HOUSE RESOLUTION 219

Offered by Representative Lilly:

WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic has contributed to an economic crisis that has affected working Americans and has had a disproportionate effect on women, especially women of color; and

WHEREAS, Women have suffered the full force of this crisis because of inadequate childcare, instability in hard-hit industries, and insufficient health and safety resources; and

WHEREAS, The unpaid domestic work and the essential care work performed by women sustains societies and has immense economic value, yet recovery policies do not adequately support women; and

WHEREAS, Women comprise a majority of workers in industries impacted by COVID-19, including the hospitality, entertainment, healthcare, and restaurant industries; women comprise the majority of midwives, cleaners, launderers, nurses, and other community health workers; and

WHEREAS, Over 50 percent of all essential workers are women, including 78 percent of social workers and 77 percent of healthcare workers; and

WHEREAS, Despite the fact that women are at the forefront of exposure, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is not designed to fit them; surveys have found that less than 30 percent of PPE fits women correctly; and

WHEREAS, When schools are closed to reduce virus transmission, many women are forced to choose between childcare and staying in the workforce; many women have left their jobs or shifted to part-time work to accommodate for school and daycare closings; and

WHEREAS, Women make up the majority of single-parent households and perform 76 percent of unpaid care work; and

WHEREAS, 1 in 4 women who lost their jobs during the COVID-19 pandemic have reported that they lost their jobs due to a lack of childcare; and

WHEREAS, Women have been disproportionately affected by unemployment, with women suffering 60 percent of pandemic-related job losses; the unemployment rate for women reached a staggering 16 percent with most of the women affected being Black, Latinx, and disabled women; and

WHEREAS, Forcing women, who already have less savings than men, to drop out of the labor force to perform care work reduces their life-time income by 65 percent, which in turn exacerbates gaps in life-time income; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19-related restrictions also came at the expense of women's health and safety as women's shelters close and resources are reallocated to pandemic response; and

WHEREAS, Economic stress and social stress, coupled with restricted movement and social isolation, have led to an exponential increase in gender-based violence; without the economic and social resources that shelters and crisis centers provide, women are unable to escape abusive partners and face a greater threat of sexual exploitation and trafficking; and

WHEREAS, Pandemic-related restrictions have made it harder for women to seek health services as health clinics close and postpone or restrict non-emergency medical care for pandemic response; and

WHEREAS, The diversion of healthcare resources for the pandemic has exacerbated maternal mortality and morbidity; and

WHEREAS, Transgender women have faced more barriers to gender-affirming medical care, and individuals with uteruses face more difficulties getting gynecological care since the beginning of the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, It is essential that the General Assembly and the Governor fix the unemployment system, fully fund the Child Care Assistance Program, and institute policies that make it easier for caregivers to participate and stay in the workforce; and

WHEREAS, Economic and social policies cannot neglect the work women perform and the issues they face; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge state lawmakers to enact policies, such as prioritizing funding and supporting education including the evidence-based funding formula passed by the General Assembly, Paid Family Leave, Paid Sick Leave, and support programs dedicated to providing women with accessible healthcare and safety resources, including those that address the rate of maternal mortality, especially for Black and Latinx women, to preserve the health, safety, and well-being of women during the COVID-19 Pandemic; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Governor JB Pritzker and all members of the Illinois General Assembly.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 220

Offered by Representative Moeller:

WHEREAS, The future of our nation's productivity and competitiveness in the global marketplace depends on the success of all men and women; and

WHEREAS, Women have been discriminated against in education, the workplace, and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, Nationally, women working full time and year round continue to earn no more than 82 cents on the dollar compared to men working full time and year round; in Illinois, women earn 81 cents on the dollar compared to men; and

WHEREAS, The wage gap is even greater for most women of color; Black women earn 63 cents on the dollar, Native American women earn 60 cents on the dollar, and Latina women earn 55 cents on the dollar; and

WHEREAS, By comparison, in 2020, women earned no more than 80 cents on the dollar; women in Illinois earned 79 cents on the dollar; Black women earned 61 cents on the dollar; Latina women earned 53 cents on the dollar; women did not receive equal pay for 12 months of work in 2019 until March 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, The pay gap has been shown to start as soon as one year after college; this inequality affects not only women but also their families and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, The pay gap between women and men has long-term effects on women's economic security; such a gap affects women's Social Security earnings, their ability to save for retirement, and their children's education; and

WHEREAS, Pay equity is closely linked to the eradication of poverty and is essential to having a highly-motivated workforce; and

WHEREAS, Equal Pay Day was originated by the National Committee on Pay Equity in 1996 as a public awareness event to illustrate the gap between men's and women's wages; the day symbolizes how far into the year a woman must work, on average, to earn as much as a man earned the previous year, with Tuesday being the day in which women's wages catch up to men's wages from the previous week; because women earn less on average than men, they must work longer for the same amount of pay; this wage gap is even greater for most women of color; although Equal Pay Day represents all women, Black Women's Equal Pay Day is August 3, 2021, Native American Women's Equal Pay Day is September 8, 2021, and Latina Equal Pay Day is October 21, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Equal pay is a priority for all women and for our society at large; therefore, be it

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 223

Offered by Representative West:

WHEREAS, The United States faces a student debt crisis with Americans owing more than \$1.7 trillion in student loans, which is more than a 100 percent increase over the last decade; and

WHEREAS, For-profit borrowers default at twice the rate of public two-year borrowers; and

WHEREAS, For-profit colleges serve less than 8 percent of Illinois students yet account for 1.7 times more in defaulted loan amounts than all other Illinois public and private institutions combined; and

WHEREAS, 74 of the 78 Illinois programs considered failing or near-failing, based on graduate debt-to-earning ratios, are at for-profit colleges; and

WHEREAS, Students of for-profit colleges often have lower graduation rates, have lower post-graduation earning potentials, and can face challenges in transferring credits to other institutions; and

WHEREAS, 99 percent of students' fraud claims concern for-profit colleges; and

WHEREAS, For-profit college executives are duty bound to act in the interest of ownership; and

WHEREAS, In fiscal year 2019, 3,000 Monetary Award Program (MAP) grants were used at for-profit colleges in Illinois; however, the same appropriation could have funded not only these students' education at community college but an additional 5,600 students as well; and

WHEREAS, The goal of MAP is to provide grant assistance to eligible Illinois students demonstrating financial need to help make college more affordable, and the average cost of higher education at Illinois' for-profit colleges is nearly twice as much compared to public universities for Illinois' lowest-income students; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge prospective Illinois students to attend public and nonprofit colleges and universities so that they can experience manageable debts, greater career earnings, and stronger returns on their investment in a higher education; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the General Assembly to use taxpayer funding to support high-quality student-centered higher education instead of subsidize profits for private companies.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 226

Offered by Representative Sosnowski:

WHEREAS, The Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES) is directed by State law (20 ILCS 1005/1005-45) to help the prosperity of Illinois' laboring men and women; and

WHEREAS, IDES is directed by State law (20 ILCS 1005/1005-100) to operate a statewide network of public employment offices; and

WHEREAS, IDES has traditionally operated public employment offices throughout Illinois, where job-challenged Illinois residents can go for immediate and direct assistance; and

WHEREAS, These IDES public-access public employment offices closed down "temporarily" in March 2020, due to the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic and, as of March 2021, have remained closed; and

WHEREAS, Due to the same pandemic, the need of the people of Illinois for IDES advice and counsel has sharply increased; at calendar year 2020 year-end in December 2020, Illinois nonfarm payroll employers reported employing 419,100 fewer people than in the previous year; and

WHEREAS, These numbers have generated a statewide unemployment rate of 7.6% in December 2020, with more than 468,300 Illinois residents estimated to be unemployed and actively searching for work and additional tens of thousands of Illinois residents having dropped out of the labor force in despair; and

WHEREAS, This six-figure total of Illinois individuals includes men and women who need help filing for unemployment insurance benefits, request counsel in searching for new employment, or require additional and further assistance for a wide variety of pandemic-related unemployment problems; and

WHEREAS, Under current IDES policies, there are no physical locations that these people can visit to get this help; and

WHEREAS, People with standardized problems are expected to interact with a computer robot, the "IDES assistant", on the IDES site, but not everyone has access to a computer and, furthermore, constituents state that the webpage robot puts people into a spiderweb and does not answer their questions; and

WHEREAS, People with additional questions and requests for assistance are supposed to call a IDES hotline phone number, (800) 244-5631, but our constituents report that the hotline, when used by Illinois residents who need help, generates a cold, automated response; persons who call into the hotline with a problem are told to deposit their names, phone numbers, and identifying information on a segment of electronic recording and to wait for a response; and

WHEREAS, In a report broadcast on Chicago's WBBM-TV/Channel 2 on Monday, March 8, IDES reported that as of the most recent reporting period 155,765 calls from Illinois residents were sitting in its callback queue and they had not yet called back any of the names on this lengthy list; and

WHEREAS, At the current rate of callbacks, persons who left their names and phone numbers in IDES' callback queue cannot expect to get a return call until more than one month has passed since depositing a request for assistance, including many urgent requests for immediate help; and

WHEREAS, In an Illinois House public hearing carried by video technology under conditions of pandemic social distancing held on Thursday, March 4, senior officials of IDES confessed to House members that their employees have not been able to respond to Illinois public requests and pleas in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, Many of the problems represented by these 155,765 unanswered phone calls are complex problems requiring an Illinois resident to find and submit one or more pieces of information written on a legal form, one or more coded passwords, one or more pieces of personal secure identifying information (such as a Social Security number), or some combination of these elements; and

WHEREAS, When problems like these are addressed over an audio link, more than one phone call is often required to deal with these requests for assistance, leading to a significant number of currently open IDES case files and unresolved issues; and

WHEREAS, Other Illinois State agencies also do work for which face-to-face interactions are desirable or necessary and, recognizing this, have taken steps to partially reopen their offices under pandemic conditions of social distancing; examples include the Department of Driver Services within the Office of the Illinois Secretary of State and the Family Community Resource Centers operated by the Illinois Department of Public Aid; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that recognizing the unique circumstances of the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic, we call upon the Illinois Department of Employment Security to immediately reopen their public-access public employment offices to provide face-to-face help to Illinois residents who urgently need assistance; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call upon all of the other departments of the State of Illinois to provide IDES with advice, technical assistance, and guidance on how to safely reopen public-access office spaces under current conditions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support the working people of Illinois, whether currently employed or not, including the working people of IDES; we recognize the stressful circumstances of operating a publicly accessible office in a time of pandemic; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor JB Pritzker and IDES Acting Director Kristin Richards.

WHEREAS, It is highly fitting that the Illinois General Assembly pays honor and respect to the truly great individuals who have served our country and, in doing so, have gone above and beyond the call of duty to make the ultimate sacrifice for our nation; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Brandon Jacob Rowe was killed in action during the War in Iraq near the city of Al Hillah on March 31, 2003; he was a member of the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) of the United States Army and was based at Fort Campbell, Kentucky; he was the first Infantryman of the 101st to be killed in combat in Operation Iraqi Freedom and the first from the Northern Illinois Area to be killed in that war; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Rowe was a machine gun (SAW) operator in his infantry unit that was assigned to a tank unit to provide cover; their combined mission was to perform a "feint" to draw attention from the main attacking force; unfortunately, they came into an ambush situation and were completely surrounded; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Rowe's death was the catalyst that led the leader of his unit to get the men to safety, off of their assigned tanks, and to find cover; against great odds, the unit continued to fight for eight hours that day, in spite of the fact that information had been offered that there would be little resistance by the Republican Guard Soldiers; no other lives were lost in the battle, making the mission a success; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Rowe was posthumously awarded many medals, including the Bronze Star Medal, the Purple Heart Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism Medal; he earned many other awards and recognitions throughout his military career; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Rowe was born in Rockford on April 14, 1982; he graduated from Hononegah High School in 2000; during high school, he worked at DiGiovanni's Restaurant and Highlander Supermarket in Roscoe; he attended Rock Valley College before enlisting in the United States Army in 2001; he planned to continue studying computers after his military service; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Rowe is survived by his paternal grandmother, Tennessee Sanders; his mother, Wendy Borowski; his stepfather, Rick Borowski; his father, Milton Rowe; his stepmother, Debbie Rowe; his sister, Leah (Doug) Yates; his brothers, Brent and Kevin Rowe; his stepsisters, Heidi and Heather Schultz; his nephews, Devon Yates and Jake and Aiden Rowe; and his niece, Grace Yates; therefore, be it
