And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the negative by the following vote: 45, Yeas; 62, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

This bill, having failed to receive the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared lost.

On motion of Representative Moylan, HOUSE BILL 4843 was taken up and read by title a third time.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 61, Yeas; 44, Nays; 1, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 15)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

HOUSE BILLS ON SECOND READING

Having been reproduced, the following bills were taken up, read by title a second time and held on the order of Second Reading: HOUSE BILLS 5508 and 5757.

HOUSE BILL 4364. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time. Representative Davidsmeyer offered Amendments numbered 1 and 2 and moved their adoption. The foregoing motions prevailed and Amendments numbered 1 and 2 were adopted. There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendments numbered 1 and 2 were ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL 5612. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time. Amendment No. 1 was offered in the Committee on Executive, adopted and reproduced. Representative Greg Harris offered Amendment No. 2 and moved its adoption. The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 2 was adopted. There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendments numbered 1 and 2 were ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL 1265. Having been read by title a second time on April 26, 2017, and held on the order of Second Reading, the same was again taken up. Representative Hoffman offered Amendments numbered 1 and 2 and moved their adoption. The foregoing motions prevailed and Amendments numbered 1 and 2 were adopted. There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendments numbered 1 and 2 were ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL 1292. Having been read by title a second time on April 26, 2017, and held on the order of Second Reading, the same was again taken up. Representative Hoffman offered Amendment No. 2 and moved its adoption. The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 2 was adopted. There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 2 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was to the order of Third Reading

HOUSE BILL 4226. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time. Representative Kifowit offered Amendment No. 1 and moved its adoption. The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 1 was adopted. There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

Having been reproduced, the following bill was taken up, read by title a second time and held on the order of Second Reading: HOUSE BILL 5310.

HOUSE BILL 4657. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time. Amendment No. 1 was offered in the Committee on Elementary & Secondary Education: School Curriculum & Policies, adopted and reproduced. Representative Manley offered Amendment No. 2 and moved its adoption. The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 2 was adopted. There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendments numbered 1 and 2 were ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL 4658. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time. Floor Amendment No. 1 remained in the Committee on Rules. There being no further amendments, the bill was advanced to the order of Third Reading.
