**31ST LEGISLATIVE DAY**

**Perfunctory Session**

**TUESDAY, MARCH 29, 2011**

At the hour of 5:28 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

**HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 198**

Offered by Representative Chapa LaVia:

WHEREAS, The citizens of the State of Illinois should be made aware of the ever-present dangers posed by potentially poisonous household substances; and

WHEREAS, Children have access to over-the-counter and prescription medications and potentially toxic household products too often; and

WHEREAS, Over the past 49 years, the nation has observed National Poison Prevention Week to help prevent accidental poisonings and to provide tips for promoting community involvement in poison prevention; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Poison Center is a mainstay in the emergency medical care system of the State of Illinois and is recognized nationally for its contributions to poison treatment and prevention; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Poison Center is a key component of the State's bioterrorism readiness network, standing ready to assist the Illinois Department of Public Health and local authorities in the event of a biochemical or radiation incident; and

WHEREAS, Half of the nearly 90,000 poisonings reported last year to the Illinois Poison Center involved children under the age of six and could have been prevented; and

WHEREAS, More than 90% of the calls received from the public are treated over the phone, quickly and safely, by the experienced and highly-qualified staff of the Illinois Poison Center; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Poison Center saves Illinois more than \$50 million in unnecessary health care costs; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate March of 2011 as Illinois Poison Prevention Month in the State of Illinois, and we encourage all citizens to learn more about the Illinois Poison Center's poisoning prevention programs and the steps that can be taken to create safe and healthful home, play, and work environments; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Poison Center.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 201**

Offered by Representative Berrios:

WHEREAS, President Barack Obama has pledged to provide support to students in an effort to reach his goal of the United States leading the world with the highest proportion of college graduates by 2020; and

WHEREAS, America's higher education system is comprised of public and private schools, both for-profit and not-for-profit; it is a recognized fact that for-profit career colleges and technical schools are a critical part of our educational infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, These schools are currently serving a disproportionately high number of adult, minority, and lower-income students typically identified as "at risk"; and

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Education is considering a Gainful Employment rule that would affect all for-profit colleges, universities, and technical schools here in Illinois and throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, The rule would eliminate the opportunity to pursue a chosen program utilizing Title IV financial aid should the student fail to meet an arbitrary debt-to-income ratio; and

WHEREAS, The proposed rule would deny opportunity to students who, due to their socio-economic backgrounds, are most likely to fail this litmus test and thus harm those who need help the most; and

WHEREAS, The students and academic programs that would be most affected by this measure are those most critical to meeting the Obama Administration's post-secondary education goals; and

WHEREAS, For-profit institutions tailor their programs to these non-traditional students who enroll in career and technical programs to gain real-world skills, often while working or caring for their own families; and

WHEREAS, These institutions of higher learning have educated millions of students, afforded them career opportunities, and served the student population extremely well; and

WHEREAS, Rates of student debt incurred to achieve these goals are a concern shared by students, families, and our nation as a whole; and

WHEREAS, The unintended consequences of this regulation would harm students, families, communities, and the economic strength of our nation; and

WHEREAS, A large, bi-partisan majority in the United States House of Representatives has expressed their disapproval of the current rule as an inappropriate response to these issues by voting to defund efforts to implement the proposal; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States Department of Education and Education Secretary Arne Duncan to not endorse the Gainful Employment rule, an ill-conceived approach to regulating student financial aid which limits choice and opportunity, and instead work with Congress on a solution that does not further harm the very students it seeks to protect; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be sent to Secretary Arne Duncan.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 211

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, Someone develops Alzheimer's disease every 69 seconds; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is on the rise with 5.4 million Americans currently living with the disease and an estimated 16 million Americans projected to be diagnosed with the disease by 2050; and

WHEREAS, Currently, 210,000 people in Illinois live with the disease; there will be 220,000 in 2020, and 240,000 in 15 years; and

HOUSE RESOLUTION 223

WHEREAS, The Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 1961 to 1975, and involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with the United States Armed Forces and South Vietnam; and



WHEREAS, The United States became involved by serving in an advisory role to the South Vietnamese in 1961; and

WHEREAS, In 1965, United States Armed Forces ground combat units arrived in Vietnam and by the end of that year there were 80,000 United States troops in Vietnam with a peak of approximately 500,000 troops in 1969; and

WHEREAS, On January 27, 1973, the Treaty of Paris was signed, which required the release of all United States prisoners-of-war held in North Vietnam and the withdrawal of all United States Armed Forces from South Vietnam; by March 30, 1973, the United States Armed Forces completed the withdrawal of combat troops from Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, More than 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000 members of the Armed Forces were wounded; and

WHEREAS, In 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was dedicated in Washington, D.C. to commemorate those members of the United States Armed Forces who died or were declared missing-in-action in Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, Members of the United States Armed Forces who served bravely and faithfully for the United States during the Vietnam War were caught upon their return home in the crossfire of public debate about the involvement of the United States in the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, March 30th marks the anniversary of the day that combat and combat support units withdrew completely from South Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, The Ranking Member of the United States Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs has introduced Senate Resolution 55 before the 112th Congress to honor veterans who served in Vietnam by designating March 30th as "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day"; and

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives support the United States Senate in the establishment of a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" as an appropriate way to honor those members of the United States Armed Forces who served in Vietnam during the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives agree that March 30 would be an appropriate day to establish "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" in the State of Illinois; therefore, be it
