SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 61

WHEREAS, The State Board of Education has filed its Report on Waiver of School Code Mandates, dated March 1, 2012, with the Senate, the House of Representatives, and the Secretary of State of Illinois as required by Section 2-3.25g of the School Code; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that all requests for waivers identified in the report filed by the State Board of Education are approved.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 910

Offered by Representative Williams:

WHEREAS, Millions of Cambodians were killed from 1975 to 1979 as part of a systematic genocide by the Khmer Rouge; many of these murders were performed at sites now known as the Killing Fields; and

WHEREAS, In order to provide hope and renewal to the survivors and to the Cambodian community at large, the Cambodian-American community remembers and pays tribute to those lost in the Killing Fields; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Kompha Seth, President and Co-Founder of the Cambodian Association of Illinois, and Dary Mien, Executive Director of the Cambodian Association of Illinois, have worked tirelessly to ensure that we remember those who were lost and those who will forever bear the scars from this atrocity, and to educate Illinoisans on the rich culture and history of the Cambodian-American community; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting and proper for the members of this body to join with the Cambodian-American community in remembering those who were lost to the Khmer Rouge regime; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate March 29 as the Cambodian Day of Remembrance in the State of Illinois and urge the people of this State to join with the Cambodian-American community in remembering those lost and honoring the survivors.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 912

Offered by Representative Morrison:

WHEREAS, In the spring of 2012, the retail prices of motor fuels in Illinois have touched or hit record levels; and

WHEREAS, On March 26, 2012, the average sales price of gasoline-based motor fuel in Illinois was

\$4.29 per gallon; and

WHEREAS, These retail prices include the substantial burden of motor fuel excise taxes, State sales taxes, local sales taxes, and environmental remediation taxes, which have been added to the underlying burden of worldwide crude oil prices; and

WHEREAS, The current global price of crude oil is in excess of \$120 per 42-gallon barrel, driven upward by political upheavals in the Middle East and adjacent regions of the Eastern Hemisphere; and

WHEREAS, The high price of motor fuels threatens prospects for Illinois employment and economic recovery by diverting consumer spending from discretionary purchases to motor fuel; demand for motor fuel is highly price-inelastic, as once people take up residence in a house, they are tied in to a pattern of driving to and from the places where they work, shop, and visit their relatives and friends, and cannot easily change their patterns; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Governor Pat Quinn to take action immediately to comprehensively lower the price of motor fuel in all geographic regions of Illinois on a time frame adequate to prevent Illinois falling into renewed recessionary conditions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge Governor Quinn and President Barack Obama to take immediate steps to reverse their current policies regarding the price of motor fuel and to cooperate on new policies to increase motor fuel supplies in Illinois, reduce pressure on Illinois motor fuel prices, and inform the Illinois public of the steps being taken to reduce price pressure on motor fuel; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, based upon the current political upheavals in the Middle East, consequent disruptions to the world supply of crude oil, and negative consequences of these disruptions to the fragile U.S. economic recovery, we urge President Obama and the United States Department of Energy to release part of the U.S. Strategic Petroleum Reserve for summer 2012 refinery throughput and consumer end-use; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, based upon the current record or near-record price of motor fuel in Illinois, we urge the President of the United States and the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency to suspend implementation of all federal Clean Air Act non-attainment rules that affect the chemical composition and market price of motor fuel sold in the Chicago, Illinois and St. Louis, Missouri metropolitan areas; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we commend our neighbor country, the nation of Canada, for its aggressive work in expanding crude oil production from one of the largest under-utilized sources of fossil fuels in the world, the oil sands deposits of the province of Alberta, which possess estimated reserves of 1.7 trillion barrels of bitumen, from which crude oil can be manufactured; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call upon United States oil refiners to continue their work to rebuild their refineries to refine bitumen-based crude oil into consumer petroleum products and commend the example provided by Canada to those United States policymakers who have the power to decide upon policies that govern the drilling, exploitation, and enjoyment of crude oil resources here in the United States; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we direct the Illinois Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability to conduct an objective, non-political examination of our policy of charging "ad valorem" Illinois sales taxes on motor fuel, thereby raising these prices well above world spot market prices for gasoline, and to report its findings to the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives, the Illinois House Republican Leader, the President of the Illinois Senate, and the Illinois Senate Republican Leader, and for this study to be concluded and the report transferred no later than September 30, 2012; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the President of the United States, the Secretary of the United States Department of Energy, the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the Governor of Illinois, and the executive director of the Illinois Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 913

Offered by Representative Yarbrough:

WHEREAS, The United States sends hundreds of billions of dollars a year overseas for oil; a dangerous amount of this money is funneled through front groups and fake charities to terrorist groups, as well as to

insurgents in Iraq and Afghanistan who attack U.S. troops; and

WHEREAS, The men and women who serve our nation face serious threats as they secure the flow of oil necessary to meet our demand; and

WHEREAS, In Afghanistan, one out of every 24 fuel convoys results in an American casualty; and

WHEREAS, Billions of gallons of fuel are consumed every year by U.S. military vehicles that are dedicated to securing oil transportation routes; and

WHEREAS, U.S. demand for oil drives up the price everywhere, allowing countries we refuse to buy from to profit, such as Iran, which uses its petroleum profits to fund its nuclear program; and

WHEREAS, The United States Navy, Marines, Air Force, and Army are all currently investing in clean energy technology to aggressively reduce their reliance on fossil fuels because the technology saves money and saves lives; and

WHEREAS, Investing in clean energy can both create new jobs in Illinois and make the United States more economically competitive in the global economy; and

WHEREAS, The national and international challenges of America's oil dependence are influenced by the energy policies of individual states; and

WHEREAS, U.S. military veterans, including the veterans coalition Operation Free, advocate for reducing America's oil dependence in order to strengthen American security; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we state our intent to duly consider the ramifications for America's security when taking up issues concerning energy development and our dependence on oil, adopt policies that encourage the growth of the clean-energy sector in order to encourage innovation, create jobs for Illinoisans, and strengthen America's security, and work with the clean energy sector to develop clean energy job training and placement programs for returning veterans; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we express our deepest appreciation to America's service members, veterans, and military families for their selfless service to our country and recognizes the veterans of Operation Free for their continued work in service of our national security.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 78

Offered by Representative Monique Davis:

WHEREAS, The rising rates of tuition at public universities in this State are of concern to the members of this General Assembly; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we recommend that in any fiscal year in which the rate of tuition at a public university in this State is increased by any percentage above the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for all items, as published by the United States Department of Labor, during the 12-month calendar year preceding that fiscal year, the board of trustees of the university not increase, in that fiscal year, the base salary of the president of the university and other principal administrators who are employed by the university and whose base salary exceeds \$200,000; and be it further

RESOLVED, That it is not the intention of the General Assembly in this resolution to interfere with existing employer-employee contracts of employment; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the board of trustees of each public university in this State.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

On motion of Representative Verschoore, HOUSE BILL 5009 was taken up and read by title a third time.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 111, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.
