100th General Assembly:

Today I veto Senate Bill 321 from the 100th General Assembly, which provides that the Auditor General initiate a performance audit of the Department of Healthcare and Family Services.

The audit requirement is specific to certain managed care provisions and can be performed as part of a larger internal or external audit of the Department's managed care program. The Auditor General has authority to examine the Department and programs such as these every two years. Furthermore, the Department has worked on transparent implementation of the cited programs that included involvement by the Medicaid Advisory Committee. Through this process the Department continues to diligently work toward compliance with all statutory requirements. Requiring a separate audit is expensive, time consuming, and unnecessary. To the Honorable Members of The Illinois Senate, 100th General Assembly:

Today, I veto Senate Bill 1714, which would add reporting requirements for consultants retained by retirement system, pension fund, or investment boards.

This legislation is a classic example of multiplying red tape without first demonstrating any benefit. Retirement system, pension fund, and investment boards all hire consultants to help identify investment opportunities. Under this bill, all consultants now will have to report to the boards that hired them on their engagement with investment services provided by a minority-owned business, a female-owned business, or a business owned by a person with a disability.

There is no showing that this blanket requirement is necessary to produce some tangible benefit. To be sure, accountability and transparency, which ostensibly motivate this bill, are laudable goals, and we should expect all retirement systems, pension funds, and investment boards to demand from their consultants this type of information. However, nothing currently is preventing us from making this demand of these boards.

Left to their own devices, the boards should be expected to implement requirements that make sense for each board. Contrast that with blanket legislation like this bill, which would impose the same rigid requirements regardless of each board's unique circumstances. That, of course, is the main problem with legislating additional red tape. We should do better and should immediately ask all retirement systems, pension funds, and investment boards to implement and be held accountable for guidelines in the spirit of what this bill would unforgivingly mandate.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 9(b) of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return Senate Bill 1714, entitled "AN ACT concerning public employee benefits," with the foregoing objections, vetoed in its entirety.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 660

Offered by Representative Bill Mitchell:

WHEREAS, The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) offers nutrition assistance to lowincome individuals and families; and

WHEREAS, While SNAP is intended to ensure that no one should fear going hungry, it also reflects the importance of work and responsibility; and

WHEREAS, SNAP rules require all recipients meet work requirements unless they are exempt because of age or disability; and

WHEREAS, Some of these working individuals are ABAWDs or able-bodied adults without dependents, who must meet work requirements to maintain SNAP eligibility; and

WHEREAS, ABAWDs can only receive SNAP benefits for three months in three years if they do not meet the work requirement, which requires an ABAWD to work at least 80 hours per month, participate in qualifying education and training activities 80 hours a month, or comply with a workforce program; and

WHEREAS, The three-month time limit on ABAWDs is part of the law that governs the operation of SNAP and has been in effect since 1996; and

WHEREAS, States can apply for a waiver from the three-month time limit, which would allow ABAWDs to be eligible for SNAP without meeting the ABAWD work requirement; and

WHEREAS, Several other states, including Maine, Georgia, and Alabama have chosen not to seek an ABAWD time limit work waiver from the federal government, and as a result have seen a decrease in SNAP participation; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that reinstating the work requirement for ABAWDs in Illinois will encourage work-ready adults to be self reliant and independent; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the Department of Human Services to let Illinois' federal time limit waiver expire and not seek another waiver, so that ABAWDs will actively meet employment or education requirements, boosting our state's economy and saving our state money with fewer Illinoisans reliant on SNAP benefits.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 677

WHEREAS, Governor Bruce Rauner is responsible for filling the three vacancies that occurred on the University of Illinois Board of Trustees as members cycled off in the fall of 2016; and

WHEREAS, Amazon's ideal site and building requirements for HQ2 include being 30 miles from a population center, within 45 minutes of an international airport, 1-2 miles from major highways and roads, access to on-site mass transit (i.e. direct access to rail, train, subway/metro bus routes), 500,000 square feet of building space for Phase 1 in 2019, and up to 8,000,000 square feet beyond 2027; and

WHEREAS, We are confident Illinois can meet Amazon's ideal site and building requirements due to the fact that Illinois is the fifth largest state in the country, is home to 107 public and private airports, maintains 18,154 total interstate and state highway miles, operates 63 public transit systems, has 9,982 miles of railroad tracks with nearly 1,100 miles of navigable waterways, and encompasses 55,519 square miles of land; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we believe Illinois can meet the needs of Amazon's second headquarters in North America and look forward to offering a warm welcome if they so choose Illinois as home for HQ2; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Amazon as a symbol of our admiration and respect for one of the most innovative companies in the world.

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall, at a minimum, review and produce recommendations concerning amendments to the legal definition of the terms "sexual discrimination" and "sexual harassment"; which behaviors should be legally actionable as sexual harassment; review and assess best practices to improve procedures for accepting sexual discrimination and harassment complaints, including methods to increase and improve reporting allegations of sexual harassment; the process and structure for reporting allegations to ethics officers, inspectors general, and others, and whether an independent third party should be assigned to handle complaints; necessary amendments to anti-retaliation and whistleblower protections for individuals making sexual discrimination or harassment complaints; the process for filing complaints with the Department of Human Rights; the process for filing civil complaints, including any applicable statute of limitations; legal remedies available to victims of sexual discrimination and harassment, including whether plaintiffs should be entitled to punitive damages; the need for a code of conduct and zero tolerance policies for units of government; the ability of complainants to seek independent counsel when reporting allegations; and the prevention of sexual discrimination and harassment in the public and private sector; and be it further

RESOLVED, That that the Task Force shall be comprised of members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and House members appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, with each appointing no more than 20 members, and the Chair appointed by the Speaker, and any action of the Task Force shall be approved by a majority of those voting on the question; and be it further
