### **RESOLUTIONS**

Representative Currie offered the following Resolutions:

#### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 1 FOURTEENTH SPECIAL SESSION**

**RESOLVED**, that the Rules of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-Fifth General Assembly be adopted as the Rules of this Fourteenth Special Session, so far as the same may be applicable, and that the Committees of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-Fifth General Assembly, including the House Journal Review Committee and their membership, shall constitute the Committees of the House during this Fourteenth Special Session.

#### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 2 FOURTEENTH SPECIAL SESSION**

**RESOLVED**, that the Clerk inform the Senate that a majority of the House of Representatives has assembled, pursuant to the proclamation of the Governor, convening a Fourteenth Special Session of the General Assembly, and are now ready for the transaction of business.

The motion prevailed and House Resolutions 1 and 2 were adopted.

At the hour of 12:18 o'clock p.m., Representative Currie moved that the House do now adjourn until Wednesday, September 5, 2007, in perfunctory session.
