WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives would like to honor all those who risk their lives daily for the betterment of the people of this State; and

HOUSE RESOLUTION 128

Offered by Representative Watson:

WHEREAS, The United States supports the right to freedom, economic prosperity, and good health for all peoples in all corners of the globe; and

WHEREAS, The United States is also willing to come to the aid of nations in need of assistance when establishing a democratic government and free market economy, the cornerstones of any nation seeking to provide its people, freedom, economic prosperity, and good health; and

WHEREAS, The 23 million citizens of the island of Taiwan are proof that, with just a bit of encouragement from allies, the will, determination, and commitment of a proud people is all that is needed to foster democracy, freedom, economic prosperity, and good health; and

WHEREAS, With 56 years of democratic governance pursuant to constitutional rule, the world is impressed with the strides the people of Taiwan have made in the area of public health by controlling acute infectious diseases and eliminating malaria, improving children's and women's health, establishing a complete health and medical network, setting up an emergency medical system, and implementing a national health insurance program; and

WHEREAS, The people of Taiwan have also made equally impressive strides in the area of economics by sustaining a growing economy which had a Gross National Product of \$313.9 billion in 2000, by being the eighth largest market worldwide for United States' exports, totaling \$18.2 billion in 2001, and with Taiwanese companies investing \$1.1 billion in the United States in 2001; and

WHEREAS, The people of Taiwan do not wish to rest on their public health and economic laurels but

wish to further improve their own economy and health care system, in addition to striving to improve the economies and health care systems of the other nations of the world, a sign of good will and peace which is indicative of all democratic nations of the world; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan can reach these goals should it have the opportunity to participate as an observer in the World Health Organization, which is dedicated to the fundamental right of every human being to enjoy the highest attainable standard of health possible, and should it have the opportunity to enter into a free trade agreement with the United States; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Illinois House of Representatives joins the United States Government and the governments of the world in support of granting Taiwan observer status in the World Health Organization so that it may further improve the health care that is provided to its citizens and so that Taiwan may more formally share the knowledge and improvements it has made to its own health care system with the nations and peoples of the world; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois House of Representatives encourages the Taiwanese and the United States Government to establish a Taiwan-U.S. Free Trade Agreement (TUFTA) which will only serve to improve an already strong and mutually profitable economic relationship between both Taiwan and the United States, which will benefit Taiwan's consumers, security, and democracy, and which will serve America's broader interests in the Asia-Pacific region; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be furnished to President George W. Bush, the Illinois delegation of the United States Congress, and to President Chen Shui-bian on behalf of the 23 million citizens of Taiwan, friends of the citizens of the State of Illinois and of the United States.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 26

WHEREAS, Indigency has been a persistent social problem throughout history and has reached an intolerable level throughout our country; and

WHEREAS, People in urban, suburban, and rural areas of Illinois experience indigency, proving that it is not just a big city problem; and

WHEREAS, Each year sees an increase in the number of deaths among those who lack funds to provide the barest essentials of life; and

WHEREAS, Bitter cold winters and extremely hot summers have cost the lives of those individuals who simply could not afford heating or air coolants and died from exposure; and

WHEREAS, In remembering those who have died, we must reach out to help those in need; the extent to which our society can counter the effects of indigency is a good measure of its humaneness; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we proclaim Wednesday May 28, 2003, as "We Remember, We Care for Indigent Persons Day in Illinois", and that we urge all citizens to observe, inform themselves of, and support efforts to care for the indigent; and be it further
