WHEREAS, Lions Clubs International will celebrate its 100th anniversary and its first century of service at its Chicago Centennial Celebration from June 30 to July 4, 2017, which will feature the plenary session of Lions on Sunday, July 2; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize July 2, 2017 as Lions Day in Illinois to give recognition to Lions across Illinois, and the world, for their commitment to serving the peoples of the world; and be it further

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTIONS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS FIRST READING

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 33

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Section 2 of Article V of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE V THE EXECUTIVE

SECTION 2. TERMS

These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant Governor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years thereafter.

A person may not be elected to any Executive Branch office, or any combination of Executive Branch offices, for terms totaling more than 8 years. Service before the second Monday in January of 2019 shall not be considered in the calculation of a person's service.
