WHEREAS, The State of Illinois should be a leader at providing all the resources necessary to help unemployed veterans get back to work; and

WHEREAS, The State of Missouri maintains a one-of-a-kind website to help put unemployed veterans back to work, called "Show Me Heroes"; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage the Illinois Department of Employment Security to create a website modeled after the State of Missouri's "Show Me Heroes" website to help put more veterans back to work; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor Bruce Rauner and the Director of Employment Security.
