WHEREAS, The ACT College and Career Readiness Standards were specifically designed to ensure high school students have the essential skills and knowledge needed to become effective students or workers; and WHEREAS, Areas that have adopted the ACT College and Career Readiness Standards have seen improvements in both college and career readiness; and

WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the State to use whatever avenues are available to prepare its students as much as possible for entrance into postsecondary education or the workforce; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we strongly urge Illinois to adopt the ACT College and Career Readiness Standards for high school English language arts, math, and science courses to ensure Illinois high school students are adequately prepared for higher education, to enter the workforce, or to follow whatever path they may choose; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to all members of the Illinois General Assembly and the Governor of the State of Illinois.

WHEREAS, Volkswagen American Group has entered into a multi-billion-dollar settlement with the U.S. Department of Justice and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for violations of the federal Clean Air Act for installing "defeat devices" software in 590,000 diesel engine vehicles of model years between 2009 and 2016; this caused the vehicles to operate differently during emission testing compared to normal operation, circumventing federal vehicle emissions standards resulting in excess NOx emissions from the illegal vehicles; and

WHEREAS, According to the American Lung Association's Estimated Prevalence of Lung Disease Report, there are 1,709,000 people impacted by Pediatric Asthma, Adult Asthma, COPD, and Lung Cancer throughout Illinois; and

WHEREAS, A Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Fund of \$2.7 billion has been established by a federal judge to mitigate the total lifetime excess nitrogen oxide (NOx) emissions from all identified Volkswagen diesel vehicles in violation of the Clean Air Act; this fund is to be administered by an independent trustee, Wilmington Trust, N.A, for the purpose of dispersing funds to beneficiary states for projects to reduce NOx emissions as mitigation for Volkswagen's unlawful emissions; and

WHEREAS, Based upon the total number of 2.0 L and 3.0 L Volkswagen diesel engines in violation of the Clean Air Act sold in each state, Illinois has been allocated \$108.7 million through the Volkswagen Settlement Mitigation Trust; and

WHEREAS, The Volkswagen Mitigation Trust presents a rare opportunity for the State of Illinois to significantly reduce harmful NOx emissions through the replacement of older engine technology with cleaner emissions vehicles and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, On January 30, 2018, the Trustee provided notice that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has been listed as the Lead Agency for the State and has been charged with the development of the State's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, Illinois may use its Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Fund allocation for the following categories of projects, as defined by the settlement: Class 8 Local Freight Trucks and Port Drayage Trucks (Eligible Large Trucks), Class 4-8 School Bus, Shuttle Bus, or Transit Bus (Eligible Buses), Railroad Freight Switchers, Ferries/Tugs, Ocean Going Vessels (OGV) Shorepower, Class 4-7 Local Freight Trucks (Eligible Medium Trucks), Airport Ground Support Equipment, Forklifts and Port Cargo Handling Equipment, Light Duty Zero Emission Vehicle Supply Equipment, and the Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA) Option; and

WHEREAS, The ultimate and primary objective of the State's Volkswagen Beneficial Mitigation Trust Plan shall be to reduce NOx emissions equitably throughout the State of Illinois through investments in all applicable, eligible infrastructure and fleet vehicle options that are the most cost-effective, currently commercially available, viable and reasonably affordable to end users; and

WHEREAS, All beneficiary states have 10 years to spend allocated trust funds; and

WHEREAS, Each state's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan allows for up to 15% of total funds to be used by state lead agencies for applicable administrative services, including conducting public hearings; and

WHEREAS, Well in advance of posting draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plans, the vast majority of designated administrative agencies of other states have conducted and have already completed comprehensive, transparent public hearings involving all stakeholders - a critical component in the drafting process of each state's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan - months in advance of posting their state's respective draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plans; and

WHEREAS, In complete contrast to the open and transparent public hearings conducted by the vast majority of other states, on February 28, 2018, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency posted its draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plan on its official agency website; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's draft Beneficial Mitigation Plan includes a state map, clearly highlighting that only 16 counties, not every county in the State of Illinois, will be eligible for Volkswagen Mitigation Trust money; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency cited in its draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plan that it has conducted private meetings with select stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency also posted notice on February 27, 2018 that limited online public comments and an Agency-created online focused survey would be accepted by the Agency for a limited period, expiring April 13, 2018, at which time, per the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, the period for submission online surveys and online public comments will be closed, representing the first and only form of official public input the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency will allow - a time period after, not before the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency posted its draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, Consequently the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plan has not been properly vetted by all eligible stakeholders, both applicable industries and end-users, or the general public; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, in its draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plan timeline, indicated the state's final plan would be submitted to the Trustee by the end of May, 2018, and that the first round of applications would be accepted in June, 2018; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recommend the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency withdraw its draft Beneficiary Mitigation Plan; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recommend the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, prior to submitting the final Beneficiary Mitigation Plant for the State to the Trustee, extend its arbitrary public comment period through June 30, 2018, to allow sufficient time for transparent and open public hearings; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recommend the establishment of the Illinois Volkswagen Environmental Beneficiary Mitigation Plan Task Force to be comprised of stakeholders from all eligible vehicle classifications included in the Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recommend the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency provide staff and administrative support for the operation of the Task Force, with all Trustee authorized Agency administrative expenses being reimbursed through the Environmental Mitigation Trust Fund; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recommend the Task Force assist the Agency in conducting a minimum of four regional public hearings across the State of Illinois, seeking public input from all stakeholders representing interests in each eligible vehicle classification cited in the Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Fund, with specific merit given to proposals that achieve the intended Environmental Mitigation Trust Fund goal of cost-effectively reducing NOx emission through the replacement of older vehicles with viable, trustee-approved vehicles and infrastructure.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 114

Offered by Representative Phillips:

WHEREAS, It is highly fitting that the Illinois General Assembly pays honor and respect to the truly great individuals who have served our country and, in doing so, have made the ultimate sacrifice for our nation; and

WHEREAS, Specialist 4 Michael Harold Flood was born in Effingham on October 1, 1948, the first child of Harold Joseph and Anna Charlene (Crose) Flood; he, along with his siblings, Patricia Marie (Turner), Daniel Joseph, Kathleen Ann (Darling), Marlene Ann (Van Matre), Kevin Eugene, and Larry Eugene, lived on the family farm in rural Toledo; and

WHEREAS, SPC Flood started working with his father at a young age, caring for cattle and pigs and working on farm equipment; he started assisting with harvesting the crops as soon as his feet could touch the pedals on the equipment; his favorite class in high school was building and trades, which he took all four years; his class built a new house every school year on Route 121 near the high school; he loved building so much that he decided after graduation he wanted to work full time at the builder's supply store in Toledo; and

WHEREAS, SPC Flood joined the United States Army on April 3, 1968; he was a combat medic assigned to Company B, 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry, 101st Airborne; he was killed in action on Good Friday, April 4, 1969 while on routine patrol outside a firebase above the Ashau Valley; he died while providing medical aid to others who were wounded in action; for his extraordinary bravery under fire, he was posthumously awarded the Silver Star and the Bronze Star; and

WHEREAS, SPC Flood loved cars and the races; he aspired to be a race car driver and perhaps one day race in Nascar when he returned from Vietnam and completed his service; and

WHEREAS, Throughout high school, SPC Flood was active in the Future Farmers of America and for 25 years his parents provided a monetary award and trophy in his memory to an outstanding FFA senior; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate the segment of Illinois Route 121 in Cumberland County between CR 1450 East and CR 1600 East as the "SPC Michael Flood Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name the "SPC Michael Flood Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the family of SPC Flood and the Secretary of Transportation.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 115

Offered by Representative Harper:

WHEREAS, In 2014, the United States Department of Education and the United States Department of Justice issued guidance through the Dear Colleague Letter on the Nondiscriminatory Administration of School Discipline on January 8, 2014, to assist public schools with administering student discipline without discriminating on the basis of race, color, or national origin; and

WHEREAS, Every student is entitled to equal education opportunities regardless of race, color, or national origin; and

WHEREAS, This guidance addresses the school-to-prison pipeline, a problematic trend in which students of color are disproportionately suspended, expelled, arrested, and exposed to law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, states, school districts, and schools must not intentionally treat students differently nor implement policies or practices in providing educational resources that disproportionately affect students based on race, color, or national origin, as this discrimination is prohibited; and

WHEREAS, According to U.S. Education Department data, research shows that racial disparities in school discipline contribute to adverse impacts on the student achievement gap, including lower grades, higher dropout rates, higher incarceration rates, and reduction of important instructional time due to exclusionary discipline; and

WHEREAS, Black female students in Illinois are more than 7.5 times more likely to have multiple out-of-school suspensions than white female students; and

WHEREAS, Latino students in Illinois are nearly 1.5 times more likely to have multiple out-of-school suspensions than white students; and

WHEREAS, Black students in Illinois are two times more likely to be referred to law enforcement by their schools than white students; and

WHEREAS, Higher rates of suspension are related to higher rates of future antisocial behaviors and involvement in the juvenile justice system; and

WHEREAS, Data from Chicago educators suggests only 20% of educators feel they have received "at least effective" training on restorative justice; and

WHEREAS, In acknowledgement of said disparities, Illinois passed Senate Bill 100 in 2015 in recognition of the growing national and local movements focused on breaking down the school-to-prison pipeline and reducing exclusionary discipline practices; and

WHEREAS, Those schools and districts that have prioritized implementation of restorative practices as a result of Senate Bill 100 of the 99th General Assembly have seen significant reductions in suspensions, expulsions, and notifications; and

WHEREAS, In accordance with Title VI, data suggest via the U.S. Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Justice that this current guidance on how to identify, avoid, and remedy discriminatory discipline will assist schools in providing all students with equal educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Equitable discipline policies are crucial to creating safe and welcoming school environments, improving a school's climate and culture, and ultimately increasing overall student engagement and achievement; and

WHEREAS, Given the aforementioned data and concerns, Illinois must reaffirm its commitment to dismantling the school-to-prison pipeline and ensuring that we are educating and preparing all our young people to build a brighter future for themselves and our State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the U.S. Department of Education to actively sustain the school discipline guidance released by the Departments of Education and Justice in 2014, and the State of Illinois and Illinois State Board of Education to uphold the original school discipline guidance released by the Department of Education and Justice in 2014, regardless of the decision made by the U.S. Department of Education; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to United States Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos, Illinois State Superintendent of Education Tony Smith, and Illinois State Board of Education Chairman James T. Meeks.
