Perfunctory Session

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2013

At the hour of 4:03 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 680

Offered by Representative Senger:

WHEREAS, The federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act was signed into law by President Barack Obama on March 23, 2010; and

WHEREAS, In February of 2013, the United States Department of Health and Human Services issued approval for the State of Illinois to operate a health insurance marketplace, a key component of the Affordable Care Act, in partnership with the federal government; the marketplace is meant to be a centralized system for individuals and small businesses to purchase insurance policies; and

WHEREAS, Under the partnership marketplace, the State of Illinois maintains responsibility for regulating the insurance market and conducting consumer outreach and assistance, while the federal government is responsible for building and operating the marketplace; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois refused to release information regarding approved marketplace plans and rates prior to the October 1, 2013 open enrollment date, leaving both consumers and consumer assisters unprepared for open enrollment; and

WHEREAS, The marketplaces need to average 39,000 enrollees per day to meet the federal government's goal of 7 million enrollees by March 1, 2013; and

WHEREAS, In the first 2 days of open enrollment, in which the federal marketplace website received heavy traffic, less than 300 people had managed to obtain insurance coverage through the marketplace; and

WHEREAS, Secretary of Health and Human Services Kathleen Sebelius acknowledged in testimony before the United States House of Representatives Energy and Commerce Committee that the dysfunctional website has seriously hampered the rollout of the controversial law; and

WHEREAS, Despite President Obama's promise that those who were content with their current health insurance coverage could keep it, hundreds of thousands of consumers across the country have received notice that their current policy would be canceled; and

WHEREAS, A multitude of the Affordable Care Act's requirements have already been delayed in advance of the law's January 1, 2014 implementation date; these changes include a one-year delay of the "employer mandate", which requires large employers to provide health insurance to their employees, and a one-year delay on the requirement to place caps on out-of-pocket insurance costs; and

WHEREAS, The federal government also announced that there would be delayed enforcement of several eligibility checks for marketplace subsidies; this is allowing consumers to provide necessary financial information to the government on the "honor system"; and

WHEREAS, Obama administration officials have ordered a "tech surge" to address the multitude of issues with the federal marketplace website; they do not expect the website to be fully functioning until at least the end of November; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress, in light of ongoing technological issues and the cancellation of coverage for many Americans, to delay the Affordable Care Act's "individual mandate" requirement for further examination; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Insurance is urged to release any available information regarding the number of people in Illinois whose current health insurance plan was cancelled due to new

Affordable Care Act requirements and the number of people in Illinois who have obtained health insurance coverage through the Illinois marketplace; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor Pat Quinn, Director of the Illinois Department of Insurance Andrew Boron, Director of the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services Julie Hamos, and the members of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 683

Offered by Representatives Daniel Burke:

WHEREAS, November 22, 2013 will mark the 50th anniversary of the assassination of John F. Kennedy, the 35th President of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, President John F. Kennedy was fatally shot by a sniper at 12:30pm standard time on November 22, 1963 while traveling in a presidential limousine through Dealey Plaza in Dallas, Texas; and

WHEREAS, President John F. Kennedy was accompanied in the motorcade by his wife, First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy, along with Texas Governor John Connally, who was wounded by gunfire; and

WHEREAS, Lee Harvey Oswald was arrested in connection with the assassination and was killed 2 days later by Jack Ruby; and

WHEREAS, Elected on January 20, 1961, John F. Kennedy was the only Catholic and the 2nd-youngest President to serve in the White House; and

WHEREAS, Despite his short-lived presidency, John F. Kennedy left behind a remarkable legacy of leadership; and

WHEREAS, President John F. Kennedy will be remembered for many accomplishments, including steering our nation away from the brink of war during the Cuban Missile Crisis, propelling America into the space race, founding the Peace Corps, and championing civil rights for all Americans; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge all churches to toll bells and all schools to designate a moment of silence at the exact hour and minute of November 22, 2013 to mark the occasion of this solemn anniversary; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be made available to those who request it.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 684

Offered by Representative Cross:

WHEREAS, The General Assembly must work to provide efficient transportation methods that will grow the economy and create much-needed jobs in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The Illiana Expressway project is a proposed transportation corridor between the northern portions of Illinois and Indiana; the corridor is expected to be approximately 50 miles in length, with 10 miles of expressway in Indiana and 40 miles of expressway in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The existing I-55 and I-57 highways provide good routes for north-south travel through the area, but there is a lack of comparable east-west routes south of I-80; and

WHEREAS, The Illiana Expressway would provide comparable east-west routes south of I-80 Chicago and be the first public-private partnership in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Public-private partnership projects are the wave of the future; Indiana has already used this model successfully for several projects in their state, including the Chicago Skyway and Ohio River Bridges projects; and

WHEREAS, Public-private partnership projects tend to be built faster, cost less, and are more efficiently constructed than traditional highway projects; the projects allow states to build great projects like the Illiana Corridor with less tax dollars and allow taxpayers to realize all of the benefits of the project at a fraction of the cost; and

WHEREAS, The Illiana Expressway is projected to generate toll revenue that will completely pay for the project and the operation and maintenance of the facility for the term of the projected agreement through 2053; and

WHEREAS, Moving freight is an important part of the Midwestern economy; the Illiana Expressway would provide a bypass for trucks that allows them to travel through the region without passing through the urban areas that currently surround the existing expressways; and

WHEREAS, The Illiana Expressway would serve as a much-needed boost to the economy; the Illinois Department of Transportation has estimated that the project will create 9,000 construction jobs and over 25,000 long-term jobs for the region; and

WHEREAS, The Illiana Expressway would provide the State of Illinois with an opportunity to invest in our future, create jobs, improve traffic safety, and provide a cost effective solution to growing transportation needs; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express our support for the Illiana Expressway project and urge the members of the General Assembly to take the necessary steps to ensure that the expressway is successfully completed; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation, the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority, the policy board for the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning, the Metropolitan Planning Council, the chairpersons of the DuPage, Kane, Kendall, and Lake County Boards, and the Will County Executive.
