast by the Transcontinental Railroad with the placement of the "Golden Spike"; the railroad was made possible by herculean efforts of the mostly Chinese immigrant workers; and

WHEREAS, The Asian American community played a heroic role in the Second World War; the 442nd Infantry regiment, made mostly of Japanese Americans, fought for the United States while their families at home were facing harsh discrimination and internment; the 442nd became one of the most decorated units for its size, earning almost 10,000 Purple Hearts; and

WHEREAS, Despite the contributions of the different Asian Americans and immigrants, the Asian American community has faced challenges and discrimination in the United States; many of the Chinese laborers were treated extremely poorly during the construction of the Transcontinental Railroad and none of the Chinese Americans were allowed in the famous picture of the "Golden Spike"; Asian immigrants faced xenophobia and outright violence throughout periods of the 19th and 20th centuries; on May 6, 1882, Congress passed the Chinese Exclusion Act; Congress passed even more draconian legislation in 1924 in the form of the Immigration Act of 1924 which prevented most people of Asia from immigrating to the United States; and

WHEREAS, Despite this discrimination, brilliant leaders from different Asian American communities have contributed to the legacy of the United States; leaders like Dalip Singh Saund, the first Asian American elected to Congress; Fred T. Korematsu, the champion of civil liberties and of the Japanese Americans interned during the Second World War; Larry Dulay Itliong, hero for the labor movement; and Grace Lee Boggs and Patsy Mink, a transformative force for Title IX; all have served as movers and shakers in the United States; whether as soldiers, laborers, business owners, advocates, or community leaders, those in the Asian American and Pacific Islander community continue to rise up to the challenges they face and serve as a force for good in the State of Illinois and the United States; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare May of 2017 as Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in honor of the people in these communities in Illinois and the nation.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 358**

Offered by Representative Hoffman:

WHEREAS, The Department of Innovation and Technology is a State agency that was created under an executive order by Governor Bruce Rauner; and

WHEREAS, The Department is extremely opaque and lacks significant transparency requirements to which other State agencies are subject; for example, \$71 million was transferred by then Comptroller Leslie Munger out of the General Revenue Fund and deposited into various other funds used by the Department and the Department of Central Management Services; those funds already had healthy balances; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is engaged in a historic budget impasse that has caused serious damage to the State and its citizens including: an increase in the State's backlog of bills to over \$12.7 billion; cuts to vital services for our most vulnerable residents including domestic violence victims, the developmentally disabled, and senior citizens; cuts to childcare that eliminated affordable daycare for 47,000 children; a substantial reduction in funding for MAP grants for low income students; State university credit rating downgrades to junk status; and drastic cuts to life-saving breast and cervical cancer screenings; and

WHEREAS, Recent reports in the news media have brought to light the fact that the Secretary of the Department of Innovation and Technology, Hardik Bhatt, who is paid \$145,000 a year, spent \$208,000 on annual membership costs for professional subscriptions; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that Governor Rauner is urged to end the frivolous spending that is currently taking place at the Department of Innovation and Technology while the people of Illinois suffer; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we admonish Secretary Bhatt, and urge him to immediately cancel the subscriptions and seek to create a department that is more open and transparent going forward; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor Rauner and Secretary Bhatt.

### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 54

Offered by Representative Evans:

WHEREAS, Forty-six years ago, with the passage of the National Cancer Act of 1971, leaders of the United States came together to establish cancer research and patient care as public health priorities; and

WHEREAS, In 2017, an estimated 600,920 Americans, or more than 1,640 people a day, are expected to die of cancer; and

WHEREAS, Cancer is the second most common cause of death in the United States, exceeded only by heart disease; and

WHEREAS, In the United States, cancer accounts for nearly one in every four deaths; and

WHEREAS, The risk of being diagnosed with cancer increases with age, with 91% of new cases occurring at age 45 or later; and

WHEREAS, In the United States, men have slightly less than a one in two lifetime risk of developing cancer; and

WHEREAS, In the United States, women have slightly more than a one in three lifetime risk of developing cancer; and

WHEREAS, A total of 64,720 new cases of cancer among Illinois residents were reported in 2017; and WHEREAS, In 2017, the American Cancer Society reported an estimated 20,040 cancer deaths in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Cancer touches everyone, either through a direct, personal diagnosis or indirectly through the diagnosis of a family member or friend; and

WHEREAS, According to the Sanger Institute, the Cancer Gene Census has identified more than 600 cancer-related genes, and the list of those genes will continue growing as researchers continue identifying genomic changes associated with different types of cancer; and

WHEREAS, Other external factors affect cancer risks, including, but not limited to, nutrition, physical activity, safe neighborhoods, healthy foods, access to education, and differences in occupational hazards, environmental exposure to pollution and other toxins; and

WHEREAS, According to the American Association for Cancer Research, advances in chemotherapy, surgery, radiation, and palliative care have led to important improvements in patient care and, as a result, increases in survival rates associated with many cancers, including acute lymphoblastic leukemia, Hodgkin's disease, aggressive lymphomas, and testicular cancer; and

WHEREAS, Advances in cancer care, including early detection and high-quality treatment programs, and access to health care coverage are necessary to provide cancer patients with an efficient and effective continuum of care; and

WHEREAS, Public policy can influence and support efficient cancer care by mitigating some of the economic and public health burdens on State agencies, including the Department of Public Health, the Department of Healthcare and Family Services, and the Department of Human Services; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that an urgent and significant need exists to discuss and evaluate public policies affecting cancer research, treatment, education, and prevention efforts; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Senate and the Illinois House of Representatives, by this resolution, express their support for the establishment of a joint legislative cancer caucus, to be formally known as the Illinois Legislative Cancer Caucus; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Legislative Cancer Caucus shall act as a forum for legislators and affiliate members to learn about important public health issues related to cancer and to evaluate legislative proposals concerning those issues; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members and affiliate members of the Illinois Legislative Cancer Caucus shall work to increase awareness and promote policies to prevent, treat, and educate the public about cancer, with the ultimate goal of identifying solutions to unmet needs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Legislative Cancer Caucus shall work to strengthen community support programs, to meet the diverse needs of Illinois citizens, and to support programs that make treatment options available to the medically indigent; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the organizing members of the Illinois General Assembly respectfully request recognition within the Illinois General Assembly as the official caucus for issues related to cancer prevention, treatment, and education efforts; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be distributed to the members of the General Assembly, the Governor, the Director of Public Health, the Director of Healthcare and Family Services, and the Secretary of Human Services.
