To Clerk of the House Timothy D. Mapes:

During the debate on HJR 17, I stood to oppose the concept of naming public structures or highways after American elected officials who are still living, however significant they might be. As I began to elaborate in my remarks, it has happened before in Illinois and other states, but this has no bearing on whether it is in fact a good practice. Consequently, despite being recorded as a "No Vote," on today's roll call for HJR 17, I would like to be recorded as a "No" vote.

To be clear, my wish to be recorded as a "No" vote is not a matter of partisan politics: rather, this is a matter of establishing a precedent that is worthy of emulation. Naming public structures or highways after people of significance who are still living is not good public policy, and I have attempted to be consistent in my votes (the Dennis Hastert statue and the naming of I-74 after Ray LaHood, serving as just two examples).

Given that the legacy of an individual cannot be determined until they have passed on, we should not immortalize them before a full account may be given. Furthermore, to name public properties after any one person who is still alive is inappropriate given that we aspire to defend a government that is of, by, and for the people. The decision to honor a still living individual in this manner could serve as a perverse incentive for elected officials today or in the future to act in a manner that is more self-serving than for the public good.
