WHEREAS, Diabetes contributed to the deaths of over 231,404 people in the United States in 2007, making diabetes the seventh leading cause of death; and

WHEREAS, Every minute, three people are diagnosed with diabetes; and

WHEREAS, Each day, approximately 4,384 people were diagnosed with diabetes and approximately 1,900,000 new cases of diabetes were diagnosed in people 20 years or older in 2010; and

WHEREAS, Nationally, the rate of new diabetes cases climbed from about 5 per 1,000 in the mid-1990s to 9 per 1000 in the mid-2000s; and

WHEREAS, Over 7 million people with diabetes are undiagnosed; and

WHEREAS, Over 11.8% or 13 million adult men and 10.8% or 12.6 million women in the United States have diabetes; and

WHEREAS, Diabetes is a serious chronic condition that affects people of every age, race, income level, and ethnicity; and

WHEREAS, Persons who are Hispanic, African, Asian, Pacific Islander, or Native American are disproportionately affected by diabetes and suffer at rates much higher than the general population; and

WHEREAS, 15,600 youths in the United States are diagnosed with type 1 diabetes annually; about 3,600 youths are diagnosed with type 2 diabetes annually; and

WHEREAS, One in three people in the United States born in the year 2000 will develop diabetes in their lifetime; this statistic grows to nearly one in two for minority populations; and

WHEREAS, Diabetes costs the United States an estimated \$245 billion in 2012; \$1 in every \$10 spent on health care is attributed to diabetes and its complications; and

WHEREAS, Approximately one out of every four Medicare dollars is spent on the care of people with diabetes; and

WHEREAS, Every year, 65,700 people with diabetes undergo an amputation, 202,290 people enter endstage kidney disease programs, and 420,000 people go blind from diabetes; and

WHEREAS, There is not yet a cure for diabetes; and

WHEREAS, There are proven means to reduce the incidence of and delay the onset of type 2 diabetes; and

WHEREAS, People with diabetes live healthy and productive lives with proper management and treatment; and

WHEREAS, National Diabetes Month is celebrated in the month of November; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate November of 2013 as Diabetes Awareness Month in the State of Illinois in order to raise public awareness about stopping diabetes and increase education about the disease; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recognize the importance of early detection, awareness of the symptoms of diabetes, and the risk factors for type 2 diabetes, which include being over the age of 45, coming from certain ethnic backgrounds, being overweight, having a low physical activity level, high blood pressure, and a family history of diabetes or a history of diabetes during pregnancy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support efforts to decrease the prevalence of diabetes, develop better treatments, and work toward an eventual cure for type 1 and type 2 diabetes through increased research, treatment, and prevention.

WHEREAS, Autism Spectrum Disorder can affect any individual regardless of racial, ethnic, economic, or social group; and

WHEREAS, Autism Spectrum Disorder is more common than pediatric cancer, diabetes, and AIDS combined; and

WHEREAS, Studies in Asia, Europe, and North America have identified individuals with an Autism Spectrum Disorder with an average prevalence of about 1%; a recent study in South Korea reported a prevalence of 2.6%; and

WHEREAS, About one in 88 children has been identified with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) according to estimates from CDC's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network; and

WHEREAS, The cause of Autism Spectrum Disorder is still unknown; the research strongly suggests that it is caused by certain factors that affect brain development; and

WHEREAS, Autism Spectrum Disorder has increased tenfold in the last decade and now occurs in some form in one in 54 boys in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Autism, which is 5 times more common among boys than girls, usually appears during the first 3 years of life; and

WHEREAS, Early diagnosis, research, training, education, and therapies are vital to reducing the effects of Autism; and

WHEREAS, Current research suspects that there is not a single cause that will ultimately be discovered but rather a cluster of factors which include genetics, pregnancy/birth complications, viral infections, metabolic disorders, congenital anomaly syndrome (birth defects), and environmental toxins; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate April 17, 2013, as Autism Day in the State of Illinois to urge both government and its citizenry to become aware and educated on the subject of Autism Spectrum Disorders.
