WHEREAS, In order for a community to realize its maximum opportunity for economic development, it must have a direct, safe, and efficient connection to the potential markets in the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois Department of Transportation is responsible for planning and designing safe access to US Highway 50; and

WHEREAS, Phase I engineering studies were completed for US Route 50 from Lebanon to the Indiana state line between the years of 1969 and 1973, and the Illinois Department of Transportation also funded a

feasibility study in 2007 to identify the requirements and cost of upgrading to a 4-lane highway; and

WHEREAS, The feasibility study was completed and approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation in 2008 and declared a feasible expansion project; the funding of \$5,000,000 for the Phase I study was secured in 2009 in the Capital Bill; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Department of Transportation signed the Phase I Environmental Energy Study Contract for \$3.6 million in July 2011, with the remaining \$1.4 million designated for design engineering of this corridor; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Route 50 Coalition was first created in 2006 to support the expiation of Route 50 as a means to provide economic development to an area of Illinois that has suffered population loss in the past decade; and

WHEREAS, There is no better route from St. Louis to Cincinnati than the US Route 50 Highway which will revive rural communities and provide economic growth; and

WHEREAS, The communities of Lawrence, Richland, Clay, Marion, Clinton and St. Clair Counties, and the communities of Lawrenceville, Bridgeport, Sumner, Olney, Noble, Clay, Xenia, Iuka, Salem, Centralia, Hoffman, Carlyle, Beckemeyer, Breese, Aviston, Trenton, and Summerfield are in strong favor of the expansion, and completing the engineering study so the project can begin as soon as funds become available; and

WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the State to pursue efforts to improve or extend the Route 50 Four-Lane Expansion Project between the Indiana state line and connecting with Interstate 64 in Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage State and federal officials to provide funding for this important project as soon as it becomes available; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Secretary of Transportation, the United States Secretary of Transportation, Governor Quinn, to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation, and to the President of the United States, Barack Obama.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1029

Offered by Representative Barickman:

WHEREAS, Endangered Species Day is celebrated by many states, such as Texas, Florida, Tennessee, and California; the day is dedicated to bringing awareness and helping endangered species in our country; this year, Endangered Species Day will take place on May 18, 2012; and

WHEREAS, The people of the State of Illinois recognize that a healthy environment is an integral part of Illinois' economy, society, and culture; and

WHEREAS, The alligator snapping turtle is the largest freshwater turtle in North America, and helps to control fish populations everywhere; as of 2006, the alligator snapping turtle was listed as an endangered species, while being an important part of Illinois' ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, There are roughly 450 endangered species other than the alligator snapping turtle, including 18 species of fish, 3 species of amphibians, 8 species of reptiles, 26 species of birds, 5 species of mammals, 37 species of invertebrates, and 251 species of plants; these numbers do not include threatened animals; and

WHEREAS, Despite this vast list of endangered species, the State of Illinois does not recognize an Endangered Species Day; by bringing awareness to the entire State and putting emphasis on youth-organized campaigns, a recognized awareness day could aid in preventing further damage done to our environment; and

WHEREAS, As stated in Article 11 of the Illinois Constitution, "The public policy of the State and the duty of each person is to provide and maintain a healthful environment for the benefit of this and future generations. The General Assembly shall provide by law for the implementation and enforcement of this public policy."; and

WHEREAS, The members of this body have an obligation to our children and to future generations to be influential leaders of our atmosphere and to pave an affirmative path of stewardship in protecting endangered species and their habitats; and

WHEREAS, By placing more emphasis on the importance of preserving our environment, youth in

general would become more educated on the consequences and future problems caused by neglecting our earth now; focusing on these issues would help instill responsibility, leadership, humanitarianism, and consideration in students in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The obliteration of a species and their habitat is a severe hazard to our own society, as nature is the foundation of our most frequently-prescribed medicines; the loss of a species could result in the loss of life-saving drugs; and

WHEREAS, The members of this body have the responsibility to utilize the finest technology accessible to ensure the protection against the extinction of many valued creatures and to guarantee their availability for all needs to future generations; and

WHEREAS, For over 30 years, the Endangered Species Act has served as the nation's safety net for wildlife, saving hundreds of plants and animals for extinction, putting hundreds more on the path to recovery, and safeguarding the habitats on which they all depend; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we pledge to uphold the nation's standards of the Endangered Species Act and continue to take all appropriate action to protect our plants and wildlife and the places that they live, in honor of Operation Endangered Species and the Alligator Snapping Turtle project at Pontiac Township High School; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we designate the date of May 18, 2012 as Endangered Species Day in the State of Illinois in furtherance of this goal.
