WHEREAS, All children in Illinois are entitled to the facilities and resources needed for a high-quality education; and

WHEREAS, Many charter schools are in older, sometimes dilapidated buildings that require repair, such as tuckpointing, new roofs, or boilers; and

WHEREAS, Most children in existing charter schools do not have the necessary access to special education resource space, adequate space for physical education and athletics, and dining facilities; and

WHEREAS, Eleven jurisdictions (Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Utah, and Washington D.C.) currently offer facilities support for charter public schools through varying resources and can be an authority on best practices; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Task Force on Charter Public School Facilities is created to examine charter public school facilities issues, including the following:

(1) an analysis of the current capital funds and facilities provisions in the Illinois Charter Schools Law for the purpose of ensuring equitable access;

- (2) a comparative analysis of charter public school facilities funding and access across the United States; and
- (3) recommendations for ensuring that charter public schools have equitable access to safe and appropriate facilities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members:

- (1) two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- (2) two members appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives;
- (3) one member appointed by the State Superintendent of Education or his or her designee;
- (4) the chief executive officer of a school district in a city having a population exceeding 500,000 or his or her designee;
- (5) one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, upon recommendation of an organization representing teachers in a school district in a city having a population exceeding 500,000;
- (6) one member appointed by the Governor, upon recommendation of a statewide organization representing charter public schools in the State;
- (7) a principal of a currently operating, high-performing charter public school in the State, appointed by the State Superintendent of Education;
- (8) one member appointed by the Governor, who is representative of a community organization that operates charter public schools, upon recommendation of that community organization;
- (9) one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, upon the recommendation of an organization representing the business community of the State;
- (10) one member appointed by the Governor, upon recommendation of an education advocacy group that organizes parents and supports high-quality public-school options, including high-quality public charter schools;
- (11) one member appointed by the state superintendent representing one of the ten currently operating Commission-approved charter public schools in this State, upon recommendation of the leadership of the Commission-approved charter public schools;
- (12) one member appointed by the Governor, upon recommendation of a large, non-profit community development financial institution (CDFI) in Illinois that provides or has provided specialized loans, real estate development, and additional forms of financial assistance to charter public schools in this State; and
- (13) one member appointed by the state superintendent who represents a charter school outside of the City of Chicago; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of the Task Force shall elect a chairperson from among their membership and that the State Charter School Commission shall provide administrative support; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of the Task Force shall be appointed within 30 days after the adoption of this resolution and shall begin meeting no later than 30 days after the appointments are finalized; in the event the appointments by the Governor are not made within 30 days after the adoption of this resolution, the State Superintendent shall make such appointments within 15 days of the appointment deadline; members shall serve without compensation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall issue a report making recommendations on any changes to State laws with regard to charter public school facilities access on or before January 9, 2019 and that the Task Force shall be dissolved upon issuance of this report; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the report filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall be provided to the Clerk in electronic form only, in the manner that the Clerk shall direct; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the State Superintendent of Education, the State Charter School Commission, and the Chief Executive Officer of the City of Chicago School District 299.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1155

Offered by Representative Jimenez:

WHEREAS, In the late 1950s and early 1960s, United States military personnel began serving as military advisors to the South Vietnamese military in their conflict with North Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, As the Vietnam War escalated over the subsequent decade; Americans, including many Illinoisans, were called to join the war as the United States implemented a military draft; and

WHEREAS, As the war continued, over 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces would lose their lives and more than 300,000 were wounded; and

WHEREAS, Nearly 3,000 Illinoisans were killed or listed as missing in action during the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, Upon returning home, those who served in Vietnam were met with a vigorous public debate about the involvement of the United States in the war; and

WHEREAS, As these veterans returned home, many of them were not given the credit and support they deserved for dutifully serving their country; many were met with vigorous protests and condemnations and received widespread insults by opponents of the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, While service members returning home following World War II and the Korean War were met with homecoming celebrations, veterans returning from Vietnam were met with strong opposition that was directed at them rather than the appropriate decision makers in Washington; and

WHEREAS, Many who returned home from the battlefield were spit on, called killers, and ignored by the American public at a time when they needed the support of their fellow citizens; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we stand united in our strong support of all military personnel who served and sacrificed during the Vietnam War and offer our heartfelt and sincere apology to all Vietnam veterans who were mistreated after returning home from their service; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we declare November 1, 2018 as "Vietnam Veterans Recognition Day" in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge all Illinoisans to show support and gratitude to all Americans who have worn the uniform of the United States and who put their lives in danger to defend our freedoms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Governor and the Secretary of State to instruct that all flags within their purview be lowered to half-mast on November 1, 2018 as a sign of respect to all Vietnam veterans; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Director of the Illinois Department of Veteran's Affairs, the Illinois Vietnam Veterans of America, the Illinois Secretary of State, and the Governor of the State of Illinois.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1156

Offered by Representative Scherer:

WHEREAS, In order to become a certified teacher in Illinois, a student must pass a performance-based assessment known as the edTPA; and

WHEREAS, On top of the cost of tuition, the basic skills exam, and other certification requirements, this is an unproven and restrictive exam administered by Pearson Education, Inc.; in addition, there is a \$300 fee for taking the edTPA; and

WHEREAS, The edTPA takes away from the classroom experience, the most valid part of the student teaching process, and student teachers are already observed by no less than three educational professionals during classroom time; and

WHEREAS, Preparation for the edTPA can take time away from the normal curriculum and can detract from the overall student-teaching experience, shifting the focus from learning to teaching to pass a test; and

WHEREAS, Previously, The State Board of Education required the APT licensure, another teacher licensure for which there was no research or evidence to support that it was a reliable method for evaluating or choosing teacher candidates; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage the State Board of Education to heavily look at counting student teaching experience, and program requirements and curriculum for teacher licensure, instead of the edTPA and the APT; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the State Superintendent, the Illinois State Board of Education, and Pearson Education.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 137

Offered by Representative Davis:

WHEREAS, Attorney General Lisa Madigan initiated Senate Bill 1531 to increase oversight of alternative retail electric and alternative gas suppliers and to guard against aggressive and misleading marketing and sales practices in the competitive energy supply market; and

WHEREAS, Currently in Illinois, there are nearly 55 alternative retail electric suppliers that are authorized to sell electricity to residential customers; and

WHEREAS, According to the Illinois Commerce Commission, alternative retail electric supplier customers in Illinois as a whole paid more than \$198 million more for electricity than traditional utility customers from June 1, 2016 through May 31, 2017 and, statewide, residential, and small commercial customers enrolled with alternative retail electric suppliers have paid almost \$400 million more in electricity costs in the last three years; and

WHEREAS, According to the Attorney General, nearly all customers that switch to alternative retail electric or alternative gas suppliers pay more for their energy bills than traditional utility customers, and residential customers do not have the ability to determine whether a company's money-saving claims are true; and

WHEREAS, Allegations exist that certain alternative retail electric and alternative gas suppliers frequently target older citizens, low-income customers, and individuals for whom English is a second language and use bait and switch marketing tactics where they entice consumers with savings claims and low teaser rates and then end up charging consumers up to three times the traditional utility rate; and

WHEREAS, The goal of the legislation is to rein in bad actors in the competitive energy supply industry who use aggressive and misleading marketing practices to lure people into paying more than they need to for their electricity and to create transparency and equip consumers with meaningful information so that they can make educated decisions about energy supply service; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1531 intends to improve enforcement actions against alternative retail energy suppliers' unlawful and deceptive marketing practices by giving the Attorney General's Office additional legal tools under the Illinois Consumer Fraud Act; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1531 intends to increase transparency around rate pricing by requiring alternative retail electric suppliers and alternative gas suppliers to include a "price-to-compare" utility supply rate on all marketing materials, during phone or door-to-door solicitations and on every customer's utility bill; and

WHEREAS, The legislation will require disclosure of price changes and will prevent suppliers from automatically renewing a customer's contract without the customer affirmatively opting-in to new terms; and

WHEREAS, Alternative retail electric and alternative gas suppliers will also be required to submit their rates to the Illinois Commerce Commission and the Attorney General's Office quarterly under this legislation; and

WHEREAS, The legislation intends to protect public energy assistance funds by ensuring that Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program and the Percentage of Income Payment Plan funds do not go toward paying the higher prices for electric and gas supply that alternative retail electric or alternative gas suppliers charge; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1531 is supported by a coalition of consumer advocates including AARP, Illinois PIRG, Center for Changing Lives, Citizen Action, Citizens Utility Board, Community Organizing and Family Issues (COFI), Heartland Alliance for Human Needs & Human Rights, Housing Action Illinois, Pilsen Alliance, and the Environmental Law and Policy Center; and

WHEREAS, The legislation has also received support from the City of Chicago, the Spanish Community Center, the Inner-City Muslim Action Network, LUCHA, and Preservation of Affordable Housing (POAH); and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Competitive Energy Association, the Retail Energy Supply Association, and other competitive energy suppliers, who provide consumers with customized energy products and services in addition to electric supply service, support stronger enforcement measures to root out unscrupulous suppliers from the competitive energy market, additional rate disclosure requirements, and further consumer education and protection improvements; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Commerce Commission is a quasi-judicial body responsible for regulating several industries, as directed by the Illinois General Assembly, including licensing alternative retail electric and alternative gas suppliers, and regulating their marketing and sales practices; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Commerce Commission's mission is to promote the development of an effectively competitive electricity market that operates efficiently and is equitable to all consumers consistent with the Electric Service Customer Choice and Rate Relief Law of 1997, the Retail Electric Competition Act of 2006, the Alternative Gas Supplier Law; the Public Utilities Act, and Commission Rules; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Commerce Commission provides analysis, policy development, public safety, and enforcement activities related to electric and natural gas companies; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Illinois Commerce Commission shall study the provisions of and circumstances surrounding Senate Bill 1531 and any other pertinent pending or proposed legislation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Commerce Commission shall conduct at least three public meetings in which comments and proposals can be presented that address the concerns and allegations regarding the alternative retail electric and alternative gas suppliers and competitive energy markets from the Attorney General's Office, the aforementioned coalition of consumer advocates, the Illinois Competitive Energy Association, the Retail Energy Supply Association, other competitive energy suppliers, and any other interested party; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Commerce Commission shall submit its findings, conclusions, and recommendations, either through changes in future legislation, or Commission Rules, or Commission Docketed Proceedings, in a report to the Illinois General Assembly on or before January 9, 2019; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the report filed with the General Assembly shall be filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate in electronic form only, in the manner that the Clerk and Secretary shall direct.
