HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 99

Offered by Representative Riley:

WHEREAS, Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASD) are the leading cause of intellectual disability in the United States and are 100% preventable; and

WHEREAS, The term FASD includes a broader range of conditions and therefore has replaced fetal alcohol syndrome as the umbrella term describing the range of effects that can occur in an individual whose mother consumed alcohol during pregnancy; and

WHEREAS, The prevalence of FASD is estimated to be at least 1% of all live births in the United States; and

WHEREAS, FASD is the leading known cause of learning disabilities and is a major cause of numerous social problems, including juvenile delinquency, homelessness, unemployment, mental illness, and crime; and

WHEREAS, Ten to 14% of women in Illinois report using alcohol during pregnancy; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Marriage and Dissolution of Marriage Act requires that with each marriage license a county clerk shall provide a pamphlet describing the causes and effects of fetal alcohol syndrome; and

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, this well-intended statutory requirement does not provide a means for a county clerk to meet the requirement; and

WHEREAS, It has been determined that in most counties the county clerks have not issued the required pamphlet to the nearly 80,000 recipients of marriage licenses each year, and thus tens of thousands of these marriage license recipients in Illinois have been deprived of this crucial public health information; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois affiliate of the National Organization on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, NOFAS Illinois, which is administered by Trinity Services, Inc., has agreed to provide free educational pamphlets to each county clerk, thus making this well-intentioned statute a reality in all counties in Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that within 60 days after this joint resolution is adopted, NOFAS Illinois and the County Clerks Association should determine the best ways to ensure that each couple receiving a marriage license will receive from the county clerk an educational pamphlet about fetal alcohol syndrome; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the County Clerks Association.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 931

Offered by Representative Bost:

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States was written and ratified to, in its own words, "provide for the common defense"; and

WHEREAS, All of the rights granted by the American federal government to individual men, women, and children, whether they are American citizens on the one hand, or captured enemy combatants on the other, stem from the Constitution of the United States and its foundational purpose to provide for our common defense; and

WHEREAS, Acts of terrorist war against the United States, especially but not limited to the destruction of the World Trade Center and a portion of the Pentagon headquarters of the U.S. Department of Defense, on September 11, 2001, are not criminal acts, and when non-U.S.-citizen enemy combatants are accused of complicity in acts of this class, these acts should be classified as attacks on the people of the United States, rather than classified as criminal acts; and

WHEREAS, The administration of President Barack Obama, including the United States Department of Justice, appears to believe that enemy combatants, taken into custody in the Global War on Terror, who are not United States citizens, should enjoy rights that are equal, in all respects, to the rights enjoyed by United States citizens; and

WHEREAS, The administration of President Barack Obama, including the United States Department of Justice, appears to believe that non-U.S.-citizen enemy combatants who are charged with a terrorist act or acts against the United States, taken into custody in the Global War on Terror, should be placed on trial in criminal courts, and given rights equivalent to the rights enjoyed by criminal defendants who are citizens of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Rights enjoyed by citizens of the United States, under the Constitution, include the right to be warned of their right to remain silent ("Miranda warning"), the right to confidential consultation with a court-appointed and taxpayer-funded attorney, the right to be tried in a civilian court of law, the right not to be subjected to harsh forms of interrogation, and many other rights; and

WHEREAS, The rights enjoyed by citizens of the United States in criminal trials impose a substantial fiscal impact upon the budgets of the U.S. Department of Justice and its allied agencies, which are expenses paid by U.S. taxpayers, including the taxpayers of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we do not support granting, to non-citizen enemy combatants accused of terrorist acts against the United States, and taken into custody in the Global War on Terror, the Miranda rights and other privileges of the Constitution enjoyed by citizens of the United States of America; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call upon the current Administration of President Barack Obama and the U.S. Department of Justice to re-examine and shift their positions on this extremely important strategic issue;

and be it further

RESOLVED, That we, the Illinois House of Representatives, do not support placing non-citizen enemy combatants taken into custody in the Global War on Terror on trial in criminal courts; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support efforts in Congress to enact legislation to legally forbid civilian criminal charges against, and trials for, persons charged with a terrorist act or acts against the United States, with special reference to the proposed trial of accused 9/11 mastermind Khalid Sheikh Mohammed; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we, the Illinois House of Representatives, do not support granting, to non-uniformed enemy combatants taken into custody in the Global War on Terror, the rights enjoyed by uniformed prisoners of war; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we, the Illinois House of Representatives, believe that non-uniformed, non-U.S.-citizen enemy combatants taken into custody in the Global War on Terror should be subjected to military tribunals under procedures enacted by law; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this Preamble and Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the Attorney General of the United States, the United States Secretary of Defense, the two United States Senators from Illinois, and the Illinois delegation to the United States House of Representatives.

ACTION ON MOTION

Representative Bost moved to suspend the appropriate provisions of Rule 16(a) and to discharge HOUSE RESOLUTION 931 from the House Rules Committee, and requested a record vote on the motion.

Representative Currie was recognized and announced her opposition to the motion.

The Chair ruled that a record vote was not necessary because the motion was already lost due to the denial of unanimous consent.

Representative Bost moved to appeal from the ruling of the Chair.

On the question of sustaining the ruling of the Chair, a vote was taken resulting as follows:

The motion prevailed and the Chair was sustained.

At the request of the principal sponsor, Representative Mendoza, HOUSE BILL 2490 was recalled from the order of Third Reading to the order of Second Reading and held on that order.
