At the hour of 1:28 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 199

Offered by Representative Pihos:

WHEREAS, Diesel emissions have the potential to cause adverse health effects such as asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), allergies, and lung cancer; and

WHEREAS, There are few other sources of air pollution in our environment that are so widespread and toxic as diesel emissions; and

WHEREAS, Emissions from diesel vehicles can cause serious air pollution; and

WHEREAS, The United States Environmental Protection Agency, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, and the American Lung Association have shown that exposure to diesel exhaust increases the frequency of asthma attacks and other respiratory illness; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. EPA has found diesel exhaust to be a likely carcinogen; and

WHEREAS, A national estimate of cancer risk from diesel exhaust found that diesel exhaust is the number one air toxic cancer risk in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, The air inside a diesel-fueled school bus can be up to 15 times more polluted than the air outside the bus; and

WHEREAS, The vast majority, more than 80 percent, of school buses in Illinois are diesel-fueled; and

WHEREAS, Children spend, on average, an hour and half on school buses each day; and

WHEREAS, Asthma is the most common chronic illness in children and the leading cause of school absences; and

WHEREAS, Asthma has reached epidemic proportions in the United States, affecting an estimated 20 million people; and

WHEREAS, Nearly 300,000 children in the State of Illinois suffer from asthma; and

WHEREAS, Asthma is the leading cause of childhood hospitalizations in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 300 Illinois citizens died from asthma-related deaths in 2004; and

WHEREAS, This body recognizes that the health and well-being of each and every citizen of this State is important; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we proclaim May 3, 2005, as Illinois Clean Air and Asthma Awareness Day; and be it further

RESOLVED, That on Illinois Clean Air and Asthma Awareness Day, awareness will be made that school bus idling is a major cause of diesel exhaust pollution in school zones; and be it further

RESOLVED, That efforts should be made to reduce school bus idling on this day and every day to increase the health and well-being of all Illinois citizens, especially children.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 27

Offered by Representative Verschoore:

WHEREAS, The members of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois congratulate Rock Island's Alleman High School Pioneers boys wrestling, boys cross country and girls basketball teams on their successes; and

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS
FIRST READING**

Representative Gordon introduced the following:

**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 20**

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 11 to Article IX of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE IX
REVENUE

SECTION 11. HIGHWAY FUNDS

(a) No moneys derived from fees, excises, or license taxes relating to registration, titles, operation, or use of vehicles on public highways or relating to fuels used for propelling those vehicles, including bond proceeds, shall be expended for other than (i) costs of administering those laws; (ii) statutory refunds and adjustments provided in those laws; (iii) payment of highway obligations; (iv) costs for construction, reconstruction, maintenance, repair, and betterment of public highways, roads, streets, and bridges and other statutory highway purposes; (v) the State or local share to match federal aid highway funds; (vi) administrative costs of the Department of Transportation or any successor agency; (vii) expenses of grade separation of public highways and railroad crossings; (viii) protection of at-grade public highways and railroad crossings; (ix) expense of State enforcement of traffic laws; and (x) with respect to local governments, other transportation purposes as authorized by law.

(b) The total amount appropriated in any fiscal year for the sum of the cost of State enforcement of traffic laws plus the cost of collecting and administering fees, excises, and license taxes described in subsection (a) plus the cost of administering laws relating to motor vehicles shall not exceed 5% of the total amount of those fees, excises, and taxes collected by the State of Illinois in the most recent complete fiscal year.

(c) Federal funds may be spent for any purposes authorized by federal law.

SCHEDULE

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act.

The foregoing HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 20 was taken up, read in full a first time, ordered reproduced and placed in the Committee on Rules.
