Mr. Speaker -- I am directed to inform the House of Representatives that the Senate has adopted the following Senate Joint Resolution, in the adoption of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the House of Representatives, to-wit:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 63

WHEREAS, Illinois Route 148 is a State highway that runs from Pulley's Mill in Southern Illinois north to Mount Vernon; and

WHEREAS, United States Army Specialist Travis Picantine of Sesser passed away while in the service of this country on November 10, 2009; and

WHEREAS, He enlisted in the United States Army in 2007; he completed his Basic Training and AIT at Fort Benning, Georgia; he was stationed at Fort Drum, New York with the 10th Mountain Division; and

WHEREAS, He was an Infantryman with the 1-32 Charlie Company; he returned to Fort Drum after his deployment to Afghanistan; and

WHEREAS, He received many medals and awards during his military service, including the Army Commendation Medal, 2 Army Achievement Medals with Oak Leaf, the National Defense Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal with Star, the War on Terrorism Service Medal, the United Nations Medal, the Basic Training Service Ribbon, the Overseas Service Medal, the Army Presidential Unit Ribbon with Bronze Oak Leaf, the Army Valorous Unit Citation, the Army Meritorious Unit Citation, the Expert Marksman Badge, the Combat Infantry Badge, and an Infantry Cord; and

WHEREAS, United States Army Specialist Travis Picantine is remembered by his mother, Tammie Goessman Severs; his sister, Megan Bowlin; his niece, Lily Marie Bowlin; his nephew, Travis Ryan Bowlin, named in his honor after his passing; and his grandparents, Harold Dean and Margaret Goessman; and

WHEREAS, This fallen soldier deserves to be remembered by the State of Illinois for his service to this country; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that the portion of Illinois Route 148 from Christopher and through the Village of Sesser be renamed the Army Specialist Travis Picantine Memorial Highway; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name of the Army Specialist Travis Picantine Memorial Highway; and be it further

Mr. Speaker -- I am directed to inform the House of Representatives that the Senate has adopted the following Senate Joint Resolution, in the adoption of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the House of Representatives, to-wit:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 62

WHEREAS, It is necessary to recognize citizens who are dedicated to the betterment of the community; and

WHEREAS, The best means of fostering commitment to our community is by recognizing the contributions of the citizens who have come before us; and

WHEREAS, Mariano Turano came to America from Calabria, Italy in pursuit of his dream to provide a better life for his family; in 1962, he founded the Turano Baking Company; despite being only 1,000 square feet in size, this small bakery made a big impression among his neighbors, thanks to Mariano's authentic Italian recipes; and

WHEREAS, The Campagna-Turano Bakery started as a local bakery with home-delivery routes; as word of mouth traveled and his Italian bakery grew, Mariano, his brother Eugenio, and their families expanded the product line to include new items, such as French and Vienna breads, Kaiser rolls, and Mamma Susi Pizzas; by the early 1970s, Campagna-Turano Bakery, now known as Turano Baking Company, decided to take on the wholesale market, introducing Mamma Susi's Pizza to local grocery stores; it didn't take long for Turano to find themselves on restaurant tabletops and grocery stores throughout Chicagoland; and

WHEREAS, Mariano Turano's sons, Renato, Umberto, and Giancarlo, have made it their mission to carry on the tradition of excellence, creativity, and reliability that their father started 50 years ago; they manage the business with the help of devoted employees and Mariano's grandchildren, and have turned Turano Baking Company into what is now the nation's leading European artisan bakery; and

WHEREAS, Today, the third generation of the Turano family eagerly contributes to the company's success with the same passion, determination, and enthusiasm of their fathers, while still maintaining the tradition of quality and artisanship their grandfather started half a century ago; in addition to delivering fresh bread daily throughout the Midwest, Turano also services the entire nation with frozen, par-baked, and fully-baked breads; Turano Baking Company's product line now consists of over 400 quality breads and baked goods, and the company continues to grow, with operations in Illinois, Georgia, and Florida; and

WHEREAS, The members of this body are excited to celebrate Turano's 50th anniversary in 2012, and look forward to their bright future; and

WHEREAS, There is a section of State highway located on Roosevelt Road, between Ridgeland and East Avenues in the City of Berwyn; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate the south side of Roosevelt Road between Ridgeland and East Avenues in the City of Berwyn as "Mariano Turano Way"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Turano family, the City of Berwyn, Berwyn Mayor Robert Lovero, Illinois State Senator Martin A. Sandoval, and the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION

The following resolution was offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1032

Offered by Representative Senger:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives recognize their responsibility to promote, protect, and preserve the safety and welfare of the citizens of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The members of this body also recognize that criminal street gangs and gang-related activities promote crime and jeopardize the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The City of Chicago has experienced a recent increase in criminal street gang activity; over the weekend of March 17-18, 2012, 46 people were shot in the City of Chicago, with 9 fatalities as a result of criminal street gang violence; one of the victims, a 6-year-old girl, was caught in the crossfire of a gang shooting as she played on the sidewalk in front of her home; for the first 3 months of 2012, gang-related murders in Chicago rose 60%, compared to the same time period last year; and

WHEREAS, The gang problem in Illinois extends beyond the City of Chicago; outside the metropolitan area, gangs engage in violence, burglaries, and drug-related activity harmful to Illinois citizens' safety and well-being; and

WHEREAS, Criminal street gangs are rapidly employing new technology, including the utilization of social media, to orchestrate drug activity and violence; and

WHEREAS, Governor Jim Edgar last established a study on Illinois gang problems when he established the Governor's Commission on Gangs in 1995; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly recognizes a current need for a new task force to study and analyze the recent increase in street gang violence in Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that there is created the Illinois Task Force on Gang Violence; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Task Force shall be comprised of the following members, all of whom shall serve without compensation; (1) 2 representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives; (2) 2 representatives, appointed by the Minority Leader of the Illinois House of Representatives; (3) a representative of the Cook County State's Attorney's office, appointed by the Cook County State's Attorney; (4) a representative on behalf of the State's Attorney offices in Illinois counties other than Cook County, designated by the Illinois State Attorney's Association; (5) a representative of the Illinois State Police, appointed by the Director of the Illinois State Police; (6) a representative from the Chicago Police Department, appointed by the Mayor of the City of Chicago; (7) a representative of the Cook County Sheriff's Department, appointed by the Cook County Sheriff's Department; and (8) a representative on behalf of the Sheriffs' Departments in Illinois counties other than Cook County, designated by the Illinois Sheriffs Association; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Speaker and Minority Leader shall each designate one representative to serve as co-chairs of the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois State Police shall provide administrative and other support to the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force is charged with conducting subject matter hearings, which should include testimony from those individuals with knowledge of gang violence, involved with communities experiencing gang violence, or affected by gang violence; the Task Force shall then analyze the data regarding the increase in gang activity in Illinois and issue a public report of its findings and recommendations to help Illinois combat street gang violence on or before January 1, 2013.
