Notice of Proposed Short Term Borrowing

To: Clerk, Illinois House of Representatives
Secretary, Illinois Senate
Secretary of State of Illinois

Please take notice as follows:

Whereas:

Actual revenues to the General Revenue Fund in fiscal year 2002 were less than the projected revenues in the adopted budget by \$1.621 billion for the same fiscal period. In addition, actual revenues to the General Revenue Fund in fiscal year 2003 are estimated as of the time of this notice to be less than the projected revenues in the adopted budget for fiscal year 2003 by \$1.2 billion. The combined revenue deficiencies for both fiscal years of approximately \$2.8 billion has contributed to a balance of unpaid obligations in the amount of approximately \$1.913 billion as of the end of March 2003.

Therefore:

1. It is proposed that the State borrow, through a short-term borrowing, a principal amount not to exceed \$1.5 billion. The proceeds of the borrowing would be applied to the purposes for which amounts were appropriated in the General Revenue Fund and other funds for this fiscal year, and payment of interest on the borrowing. The amount of the borrowing would not exceed 15% of the total State appropriations for Fiscal year 2003. The borrowing is to be paid back within one year of its issuance. The borrowing will be made pursuant to the provisions of the Short Term Borrowing Act, 30 ILCS 340/0.01 *et seq.*, and their Notice given pursuant to its terms.
2. I have taken and recommend continuing the following corrective measures, among others, to restore the State's fiscal soundness.
 - a) restrain growth in State spending in all funds, especially the General Revenue Fund;
 - b) achieve operating economics, including be agency consolidations and by eliminating duplicative and inefficient operations;
 - c) reduce the reliance upon current revenues for capital needs; and

- d) reduce spending requirements from the General Revenue Fund for pension purposed by issuing Pension Obligation Bonds and investing the proceeds in the State's five retirement systems.
