HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 331

Offered by Representative Davidsmeyer:

WHEREAS, The natural gas, oil, and fuels industries contribute significantly to jobs in Illinois communities and to state-of-the-art emissions reductions technologies; and

WHEREAS, The natural gas, oil, and fuels industries support nearly 11 million jobs across the country, power the nation's economy, and generate billions in revenue for the federal government and state governments in rent, royalties, and corporate and income tax payments, including \$14 billion for state treasuries through severance taxes in 2019 alone; and

WHEREAS, The natural gas, oil, and fuels industries support more than 243,600 jobs in Illinois, which account for more than \$14.9 billion in income; and

WHEREAS, The natural gas, oil, and fuels industries contribute \$33.3 billion to the economy of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The natural gas, oil, and fuels industries contributed \$93.4 billion in revenues directly to support the areas where the oil is produced in 11 years, and Illinois relied on those payments to fund schools, infrastructure, and other critical social services; and

WHEREAS, Direct industry jobs pay seven times the federal minimum wage and 70 percent higher than the national average; and

WHEREAS, Every direct job in the natural gas, oil, and fuels industries support an additional 2.7 jobs in affiliated industries, including lodging and restaurants within proximity of these industries' operations; and

WHEREAS, The investments made by the natural gas, oil, and fuels industries have led to a 15 percent decrease in household energy costs in this country over the last decade, while costs for food, education, and healthcare have skyrocketed; and

WHEREAS, Those cheaper energy costs are crucial to working families in our communities and across the country; and

WHEREAS, The natural gas, oil, and fuels industries should not be prevented from recovering costs that other industries are eligible to recover simply because they operate in a different economic sector; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. tax code allows industries across the manufacturing sector to recover costs related to job creation and other operational investments; and

WHEREAS, These common tax mechanisms allow these industries to create jobs, invest in our communities, deliver the energy that working families rely on every day, and fund critical education, infrastructure, and social service programs; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we oppose singling out the natural gas, oil, and fuels industries by disproportionately increasing the tax burden on them and on the constituents from the districts we represent; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be delivered to all members of President Biden's Cabinet and all members of the Capitol Press Corps.
