WHEREAS, In February of 2002, the Pentagon allowed the Committee's charter to expire and replaced its members and changed its agenda; and

WHEREAS, The United States of America requires the strongest of military forces; and

WHEREAS, A substantial number of military personnel presently serving in the United States armed forces all over the world are female; and

WHEREAS, A substantial number of military cadets presently enrolled at the various military academies around the nation are female; therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL

ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we request that the United States Congress thoroughly and completely investigate allegations of sexual harassment and sexual assault in all branches of the military and all military academies, especially the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the we request that the charter for the panel known as the Defense Department Advisory Committee on Women in the Services be once again renewed; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we request that the Committee, as part of its mission, be once again empowered with the right and responsibility to advise the United States military of sexual harassment and assault; and be it further

RESEOLVED, That copies of this resolution be forwarded to President George W. Bush, Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces of the United States of America; Vice President Richard B. Cheney, President of the Senate; Representative J. Dennis Hastert, Speaker of the House of Representatives; Donald Rumsfeld, Secretary of Defense; and each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 115
