Mr. Speaker -- I am directed to inform the House of Representatives that the Senate has accepted the Governor's specific recommendations for change, which are attached, to a bill of the following title, the acceptance of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the House, to-wit:

A bill for AN ACT concerning State government.

To the Honorable Members of the Illinois Senate
The 102nd General Assembly

Today, I return Senate Bill 539, a bill amending the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act, with specific recommendations to correct one technical drafting error.

I am pleased by progress made by my partners in the General Assembly in their efforts to pass meaningful ethics reform, and I support the steps taken in this bill.

In the changes made to 5 ILCS 430/20-20(1), however, language was inadvertently added that confuses and interferes with the existing processes of the Executive Inspectors General (EIGs) in an unintended way. For example, the changes included in Senate Bill 539 include a reference to proceeding "without advance approval of the Executive Ethics Commission" to investigate allegations of wrongful conduct within his or her jurisdiction. However, advance approval of the Executive Ethics Commission has never been required. The addition of this language inadvertently confuses the clear authority that the EIGs have under current law.

Therefore, pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(e) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return Senate Bill 539, entitled, "An ACT concerning State Government," with the following specific recommendations for change: Beginning on page 43, line 16 and continuing through page 44, line 4, delete the changes made in SB 539 and restore the language of the existing law so that it reads as follows:

(1) To receive and investigate allegations of violations of this Act. An investigation may not be initiated more than one year after the most recent act of the alleged violation or of a series of alleged violations except where there is reasonable cause to believe that fraudulent concealment has occurred.

With this change to restore the original language of 5 ILCS 430/20-20 (1), Senate Bill 539 will have my approval.

Today, I return Senate Bill 967 with specific recommendations to correct one technical error in an effective date.

I commend and celebrate advocates and my partners in the General Assembly for their efforts in passing Senate Bill 967, a bill that ensures Illinois continues to be a leader in our efforts to erode racial disparities in healthcare coverage and access for women and babies. Senate Bill 967 allows the state to expand its maternal and child health programs to serve pregnant and postpartum individuals determined high-risk.

However, in the changes to 305 ILCS 5/5-5, Senate Bill 967 inadvertently includes an incorrect effective date that conflicts with the implementation timeline.

Therefore, pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(e) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return Senate Bill 967, entitled, "An ACT concerning Health," with the following specific recommendations for change:

On page 69, line 26, delete "on July 1, 2022" and insert in lieu thereof "no later than December 1, 2022".

With this change, Senate Bill 967 will have my approval.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Motion submitted previously, Representative Greenwood moved that the House concur with the Senate in the acceptance of the Governor's Specific Recommendations for Change to SENATE BILL 967.

And on that motion, a vote was taken resulting as follows:

109, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 7)

The Motion, having received the votes of three-fifths of the Members elected, prevailed and the House concurred with the Senate in the adoption of the Governor's Specific Recommendations for Change.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

SENATE BILL 2065. Having been read by title a second time on May 26, 2021, and held on the order of Second Reading, the same was again taken up.

Floor Amendments numbered 1 and 2 remained in the Committee on Revenue & Finance.

Representative Hoffman offered Amendment No. 3 and moved its adoption.

The foregoing motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted.

There being no further amendment(s), the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

SENATE BILLS ON THIRD READING

The following bills and any amendments adopted thereto were reproduced. Any amendments still pending upon the passage or defeat of a bill on Third Reading are automatically tabled pursuant to Rule 40(a).

On motion of Representative Hoffman, SENATE BILL 2065 was taken up and read by title a third time.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 109, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 8)

This bill, as amended, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence in the House amendment/s adopted.

ACTION ON VETO MOTIONS

Pursuant to the Motion submitted previously, Representative Burke moved that the House concur with the Senate in the acceptance of the Governor's Specific Recommendations for Change to SENATE BILL 539, by adoption of the following Amendatory Veto Motion amendment 1.

And on that motion, a vote was taken resulting as follows:

59, Yeas; 35, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 9)

Having failed to receive the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, the motion was declared lost.

And the House refused to concur with the Senate in the adoption of the Governor's Specific Recommendations for Change.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate.
