37TH LEGISLATIVE DAY

Perfunctory Session

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 6, 2011

At the hour of 9:39 o'clock a.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 251

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, Autism Spectrum Disorder can affect all individuals regardless of racial, ethnic, economic, and social groups; and

WHEREAS, Autism Spectrum Disorder is more common than pediatric cancer, diabetes, and AIDS combined; and

WHEREAS, It is diagnosed in 1 in 110 individuals in the United States based on the 2007 CDC statistics; and

WHEREAS, The cause of Autism Spectrum Disorder is still unknown but research strongly suggests that it is caused by certain factors that affect brain development; and

WHEREAS, Autism Spectrum Disorder has increased tenfold in the last decade and now occurs in some form in 1 in 90 boys in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Autism, which is four times more common in boys than girls, usually appears during the first three years of life; and

WHEREAS, Early diagnosis, research, training, education, and therapies are vital to reducing the effects of Autism; and

WHEREAS, Current research suspects that there is not a single cause that will ultimately be discovered but rather a cluster of factors which include genetics, pregnancy/birth complications, viral infections, metabolic disorders, congenital anomaly syndrome (birth defects), and environmental toxins; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate April 14, 2011 as Autism Lobby Day in the State of Illinois for the purpose of urging both government and its citizenry to become aware and educated on the subject of Autism Spectrum Disorders.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 252

Offered by Representative Williams:

WHEREAS, Forty years after Congress passed the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA), promising every worker the right to a safe job, the protections in OSHA have saved hundreds of thousands of lives and prevented millions of workplace injuries; and

WHEREAS, Nationally in 2007, despite current safety laws, more than four million workers were injured and 5,488 workers were killed due to job hazards; and

WHEREAS, On April 28, 2011 organized labor will observe Workers' Memorial Day all across the country to remember those who have suffered and died on the job and to renew the fight for safe workplaces for all workers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Illinois House of Representatives recognizes that as long as there are workers seriously injured or killed on the job, there will be a need to support stronger

safety and health laws in our State and country and will work to that end; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois House of Representatives will encourage the Illinois congressional delegation and President Barack Obama to continue to revise, revamp and strengthen our federal workplace safety laws and to properly fund OSHA programs and staff; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois House of Representatives offers its deep felt sympathy and understanding to the families of workers who have been seriously injured or killed on the job; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois House of Representatives officially declares April 28, 2011 as Workers' Memorial Day in Illinois.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 27

Offered by Representative Representative Winters:

WHEREAS, The Rock River, known for its beauty and ecological importance, flows south through Rockford, then southwest across northwestern Illinois, passing Oregon, Dixon, Sterling, and Rock Falls before joining the Mississippi River at Rock Island; and

WHEREAS, The Rock River provides opportunities for conservation and recreation for many residents of this State; and

WHEREAS, The Rock River has had an important role in Illinois history, and it attracts many tourists each year to such spots as the area in Dixon where former President Ronald Reagan once served as a lifeguard and his favorite fishing spot, now called "Dutch Landing", located just southwest of Lowell Park; and

WHEREAS, Designating the roads along the Illinois portion of the Rock River as a Scenic Route will encourage residents and visitors alike to explore, appreciate, and enjoy the many wonders of the Rock River; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Rock River Scenic Route is designated as follows:

- (1) from the Illinois-Wisconsin State Line at Shirland Avenue, along South Bluff Road in Rockton Township to Rockton Road on County Highway 9;
- (2) along Rockton Road from South Bluff Road to Race Street in Rockton;
- (3) along Race Street from Rockton Road to Main Street in Rockton;
- (4) along Main Street from Race Street to Hononegah Road (County Highway 8);
- (5) along Hononegah Road from Main Street to Illinois Route 251;
- (6) along Illinois Route 251 from Hononegah Road to State Street in Rockford;
- (7) along State Street from Illinois 251 to Illinois Route 2;
- (8) along Illinois Route 2 from State Street through the remainder of Winnebago County and through Ogle County into Lee County to Palmyra Road;
- (9) along Palmyra Road from Illinois Route 2 (east) to Illinois Route 2 (west) in Whiteside County;
- (10) along Illinois Route 2 through the remainder of Whiteside County into Rock Island County to 94th Avenue North (County Highway 2); and
- (11) along 94th Avenue North from Illinois Route 2 to Illinois Route 84 (the Great River Road); and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State regulations, plaques or signs giving notice of the name; and be it further

RESOLVED, That units of local government that maintain any portion of the Rock River Scenic Route are urged to enhance suitable areas along the route; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency and the Illinois Bureau of Tourism are requested to post the Rock River Scenic Route's location on their Agency websites, and to produce and distribute brochures and other related matter that will make the route known to the public; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Secretary of Transportation, the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, the Illinois Bureau of Tourism, and to each of the local governments having jurisdiction over any portion of the route.
