# HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

# HOUSE RESOLUTION 320

Offered by Representative Ortiz:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives recognize that food waste production in Illinois is high; the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency reports that 19 million tons of waste is landfilled in Illinois every year, and of that, food waste accounts for as much as 20%, which is more than any other single waste stream found in landfills across the State; and

WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic intensified food insecurity, and the State now faces unprecedented levels of hunger; Feeding America reports that, in Illinois, approximately 1,201,290 people are facing hunger, of which 315,330 are children; the average cost of a meal in Illinois is \$3.58, while the State's minimum wage is currently \$13 per hour; the rise in the cost of living due to inflation means that families have to depend on community-based and mutual aid organizations to fill gaps in nourishment to sustain themselves daily; and

WHEREAS, The increasing number of grocery store closures across the State of Illinois have exacerbated food insecurity; in November 2022, a Whole Foods in Chicago's Englewood neighborhood closed its doors just 6 years after opening; similarly, two Aldi locations in Chicago closed their doors abruptly, claiming crime and theft as reasons for closing; these sudden closures create food deserts in communities already facing limited resources, forcing residents to travel longer distances to visit a grocery store; and

WHEREAS, The demand for food exceeds the available supply in high-need, low-income communities; the Greater Chicago Food Depository provided 77.3 million meals in 2022, a 25% increase compared to pre-pandemic times; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has no existing framework to deal with food waste production fit for human consumption to alleviate food insecurity; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the State of Illinois to develop policies to reduce food waste and address increasing food insecurity.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 325

Offered by Representative Cassidy:

WHEREAS, The Rights of Crime Victims and Witnesses Act guarantees to crime victims the rights assured by Article I, Section 8.1 of the Illinois Constitution to ensure that crime victims are treated with fairness and respect for their dignity and privacy throughout the criminal justice system, to ensure that crime victims are informed of their rights and have standing to assert their rights in the trial and appellate courts, to establish procedures for enforcement of those rights, and to increase the effectiveness of the criminal justice system by affording certain basic rights and considerations to the witnesses of crime who are essential to prosecution; and

WHEREAS, The Rights of Crime Victims and Witnesses Act guarantees to all crime victims timely notification of all court proceedings; and

WHEREAS, The retail loss prevention report and notice requirements created by Public Act 103-757, the Illinois Integrity, Notification, and Fairness in Online Retail Marketplaces for Consumers Act, granted non-human victims greater rights than human victims, including the right to seven days' notice of any court proceedings; and

WHEREAS, State's attorneys and victim advocates work diligently, sometimes with insufficient resources, to accomplish the difficult task of effectuating communication with all victims as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, The judiciary works diligently to dispose of all cases in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, Cuts to federal Victim of Crime Act funding and requirements created by the SAFE-T Act have placed additional pressures on the judiciary, law enforcement, state's attorneys, and victim advocates; and

WHEREAS, It is impracticable to impose a daily timeframe upon state's attorneys to complete notice in every case; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize that human victims deserve equal rights to non-human victims regarding the timely notice of proceedings; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge members of the judiciary and law enforcement to prioritize human victims within daily court dockets over corporate/business entities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to all suitable members of the judiciary.
