HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1042

Offered by Representative Verschoore:

WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States has pending before it the reauthorization of the Debbie Smith DNA backlog grant program, part of the Justice of All Act of 2004 (PL 108-405), at current or increased levels, thereby assisting in the reduction of DNA backlogs and improvement of the utilization of DNA in the criminal justice system in the State of Illinois and every state throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, DNA technology is increasingly vital to ensuring accuracy and fairness in the criminal justice system, but is not yet considered a routine tool for criminal identification by law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Over 50,000 law enforcement investigations have already been aided nationwide because of DNA matches made through the FBI's Combined DNA Index System (CODIS), bringing justice to victims and removing criminals from the streets; and

WHEREAS, The Innocence Project has used DNA in over 200 cases to exonerate persons who were wrongfully convicted of crimes; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois and other states throughout the nation have significantly expanded their DNA programs to include a growing number of convicted or arrested felons to match against unsolved crimes; and

WHEREAS, The demand for DNA testing in both violent and non-violent crimes has continued to increase as the reliability of this evidence is proven; and

WHEREAS, Many laboratories still maintain DNA backlogs of 6 months or longer and are unable to meet the growing demand for DNA testing despite funding commitments from state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, The Debbie Smith DNA backlog grant program has permitted state and local governments an opportunity to begin to maximize the full potential of forensic DNA through backlog reduction, but much work remains to be done; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Congress of the United States of America to reauthorize the Debbie Smith DNA backlog grant program at current or increased levels this year; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President pro tempore of the U.S. Senate, the Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives, and each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1048

Offered by Representative Poe:

WHEREAS, The Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield encompasses 366 acres with more than 100 permanent buildings; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois State Fairgrounds is home to the annual Illinois State Fair and also serves as the location of hundreds of educational and entertainment events throughout the year; and

WHEREAS, Severe deterioration of underground electric cable has caused a massive power outage at the Fairgrounds, resulting in the cancellation of dozens of events; the cancellations will cost the local economy millions of dollars in lost revenues; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Capital Development Board shall provide the General Assembly with maintenance records for the past 6 years for the Fairgrounds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Capital Development Board shall provide an assessment of capital and maintenance needs with respect to the Fairgrounds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Capital Development Board shall provide this information to the General Assembly within 60 days; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution shall be delivered to the Capital Development Board.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1050

Offered by Representative Feigenholtz:

WHEREAS, The Supportive Living Program has proven to be one of the most successful models for affordable assisted living in the country, and offers seniors and persons with disabilities care, compassion, comfort, and cost in an environment that helps promote independence and wellness; and

WHEREAS, There are 147 Supportive Living facilities with over 11,000 apartments operating or soon to be operating throughout Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Supportive Living is the largest federal Medicaid home and community-based assisted living waiver program in the country with 11,500 persons that can be served annually; and

WHEREAS, Supportive Living has been lauded by the residents and their families for the high quality of life and services provided; and

WHEREAS, These services, such as medication supervision, personal care, homemaking, laundry, and a 24 hour staff to meet resident's scheduled and unscheduled needs, promote an active, independent lifestyle for residents; and

WHEREAS, Research has shown that there are positive health benefits associated with socialization, keeping active, and having one's health status monitored to provide early detection and treatment; and

WHEREAS, By combining apartment style housing with these services, residents can live independently and take part in decision making where personal choice, dignity, privacy and individuality are emphasized; and

WHEREAS, Supportive Living is cost-effective for the State as rates are lower for residents of supportive living facilities who might otherwise reside in nursing facilities; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we proclaim and recognize April 28 through May 2, 2008, as Supportive Living Week in the State of Illinois, and encourage seniors and persons with disabilities to take advantage of the supportive living program whenever possible.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 112

WHEREAS, Crohn's disease is a chronic disorder that causes inflammation of the digestive or gastrointestinal tract; and

WHEREAS, Crohn's disease and a related disease, ulcerative colitis, are the two main disease categories that belong to a larger group of illnesses called inflammatory bowel disease; and

WHEREAS, Irritable bowel disease impacts 1.4 million patients per year in the United States, at an annual cost of approximately \$2 billion per year; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 30,000 new cases of Irritable Bowel Disease are diagnosed every year; and WHEREAS, Irritable bowel disease is primarily a disease affecting young people and those in the prime of their life; and

WHEREAS, Children with inflammatory bowel disease miss school activities and do not have the appropriate access to restrooms during school hours; and

WHEREAS, Inflammatory bowel disease patients are at a high risk of developing colorectal cancer; therefore, be it
