### HOUSE BILL ON SECOND READING

HOUSE BILL 471. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Environmental Health, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 471 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Program Act is amended by changing Sections 5, 10, 20, and 25 and by adding Section 27 as follows:

(20 ILCS 689/5)

Sec. 5. Findings and State policy. The General Assembly recognizes that agriculture is a vital sector of the Illinois economy and that an important growth industry for the Illinois agricultural sector is renewable fuels production. Renewable fuels produced from Illinois agricultural products hold great potential for growing the State's economy, reducing our dependence on foreign oil supplies, and improving the environment by reducing harmful emissions from vehicles. Illinois is the nation's leading producer of ethanol, a clean, renewable fuel with significant environmental benefits. The General Assembly finds that reliable supplies of renewable fuels will be integral to the long term energy security of the United States. The General Assembly declares that it is the public policy of the State of Illinois to promote and encourage the production and use of renewable fuels as a means not only to improve air quality in the State and the nation, but also to increase the size of ~~grow~~ the agricultural sector of the Illinois economy. To achieve these public policy objectives, the General Assembly hereby authorizes the creation and implementation of the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Program within the Department.

(20 ILCS 689/10)

Sec. 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Biodiesel" means a renewable diesel fuel derived from biomass that is intended for use in diesel engines.

"Biodiesel blend" means a blend of biodiesel with petroleum-based diesel fuel in which the resultant product contains no less than 1% and no more than 99% biodiesel.

"Biomass" means non-fossil organic materials that have an intrinsic chemical energy content. "Biomass" includes, but is not limited to, soybean oil, other vegetable oils, and ethanol.

"Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity ~~Community Affairs~~.

"Diesel fuel" means any product intended for use or offered for sale as a fuel for engines in which the fuel is injected into the combustion chamber and ignited by pressure without electric spark.

"Director" means the Director of Commerce and Economic Opportunity ~~Community Affairs~~.

"Ethanol" means a product produced from agricultural commodities or by-products used as a fuel or to be blended with other fuels for use in motor vehicles.

"Flexible fuel vehicle" has the meaning set forth in Section 22 of the Alternate Fuels Act.

"Fuel" means fuel as defined in Section 1.19 of the Motor Fuel Tax Law.

"Gasohol" means motor fuel that is no more than 90% gasoline and at least 10% denatured ethanol that contains no more than 1.25% water by weight.

"Gasoline" means all products commonly or commercially known or sold as gasoline (including casing head and absorption or natural gasoline).

"Illinois agricultural product" means any agricultural commodity grown in Illinois that is used by a production facility to produce renewable fuel in Illinois, including, but not limited to, corn, barley, and soy beans.

"Labor Organization" means any organization defined as a "labor organization" under Section 2 of the National Labor Relations Act (29 U.S.C. 152).

"Majority blended ethanol fuel" means motor fuel that contains no less than 70% and no more than 90% denatured ethanol and no less than 10% and no more than 30% gasoline.

"Motor vehicles" means motor vehicles as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code and watercraft propelled by an internal combustion engine.

"Owner" means any individual, sole proprietorship, limited partnership, co-partnership, joint venture, corporation, cooperative, or other legal entity, including its agents, that operates or will operate a plant located within the State of Illinois.

"Plant" means a production facility that produces a renewable fuel. "Plant" includes land, any building or other improvement on or to land, and any personal properties deemed necessary or suitable for use, whether or not now in existence, in the processing of fuel from agricultural commodities or by-products.

"Renewable fuel" means ethanol, gasohol, majority blended ethanol fuel, biodiesel blend fuel, and biodiesel.

Sec. 20. Grants. Subject to appropriation from the Build Illinois Bond Fund, the Director is authorized to award Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Program grants to eligible applicants. The annual aggregate amount of grants awarded shall not exceed \$15,000,000.

Sec. 25. Project labor agreements.

(a) The Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Program project labor agreement must include the following:

- (1) provisions establishing the minimum hourly wage for each class of labor organization employee;
- (2) provisions establishing the benefits and other compensation for each class of labor organization employee; and
- (3) provisions establishing that no strike or disputes will be engaged in by the labor organization employees.

The owner of the plant and the labor organizations shall have the authority to include other terms and conditions as they deem necessary.

(b) The project labor agreement shall be filed with the Director in accordance with procedures established by the Department. At a minimum, the project labor agreement must provide the names, addresses, and occupations of the owner of the plant and the individuals representing the labor organization employees participating in the project labor agreement. The agreement must also specify the terms and conditions required in subsection (a).

Sec. 27. E85 Vehicle Encouragement Program.

(a) The Department shall, subject to appropriation, create and administer the E85 Vehicle Encouragement Program. Under this program, the Department must solicit and collect applications from persons who have purchased a flexible fuel vehicle within the 12-month period prior to submitting the application. Approved applicants shall be eligible for Program distributions.

(b) The Program shall distribute coupons for an amount up to \$1,000 towards the purchase of E85 blended fuel to approved applicants. The distribution may not exceed 10% of the purchase price of the vehicle. If any moneys in the Fund are carried over between fiscal years as a result of this 10% cap or for any other reason, the moneys shall be distributed in the following fiscal year as provided under this Section. Only one distribution shall be made to the owner of any vehicle during the life of that vehicle. Approved applicants who do not have an E85 fueling station within 25 miles of their residence may either apply for the coupons for E85 blended fuel as provided in this subsection (b) or request substitute coupons of the same value towards the purchase of 10% ethanol blended fuel.

(c) The E85 Vehicle Encouragement Fund is established as a special fund in the State treasury. Moneys in the Fund may be used, subject to appropriation, only for the purposes set forth in this Section. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund must be deposited into the Fund. The Department may retain 5% of the moneys in the Fund for administrative costs of the Program.

(c) The Department shall have access to Secretary of State motor vehicle registration records and other State records to enable verification of these applications.

(e) The Department shall adopt necessary rules for the implementation of this Section, including rules for the solicitation, collection, and approval of applications and for the distribution and redemption of Program coupons.

Section 10. The State Finance Act is amended by adding Section 5.640 as follows:  
(30 ILCS 105/5.640 new)

Sec. 5.640. E85 Vehicle Encouragement Fund.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law."

(b) Nothing in this Section prohibits any unit of government from using a biodiesel blend containing more than 2 percent biodiesel.

(c) As used in this Section, a "bulk central fueling facility" means a non-commercial fueling facility whose primary purpose is the fueling of vehicles owned or operated by the State, a county or unit of local government, a school district, a community college or public college or university, or a mass transit agency.

(d) The Secretary of Transportation shall adopt rules for implementing this Section. Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law."

The testing required to be provided under this subsection is the rapid testing authorized under Section 5.5 of the AIDS Confidentiality Act."; and

on page 2, after line 17, by inserting the following:

"Section 20. Study. The Illinois HIV/AIDS Policy and Research Institute at Chicago State University shall conduct a study to determine whether there is a correlation between incarceration and HIV infection.

Section 25. HIV/AIDS Response Review Panel.

(a) The HIV/AIDS Response Review Panel is established within the Department of Corrections. The Panel shall consist of the following members:

(1) One member appointed by the Governor. This member shall serve as the Chair of the Panel.

(2) One representative of each of the following, appointed by the head of the department: the Department of Corrections; the Department of Human Services; and the Department of Public Health.

(3) Two ex-offenders who are familiar with the issue of HIV/AIDS as it relates to incarceration, appointed by Governor. One of these members must be from Cook County, and the other must be from a county other than Cook. Both of these members must have received a final discharge from the Department of Corrections.

(4) Three representatives of HIV/AIDS organizations that have been in business for at least 2 years, appointed by Governor. In the case of such an organization that represents a constituency the majority of whom are African-American, the organization's representative who is a member of the Panel must be African-American.

(b) The Panel shall review the implementation of this Act within the Department of Corrections and shall file a report with the General Assembly and with the Governor every January 1 stating the results of its review."; and

on page 2, line 18, by changing "Section 20" to "Section 30"; and

on page 2, after line 28, by inserting the following:

"(c) The Department of Human Services, the Department of Public Health, the Department of Corrections, and the Department of Central Management Services shall adopt rules as necessary to ensure that this Act is implemented within 6 months after the effective date of this Act."; and

on page 13, line 2, after the period, by inserting the following: "An employee of the Department may not directly or indirectly disclose the HIV/AIDS status of a person committed to the Department, or any other information related to HIV/AIDS testing, medical care, counseling, or case management with respect to a person committed to the Department, to any other person unless authorized to do so by the person committed to the Department."; and

on page 18, line 3, after the period, by inserting the following: "The Department shall ensure that all such information and materials are culturally sensitive and reflect cultural diversity as appropriate.".

There being no further amendments, the bill was held on the order of Second Reading.

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

On motion of Representative Schock, HOUSE BILL 2421 was taken up and read by title a third time. Pending discussion, Representative Black moved the previous question. And the question being, "Shall the main question be now put?" it was decided in the affirmative. The question then being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 113, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.  
(ROLL CALL 550)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

On motion of Representative Jefferson, HOUSE BILL 2564 was taken up and read by title a third time. And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 113, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.  
(ROLL CALL 51)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

On motion of Representative Stephens, HOUSE BILL 2446 was taken up and read by title a third time.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 113, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.  
(ROLL CALL 52)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

On motion of Representative Jones, HOUSE BILL 2533 was taken up and read by title a third time. And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 84, Yeas; 29, Nays; 0, Answering Present.  
(ROLL CALL 53)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

### HOUSE BILL ON SECOND READING

HOUSE BILL 497. Having been recalled on March 3, 2005, and held on the order of Second Reading, the same was again taken up.

Representative Hannig offered the following amendment and moved its adoption.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 497 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Department of Veterans Affairs Act is amended by adding Section 4.5 as follows:

(20 ILCS 2805/4.5 new)

Sec. 4.5. Grants to veterans service organizations.

(a) Subject to appropriations for that purpose, the Department shall make grants to veterans service organizations for the purpose of furthering those organizations' work of providing assistance to veterans. The Department shall make grants only to veterans service organizations that maintain an office in the Veterans Affairs Regional Office (VARO) in Chicago. The Department shall apportion the grants equally between the qualifying veterans service organizations.

(b) To be eligible to receive a grant, a veterans service organization must have maintained a state headquarters in this State for at least 10 years before July 1, 2005. A veterans service organization that is being funded with State or county moneys under any other provision of law on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly may not receive any moneys for any grant under this Section.

(c) Grants made under this Section may not be used to replace or supplant services provided by employees of the Department."

Representative Scully moved the previous question.

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was again advanced to the order of Third Reading.

### RECALLS

At the request of the principal sponsor, Representative Washington, HOUSE BILL 2449 was recalled from the order of Third Reading to the order of Second Reading and held on that order.

At the request of the principal sponsor, Representative Poe, HOUSE BILL 3581 was recalled from the order of Third Reading to the order of Second Reading and held on that order.

### AGREED RESOLUTIONS

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS 222, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227 and 229 were taken up for consideration.

Representative Currie moved the adoption of the agreed resolutions.

The motion prevailed and the agreed resolutions were adopted.

At the hour of 7:09 o'clock p.m., Representative Currie moved that the House do now adjourn until Thursday, March 17, 2005, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., allowing perfunctory time for the Clerk.

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the month of March shall be known as March for Meals in honor of the citizens of the State of Illinois.

**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 29**

WHEREAS, The Department of Children and Family Services is charged with acting in the best interest of every child it serves, helping families by increasing their ability to provide a safe environment for their children, and strengthening families who are at risk of abuse or neglect; and

WHEREAS, A significant function of government is to promote the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly has taken notice of many issues surrounding the operations, funding, and execution of the foster care system that must be addressed to ensure continued action as well

as establish a higher standard for serving the needs of both foster children and parents; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Joint Task Force on Foster Care is created and shall be comprised of 8 members of the Illinois General Assembly appointed as follows: 2 members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 members of the Senate appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; all Joint Task Force members shall serve without compensation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the chairperson of the Joint Task Force shall be selected by the members from among its membership and the Joint Task Force shall meet at the call of the chairperson; and be it further

RESOLVED, That it is the duty of the Joint Task Force to undertake a comprehensive and thorough review of the operations of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services in relation to substitute care and related laws and rules impacting the Illinois foster care system, with the intent of making recommendations that would improve the system of Department and private agency accountability, improve Department functioning within the constraints of limited budgets, guarantee necessary medical and psychiatric care to wards within the Department, and increase foster parent support; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Children and Family Services is urged to provide assistance to and cooperate with the Joint Task Force, and the Joint Task Force shall request assistance from any other entity as necessary or useful for the performance of its duties; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint Task Force shall present a report to the General Assembly no later than December 15, 2005; a copy of the report shall be provided to the Director of the Department of Children and Family Services and the Governor within 2 weeks of the presentation of the report to the General Assembly.
