**HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

## HOUSE RESOLUTION 316

Offered by Representative Welter:

WHEREAS, Edward Aldrich, a Morris resident, joined the United States Army in 1968 with the plan of becoming a military police officer and starting a career in law enforcement after his service; and

WHEREAS, After spending time serving state side, Specialist Edward Aldrich received an order in 1969 to go to Vietnam where he where he was assigned to Company B, 720th Military Police Battalion; and

WHEREAS, B Company, known as the Bushwackers, were comprised of three Ambush and Reconnaissance Platoons and one Patrol Boat Riverine (PBR) Platoon; and

WHEREAS, During his time with the Bushwackers, Specialist Edward Aldrich was assigned as a rifleman to the 2nd Ambush & Reconnaissance Platoon from July of 1969 through November of 1969; from December of 1969 through July of 1970, he was assigned to the PBR Platoon as a Senior Boston Whaler Operators; and

WHEREAS, The Reconnaissance and Ambush Platoons were directed to seek out and destroy any Vietcong or Northern Vietnamese Army Units pertaining to a 22 square mile Tactical Area of Responsibility in and around the Long Binh and Bien Hoa area of South Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, The Boston Whaler Operators piloted small armed gun boats primarily used to transport Ambush Personnel to and from embarkation and debarkation points along the Song Dong Nai River; and

WHEREAS, The Bushwackers were originally trained to be policemen but were assigned to fulfill infantry tactical operations; they were the first line of defense protecting Long Binh Post, which was the largest military base in South Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, The protection of the Long Binh Post required the Bushwackers to perform ambushes as well as recon and patrol missions that lasted up to 12 days in awful terrain and poor weather conditions; and

WHEREAS, Just like the infantry units, the Bushwackers were responsible for calling in their own air strikes and support as well as any artillery; and

WHEREAS, These heroes may not have been classified as infantry, but they did the same jobs and have earned the acknowledgment of the United States Army; and

WHEREAS, Specialist Edward Aldrich feels that he and those with whom he served have earned the Combat Infantry Badge, which the United States Army continues to deny; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the federal government to recognize Specialist Edward Aldrich and all the members of Company B, 720th Military Police, the Bushwackers, with the Combat Infantry Badge for their service and sacrifice to our country during the Vietnam War; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Specialist Edward Aldrich as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

## HOUSE RESOLUTION 318

Offered by Representative Mah:

WHEREAS, Illinois is home to a large immigrant community that has contributed tremendously to our State; in 2018, 1.8 million immigrants comprised 14 percent of the population of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Throughout the last year, the immigrant community has been on the front lines in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic, including, but not limited to, making up a large portion of the essential workforce as the country and the State went into a lockdown; and

WHEREAS, Nearly six million essential immigrant workers in the United States are uncertain about their future ability to reside in the country; some individuals are employed as U.S. temporary workers, while others have a protected status, and still others do not have documentation of lawful immigration status; and

WHEREAS, A large population of undocumented immigrants has lived in the U.S. for more than a decade and are caregivers for children who are U.S. citizens; in 2017, approximately 5.9 million children who are U.S. citizens had at least one caregiver who did not have legal status in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, One in seven State residents is an immigrant, more than one in six workers is an immigrant, and close to one-third of all business owners in the Chicago metro area are immigrants; and

WHEREAS, The immigrant community has contributed significantly to Illinois in many ways, including the community's contribution to the State's economy; in 2018, immigrant-led households in the State paid \$12.7 billion in federal taxes and \$7.7 billion in state and local taxes; 137,907 immigrant business owners accounted for 23 percent of all self-employed residents and generated \$2.8 billion in business income; and

WHEREAS, The effects of immigration enforcement actions are felt by the individual, their family, and the larger community; it is undisputed that the separation of a child from a parent due to immigration enforcement action is associated with economic hardship, housing instability, and food insecurity; in addition, following an immigration enforcement action against a family member, children have demonstrated numerous emotional and behavioral challenges, even if the children are reunited with the family member at a later point; and

WHEREAS, Historically, U.S. policies have deeply impacted the stability, economic conditions, and violence in countries from which many immigrants originally migrated to build a home in this country and this State; and

WHEREAS, The immigrant community and its allies have continuously fought to advance human rights and protections for individuals living in the U.S. who live in constant fear of law enforcement and cruel immigration enforcement actions; and

WHEREAS, It has been decades since the enactment of any major reform to our nation's immigration laws; this inertia has deeply impacted immigrant communities, as demonstrated by the continuous harsh ICE enforcement actions and separation of families; in 2019 for example, ICE carried out 226,000 deportations; and

WHEREAS, Congress has debated numerous immigration reforms over the last two decades without great success, which has led the courts and the executive branch to take some temporary measures to address certain aspects of this nation's immigration law; and

WHEREAS, There is significant public support for the reformation of our country's immigration laws and the advancement of immigrant rights in the U.S. and Illinois; 81 percent of Americans support a path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants; and

WHEREAS, There are currently several bills before Congress that will help advance the rights and protections for the immigrant community in the United States, including HR1435 American Right to Family Act, HR536 New Way Forward Act, HR1537 Farmworker Modernization Act of 2021, HR6 Dream & Promise Act, HR161 Venezuelan TPS Act of 2021, HR530 REUNITE Act, HR1177 U.S. Citizenship Act, S264 DREAM Act of 2021, and S291 National Office of New Americans Act; and

WHEREAS, These bills currently before Congress present an opportunity for our nation to take the necessary action to move our country forward and recognize the human rights of the immigrant community in our country and State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the U.S. Congress to take action in passing the necessary legislation to advance the human rights and protections of the immigrant community in the United States; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the U.S. Senate Majority Leader, the U.S. Senate Minority Leader, the U.S. Speaker of the House, the U.S. House of Representatives Minority Leader, and all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation.

WHEREAS, On May 10, 2021, the House Judiciary-Civil Committee held a subject matter hearing on the Amended Petition for Attorney's Fees and Costs pursuant to House Rule 88(g); and

WHEREAS, On May 12, 2021, House Judiciary-Civil Committee received a supplemental declaration from Miller Shakman Levine & Feldman LLP, which has been duly considered as part of the record in ascertaining what fees and expenses are proper under the terms of engagement, consistent with work performed, and for the purpose of ascertaining what fees and expenses are reasonable, just, and proper under the circumstances; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the House does approve and adopt the recommendation of the House Judiciary-Civil Committee that reimbursement of attorney's fees and expenses for the sum of, and not to exceed, \$25,246 in this matter are reasonable, just, and proper; and be it further

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 48

Offered by Representative Welch:

WHEREAS, Esteemed American architect Daniel Burnham envisioned the City of Chicago's future in the 1909 Plan Of Chicago with transportation, green space, and civic facility projects to beautify, connect, and harmonize the city center to the surrounding neighborhoods and specifically identified Congress Street as the "grand axis" to the west; and

WHEREAS, The Burnham plan, sponsored by the Commercial Club of Chicago, influenced how the city developed and set a standard for modern urban planning at a time of tremendous growth for Chicago, the State of Illinois, and the nation; and

WHEREAS, Chicago's growth, as then America's second city and a major industrial and business leader at the center of the nation with a growing and diverse population, ultimately resulted in the Chicago City Council approval of plans for a comprehensive superhighway system in 1940, to include and begin with the Westside route or Congress Expressway; and

WHEREAS, The construction of the individual sections of the Congress Expressway were completed between 1954 and 1960, with Mannheim Road to Racine Avenue being one of the oldest sections of the region's highway infrastructure and the only expressway to run under a U.S. Post Office and incorporate both a movable bridge over the Chicago River and a rapid transit line within the same corridor; and

WHEREAS, In 1964, the Chicago City Council renamed the Congress Expressway after former President Dwight D. Eisenhower, honoring his public service as well as his vision in proposing the interstate highway system in 1955; the roadway would later be nicknamed "the Ike" or I-290 to designate federal interstate 290; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower Expressway was an engineering and transportation achievement, but construction displaced Chicago's Near West Side neighborhoods, including Greektown and Little Italy, and, to the west, profoundly altered a Jewish neighborhood in West Garfield Park, which had been nicknamed

the Jewish West Side, the Austin neighborhood of Chicago, the Village of Oak Park, and the Village of Forest Park, where 3,500 graves had to be relocated from the Forest Home and Concordia cemeteries; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower Expressway construction led to the departure of 13,000 families and 400 businesses from Chicago alone and the removal of over 100 buildings in Oak Park, where over time the below grade stretch of highway derisively became known as "the Ditch"; the displacement of neighborhoods in Chicago contributed to an eventual demographic shift in the percentage of African-American families concentrated in impacted areas; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower Expressway remains the western gateway to Chicago from the western suburbs and a primary link to O'Hare airport and the regional transportation network and still includes the vital assets of the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) Blue Line, as well as freight railroad lines; Chicago and the regional transportation networks centered therein remain a transportation hub of the nation to this day; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower Expressway, which is now more than 60 years old, was originally designed to handle 40,000 vehicles per day and now carries over 200,000 vehicles per day; it was ranked as the most congested highway in the United States in the INRIX 2020 Global Traffic Scorecard, and the average weekday ridership on the CTA Blue Line branch that spans the Eisenhower corridor increased by 8 percent between 2009 and 2019, from 26,496 to 28,543; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower Expressway reconstruction and modernization is a priority in the region's long-range transportation plan; in 2017, the Federal Highway Administration signed a Final Environmental Impact Statement and a Record of Decision; the CTA Blue Line and stations need modernization and repair and could explore further extension to accommodate growth in communities farther west; I-290 and CTA improvement and reconstruction costs are expected to exceed \$4 billion; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower and CTA Blue Line reconstruction and improvements are, and should be, planned, designed, constructed, and managed as a multimodal, intermodal corridor, maximizing transportation assets, enhancing equity, connectivity, access, and opportunity for residents, commuters, and marginalized populations and protecting the safety of all users; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower and CTA Blue Line projects are an opportunity to reconnect communities and repair racial inequities and displacement caused by historic construction that emphasized transportation efficiencies without attention to racial equity, livability, community enhancement, and preservation; and

WHEREAS, The Eisenhower and CTA Blue Line reconstruction is an opportunity to expand open space and sustainable multimodal connectivity to develop alternative individual and mass transportation options, such as dedicated pedestrian and bike lanes designed to be interconnected but separated from vehicle lanes and rapid bus transit and the use of bridge decking and innovative technologies; and

WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the State of Illinois to prioritize the planning, design, and reconstruction of the federal interstate I-290 Eisenhower Expressway and CTA Blue Line and obtain financial and technical assistance and partnership from the Illinois Congressional Delegation and the U.S. Department of Transportation; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Interstate 290 Corridor is a project of state, regional, and national significance that will improve multimodal transportation and connectivity and promote economic development; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the goals of reconstructing the Interstate 290 Corridor should include enhancements to racial equity, promotion of open space, community enhancement, and sustainable and innovative practices; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we formally request that the U.S. Department of Transportation provide sufficient resources to the Illinois Department of Transportation to begin engineering and advance this project expeditiously; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the U.S. Secretary of Transportation and all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation.
