### HOUSE BILL ON SECOND READING

HOUSE BILL 2627. Having been recalled on March 27, 2009, the same was again taken up. Representative Collins offered the following amendment and moved its adoption.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 2627 on page 1, line 21, by replacing "17 42" with "12"; and on page 1, line 22, by inserting after the period the following: "The minor's confinement shall be implemented in such a manner that there will be no contact by sight, sound, or otherwise between the minor and adult prisoners.".

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was held on the order of Second Reading.

At the hour of 12:08 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

**HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 224**

Offered by Representative Holbrook:

WHEREAS, The United States Navy has a proud tradition of service dating back to the Revolutionary War, when the Continental Congress created the Continental Navy to fight on the seas for our nation's independence; following the dissolution of the Continental Navy, the Founding Fathers gave Congress the right to create a navy through the United States Constitution, which culminated in the creation of the Naval Act of 1794 and the launching of the first United States warships in 1797; and

WHEREAS, The United States Navy has been deployed in all of the United States' great conflicts, fighting for our nation during the War of 1812, the Civil War, World War I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, Operation Desert Storm, and the ongoing conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan; the U.S. Navy also performs humanitarian missions throughout the world, helping those in need without pride or prejudice; and

WHEREAS, The United States Navy is known throughout the world for its strength, courage, and compassion; notable commanders in the United States Navy, including John Paul Jones, Oliver Hazard Perry, and Chester Nimitz, serve as role models to naval officers and citizens around the world; and

WHEREAS, In a world fraught with peril, the United States Navy and its thousands of courageous men and women in uniform stand ready to defend the United States and its interests through its overwhelming force and commitment to their nation and its citizens; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate the week of April 20-26, 2009 as "Navy Week" in the State of Illinois in honor of this fine institution and its many dedicated men and women in uniform; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Acting Secretary of the Navy BJ Penn as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 233**

Offered by Representative Flowers:

WHEREAS, Every person in Illinois and the United States deserves equal access to affordable quality health care; and

WHEREAS, Americans have identified the lack of affordable, guaranteed health care for every citizen as one of the most critical domestic problems; and

WHEREAS, Illness and medical bills contribute to 50% of all U.S. bankruptcies, affecting more than two million Americans annually, especially those without health insurance or those with inadequate health insurance coverage; and

WHEREAS, Americans already pay more per capita than any other nation for health care, almost twice the amount of other industrialized nations, yet according to the World Health Organization, this nation ranks 37th in health system performance; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. could save over \$350 billion annually with an efficient, single payer national

health insurance program by expanding the risk pool to the entire U.S. population, negotiating prescription drug and medical supply purchases, reducing administrative costs, and eliminating the need for administration, marketing and profits associated with private insurance; and

WHEREAS, These savings would fully offset the costs of insuring the 39 million Americans who are uninsured; and

WHEREAS, A national single payer plan restores control over medical care to the patient and the patient's chosen medical professionals; and

WHEREAS, There are an estimated 1.7 million Illinois residents who do not have health insurance coverage, of which over 279,568 are children; and

WHEREAS, The cost of providing health care to Illinois' residents has become a burden to Illinois employers, as well as Illinois municipalities and taxpayers; according to an updated estimate of the Institute of Medicine, the uninsured in our State cost our State at least \$3.9 billion annually; this far exceeds the cost to provide health insurance to these uninsured Illinois residents, demonstrating the need to undertake a major overhaul and reform of the health insurance system; and

WHEREAS, Illinois hospitals spent almost \$1.3 billion to provide charity care in FY 2007, and provided \$383 million of free or discounted care, expenses they would no longer incur under a national health insurance program; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois could save nearly \$2 billion per year in health benefits costs for current and retired State employees under a national health insurance program proposed under federal legislation embodied in H.R. 676, the "United States National Health Insurance Act"; and

WHEREAS, A national health insurance program would free Illinois doctors, hospitals and other medical care facilities from the consistent burdens and expenses of paperwork created by having to deal with multiple insurers with different rules; and

WHEREAS, Given Illinois' current fiscal crisis, in order to cover every Illinois resident with comprehensive health insurance, the State would have to further cut aid to local governments and other very critical State programs and services; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 676, sponsored by Congressman John Conyers and 93 co-sponsors, would assure comprehensive coverage to include, but not be limited to, hospital, physician, prescription drugs, vision, hearing, dental, chiropractic, mental health, drug rehabilitation, and long term care services for all Illinois and U.S. residents, would protect the doctor-patient relationship, would assure patients a completely free choice of doctors, and would allow physicians a free choice of practice settings; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 676 has the endorsement of 34 out of 50 statewide chapters of the AFL-CIO and 110 Central Labor Councils nationwide; and

WHEREAS, This House believes that both controlling health care costs and ensuring health care for all residents is of vital importance; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we respectfully urge the United States Congress and the President of the United States to enact H.R. 676, pending in the 110th Congress, which provides universal health insurance coverage for all individuals residing in the United States and its territories; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be transmitted to the President and Vice President of the United States, the Speaker and Minority Leader of the United States House of Representatives, the President and Minority Leader of the United States Senate, and every member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.
