#### **Perfunctory Session**

#### MONDAY, MAY 27, 2019

At the hour of 7:08 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

#### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 417**

Offered by Representative Butler:

WHEREAS, According to its website, the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation (the "Foundation") was incorporated in 2000 as a not-for-profit organization to "assist with private sector fundraising initiatives during the planning, construction and implementation phases related to the establishment of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum in Springfield, Illinois"; and

WHEREAS, The Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum Act (20 ILCS 3475/15) provides that the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum (the "Agency") and the Foundation shall "mutually co-operate to maximize resources available to the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum and to support, sustain, and provide educational programs and collections at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum"; and

WHEREAS, The Act (20 ILCS 3475/15) further provides that "[a]ny membership fees collected by the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation may be used to support the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum programs or collections at the Foundation's discretion"; and

WHEREAS, The Act (20 ILCS 3475/20) also provides that to facilitate communication and cooperation between the Agency and the Foundation, "the Foundation CEO shall serve as a non-voting, ex officio member of the Board" of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, The Amended and Restated Memorandum of Understanding of the Cooperative Agreement by and Between the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency (as predecessor to the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum) and the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation outlines the general responsibilities of each party; and

WHEREAS, Under the agreement, the Agency authorizes the Foundation to operate a store and restaurant, to select and price merchandise for the store, and to use net income from operating the store and restaurant for a variety of purposes, one of which is to support the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum; and

WHEREAS, The agreement requires the Foundation to provide the Agency with monthly reports that contain information related to the income and expenses of the store and restaurant within 30 days of the close of each month and to provide its annual audited financial statements within 14 days of receipt from the Foundation's auditors; and

WHEREAS, The agreement authorizes the Agency to inspect the Foundation's books and records, but the Agency is not allowed to make copies of those books and records and is required to make efforts to keep certain information on a confidential and need-to-know only basis; and

WHEREAS, The Agreement expires on January 31, 2019 and may be renewed every two years with mutual agreement of the parties; and

WHEREAS, According to published reports, the Foundation has outstanding loans and is seeking State support for payment of its debt; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Auditor General is directed to conduct a management audit of the relationship between the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum (the "Agency") and the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation (the "Foundation"); and be it further

RESOLVED, That the audit include, but not be limited to, the following determinations: (1)The type and amount of direct and indirect support provided by the Agency to the Foundation, (2) The type and amount of direct and indirect support provided by the Foundation to the Agency, (3) The revenues and expenditures related to the Foundation's operation of the store and restaurant, (4) The extent to which the Agency has monitored its agreement with the Foundation and whether required reports are being submitted in a timely manner, (5) Any other actions taken by the Agency to oversee the Foundation to ensure that the purpose of the relationship is being fulfilled to the fullest extent possible, and (6) Whether the Foundation has received any other State moneys from any other State agency and, if so, the amount and purpose of those funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the audit shall include the past three completed fiscal years of the Agency's and Foundation's operations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That where necessary, the term "agency" shall include predecessor agencies and the term "support" shall include, but not be limited to, grants, contracts, leases, concessions, and admission and event fees; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Agency and any other entity that may have relevant information pertaining to this audit cooperate fully and promptly with the Auditor General's Office in the conduct of this audit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Auditor General commence this audit as soon as possible and report his findings and recommendations upon completion to the Legislative Audit Commission, the Governor, and all members of the General Assembly.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 80

Offered by Representative Walsh:

WHEREAS, Section 14.1 of the Toll Highway Act provides that prior to the issuance of bonds for or the commencement of construction of any new toll highway, that particular toll highway shall be authorized by joint resolution of the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, Additional highway capacity along Interstate 80 in Cook and Will Counties, including tolls on the additional capacity, would improve public safety and promote greater economic development; and

WHEREAS, The project is contingent on compliance with applicable environmental regulations and, if federal funds or requirements are involved, approval by the Federal Highway Administration; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority be authorized to commence a procurement process for projects to provide additional capacity along Interstate 80 between Interstate 55 and the Illinois-Indiana border in Cook and Will Counties and toll the additional capacity; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority shall complete the additional capacity project along Interstate 80 in a manner that supports diversity involvement in the project work and economic development in the region; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to each of the Directors of the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority and to the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 81

Offered by Representative Batinick:

WHEREAS, Private First Class Andrew N. Meari was assigned to service in Afghanistan as a member of 1st Battalion, 502nd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); and

WHEREAS, While guarding an entrance point to Combat Outpost Senjaray on November 1, 2010, PFC Meari and a comrade intercepted a motorcycle-riding, explosive-armed suicide bomber who was trying to get into the American combat camp; and

WHEREAS, Upon being intercepted, the suicide bomber detonated himself, killing himself and two Americans, including PFC Meari; and

WHEREAS, PFC Meari was killed in action in Afghanistan on November 1, 2010 under circumstances that saved multiple lives in the combat outpost that was under attack; and

WHEREAS, The memory of PFC Meari and his heroic service is commemorated by his neighbors with PFC Andrew Meari Memorial Park, located in his home town of Plainfield; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate the section of Illinois Route 59 from Caton Farm Road to Illinois Route 126 as the "PFC Andrew Meari Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation be requested to erect, at suitable locations consistent with State and Federal regulations, an appropriate plaque or signs giving notice of the name "PFC Andrew Meari Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Denise Williams of Plainfield, the mother of Private First Class Andrew N. Meari, and the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation.
