WHEREAS, Marvin Wiley's visionary leadership is presently positioning the church to embark on a strategic planning process that will chart and map out the future of the Church for the next 5 to 10 years; and

WHEREAS, Marvin Wiley serves as senior counselor to the Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church in East St. Louis; and

WHEREAS, Marvin Wiley was inducted into the Martin Luther King Jr. Board of Preachers Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia; he also served on the Corporate Board of Directors of the Sunday School Publishing Board of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, Marvin Wiley was recognized for his contributions to the community and honored with an honorary street sign that spans the corners of 12th and Madison through 14th and Madison; he was also recognized in Who's Who In Black Chicago, which showcases the achievements of influential African-American leaders; and

WHEREAS, Marvin Wiley serves as a model of hard work, integrity, and dedication for the people of the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate March 9, 2014 as Marvin E. Wiley Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Marvin Wiley as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 883**

Offered by Representative Lang:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois finds itself in the vortex of a heroin crisis, the signs of which can be found throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, The number of heroin-related deaths in Chicago's collar counties has reached record-breaking levels in recent years; according to the Lake County Coroner's Office, heroin contributed to the deaths of 48 people in Lake County in 2012, up from 42 in 2011; DuPage County reported a record 46 heroin-related deaths in 2013; in suburban Riverside, a couple allegedly were on a heroin binge and found unconscious in an automobile stopped on a railroad crossing; in Will County in 2012, the 53 heroin deaths surpassed the 34 car crash deaths as the leading cause of accidental deaths for the first time since the Will County Coroner's Office began tracking heroin-related fatalities in 1999; in downstate Madison County, 3 victims of heroin overdoses were found within one 5-hour period; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is not alone in its struggle with the heroin crisis; according to the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy, there was a 21% increase in fatal heroin overdoses nationwide from 2006 to 2010; Governor Peter Shumlin of Vermont, where heroin addiction is up 770% since 2000, devoted most of his recent State of the State address to his state's heroin epidemic; and

WHEREAS, The recent arrest of Mexican drug lord Joaquin Guzman was a welcome development in the battle against heroin; his Sinaloa drug cartel is allegedly responsible for the majority of heroin coming into the Chicago region; however, the money to be made by drug traffickers remains too huge for the heroin trade to be stopped by Guzman's arrest; and

WHEREAS, Law enforcement alone cannot end the heroin scourge; State-funding for prevention has been reduced by 88% and treatment by 42% over the past 6 years - during which time the heroin crisis has escalated across the State; the current system of relying on criminal penalties is failing to solve the problem; and

WHEREAS, Oftentimes, addiction to prescription opiates precedes heroin use; and heroin is much cheaper and easier to obtain than drugs such as Oxycontin and Vicodin; and

WHEREAS, Drug cartels are flooding the Chicago market with relatively inexpensive heroin, which is often cheaper and easier to obtain than a six-pack of beer; it can be smoked or snorted, thus decreasing the stigma of the drug, especially with teenagers; fatalities are escalating partly because some heroin is now laced with a high-boosting and hazardous substance, Fentanyl; and

WHEREAS, Family, friends, loved ones, teens, and young adults, whether they are in cities, the suburbs, or rural communities, are all at an increased risk of heroin overdose; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare a Heroin State of Emergency in Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we direct the House Task Force on Heroin Crisis to develop a comprehensive, bold, and durable package of legislative proposals to combat the Illinois heroin crisis; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Governor Pat Quinn, Department of Human Services Secretary Michelle Saddler, House Speaker Michael Madigan, Senate President John Cullerton, and Attorney General Lisa Madigan.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 886**

Offered by Representative Lilly:

WHEREAS, Children and pregnant women are uniquely vulnerable to the health threats of toxic chemicals, and early life chemical exposures have been linked to chronic disease later in life; and

WHEREAS, A growing body of peer-reviewed scientific evidence links exposure to toxic chemicals to many diseases and health conditions that are rising in incidence, including childhood cancers, prostate cancer, breast cancer, learning and developmental disabilities, infertility, and obesity; and

WHEREAS, The President's Cancer Panel report released in May 2010, states, "The true burden of environmentally-induced cancers has been grossly underestimated," and the panel advised President Barack Obama "to use the power of your office to remove the carcinogens and other toxins from our food, water, and air that needlessly increase health care cost, cripple our nation's productivity, and devastate American lives"; and

WHEREAS, Workers in a range of industries are exposed to toxic chemicals which pose threats to their health, increasing worker absenteeism, workers' compensation claims, and health care costs that burden the economy; and

WHEREAS, A recent national poll found that 78% of American voters were seriously concerned about the threat to children's health from exposure to toxic chemicals in day-to-day life; and

WHEREAS, States bear an undue burden from toxic chemicals, including health care costs and environmental damages, disadvantaging businesses that lack information on chemicals in their supply chain, and increasing demands for state regulation; and

WHEREAS, The federal Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 (15 U.S.C Sec. 2601, et seq.), the primary governing federal statute, was intended to authorize the United States Environmental Protection Agency to protect public health and the environment from toxic chemicals; and

WHEREAS, The federal Toxic Substances Control Act has been recognized as having challenges that prevent the Environmental Protection Agency from taking quick and effective regulatory action to protect the public against chemical threats; and

WHEREAS, In January 2009, the United States General Accountability Office added the Environmental Protection Agency's regulatory program for assessing and controlling toxic chemicals to its list of "high risk" government programs that may have some deficiencies; and

WHEREAS, The National Conference of State Legislatures unanimously adopted a resolution in July 2009, that articulated principles for the reform of the Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 and called on the United States Congress to update the law; and

WHEREAS, In August 2010, the Environmental Council of the States, the national association of state environmental agency directors, unanimously adopted a resolution entitled "Reforming the Toxic Substance Control Act", which endorsed specific policy reforms including making certain the Environmental Protection Agency has adequate authority to ensure existing new chemicals are safe; and

WHEREAS, Ten states have come together to launch the Interstate Chemicals Clearinghouse to coordinate state chemical information management programs, and a coalition of 13 states issued guiding principles for the reform of the Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976; and

WHEREAS, Seventy-one state laws on chemical safety have been enacted and signed into law in 18 states with broad bi-partisan support over the last 8 years; and

WHEREAS, The State of California's policy leadership regarding chemical management is outstanding and warrants close examination by Illinois and other states; and

WHEREAS, The Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 Modernization effort presents a rare opportunity to bolster sustainable innovation within the chemical sciences industry to create jobs and eliminate the toxicity of older, more harmful substances; and

WHEREAS, Legislation to substantially reform the Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 was introduced during the 109th Congress in 2005, the 110th Congress in 2008, and again in the 111th Congress in 2010; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we support the efforts of the National Black Caucus of State Legislators in their efforts to modernize the Federal Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 by strengthening chemical management through policy reforms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Governor and the General Assembly to strengthen the State's chemical management statutes.

Offered by Representative Reis:

WHEREAS, The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was a program launched in October of 2010 by the Governor and established under the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority from Fiscal Year 2011 to Fiscal Year 2012; and

WHEREAS, A performance audit, conducted by the Illinois Auditor General, of the first 2 years of the \$54,550,000 Neighborhood Recovery Initiative found pervasive deficiencies in the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority's planning, implementation, and management of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative; and

WHEREAS, In Fiscal Year 2013, the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority was abolished and the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was to be under the direction of the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority; and

WHEREAS, The Fiscal Year 2013 and Fiscal Year 2014 budgets do not contain appropriations to the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, however, appropriations appear in the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority to programs similar to those of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, such as the community based violence prevention program, the After-School program, and the Chicago Area Project; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Auditor General is directed to conduct a performance audit of the State moneys provided by or through the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority to all community based violence prevention programs, the After-School program, and the Chicago Area Project, under contracts or grant agreements in Fiscal Year 2013 and Fiscal Year 2014; and be it further

RESOLVED, The Comptroller is requested to not release funds to the programs until the audit has been finalized; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this performance audit include, but not be limited to, the following determinations:

- (1) the purposes for which State moneys were provided to the Authority for the community based violence prevention programs, the After-School program, and the Chicago Area Project;
- (2) the nature and extend of monitoring by the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority of how the programs used the State-provided moneys and whether certain residential communities of similar crime rates were excluded;
- (3) the actual use of State moneys by the Authority, including the identity of any sub-recipients and the amounts and purposes for employment;
- (4) the number of positions paid through the programs by organizational unit, job title, function, and salary and whether employees completed and filled out appropriate time sheets;
- (5) the number of positions supervised or managed by each management position and whether any of those employees are supervised or managed by more than one management position;
- (6) whether, through a review of available documentation, the programs have met or is meeting the purposes for which the State moneys were provided, with specific information concerning the programs staffing levels, hiring procedures, and its compensation of employees; and
- (7) whether the programs are in compliance with the applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements pertaining to the program's receipt of state moneys; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority and any other State agency or other entity or person that may have information relevant to this audit cooperate fully and promptly with the Auditor General's Office in its audit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Auditor General commence this audit as soon as practical and report its findings and recommendations upon completion in accordance with the provisions of Section 3-14 of the Illinois State Auditing Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Auditor General.
