PROCLAMATION

04-197

WHEREAS, the Illinois Constitution requires the General Assembly to make appropriations for the expenditure of public funds for the fiscal year for State departments, authorities, and public agencies; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has not make appropriations for fiscal year 2005 for the expenditure of public funds for the Domestic Violence Shelters and Services Program within the Department of Human Services; and

WHEREAS, thousands of Illinois citizens throughout the State are victims of domestic violence every year; and

WHEREAS, the Domestic Violence Shelters and Services Program provides a safe haven and the most basic needs of food, clothing, and shelter for domestic violence victims throughout the State;

THEREFORE, pursuant to Article IV, Section 5 (b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby call and convene the 93rd General Assembly in a special session to commence on July 6, 2004, at 12:00 p.m., to consider any legislation (new or pending), which will address directly the budget of the Department of Human Services for the Domestic Violence Shelters and Services Program and fiscal year 2005.
