The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Representative Lang in the chair.

Prayer by Pastor Marvin Joyner, who is with Living Word Evangelistic Ministries in Decatur, Illinois. Representative Brady led the House in the Pledge of Allegiance.

By direction of the Speaker, a roll call was taken to ascertain the attendance of Members, as follows: 111 present. (ROLL CALL 1)

By unanimous consent, Representatives Arroyo, Pihos, Schmitz, Sosnowski and Tracy were excused from attendance.

At the hour of 11:47 o'clock a.m., Representative Cavaletto was excused for the remainder of the day.

The membership of the House was temporarily reduced to 117 as a result of the vacancy created by the resignation of Representative Farnham on March 19, 2014.

CHANGE OF SPONSORSHIP

With the consent of the affected members, Representative Madigan was removed as principal sponsor, and Representative Drury became the new principal sponsor of HOUSE BILL 802.

With the consent of the affected members, Representative Madigan was removed as principal sponsor, and Representative Drury became the new principal sponsor of HOUSE BILL 671.

With the consent of the affected members, Representative Farnham was removed as principal sponsor, and Representative Jefferson became the new principal sponsor of HOUSE RESOLUTION 851.

(ROLL CALL 2)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

On motion of Representative Jakobsson, HOUSE BILL 4283 was taken up and read by title a third time. And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 101, Yeas; 9, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

HOUSE RESOLUTION 933

Offered by Representative Williams:

WHEREAS, Epilepsy is a neurological disorder producing brief disturbances in the normal electrical functions of the brain that temporarily affects a person's consciousness, bodily movements, or sensations, while creating long-term effects on the lifestyle of individuals with epilepsy; and

WHEREAS, One in 26 people will develop epilepsy and one in 10 people will have an epileptic seizure during his or her lifetime; and

WHEREAS, Epilepsy can affect anyone regardless of their gender, race, age, religion, educational background, or socioeconomic status; and

WHEREAS, More people suffer from epilepsy than from Parkinson's Disease, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy, and cerebral palsy combined; and

WHEREAS, Epilepsy affects more than 65 million people worldwide; and

WHEREAS, Although there is no known cure for epilepsy, existing drug therapy, surgery, and other nonpharmacological treatments enable approximately 80% of individuals with epilepsy to lead normal lives with no seizures or a significant reduction in seizures; and

WHEREAS, Epilepsy is a complex disorder that requires further research to find a cure and prevention; and

WHEREAS, The public is often unable to recognize common seizure types or to respond with appropriate first aid; and

WHEREAS, The annual observance of Purple Day on March 26 advocates for the rights, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons with epilepsy, while raising awareness with families, professionals, and the general public to better understand this lifelong disorder; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate March 26, 2014 as "Purple Day" and invite all citizens to participate by wearing purple; and be it further

RESOLVED, We call upon all citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses, and schools to recommit our community to increasing awareness and understanding of epilepsy through education while ensuring that all individuals with epilepsy lead a full and productive life; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Kurt W. Florian, Jr., President and Chief Executive Officer of the Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Chicago, as an expression of our support for the purposes and goals of "Purple Day".

HOUSE RESOLUTION 934

Offered by Representative McSweeney:

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 2696 of the 98th General Assembly has been proposed to dissolve the Fox Waterway Agency; and

WHEREAS, Many have significant concerns on how Senate Bill 2696 will negatively affect real estate values and quality of life issues along the Fox River and the Chain of Lakes; and

WHEREAS, The Fox Waterway Agency is not funded with any tax dollars and the Agency's primary source of funds are user fees and grants used to fund specific projects designed to improve the waterways within the Agency's area, which it has been undertaking successfully since its founding in 1984; and

WHEREAS, The Fox Waterway Agency has been successfully working with the State to provide dredging and related services to the waterway and boating public, and no State department is currently equipped to handle such tasks; and

WHEREAS, On average, the Fox Waterway Agency annually dredges 100,000 cubic yards of silt from the waterway to provide boater access to the water; and

WHEREAS, The Fox Waterway Agency, being a local government body, has been able to focus specifically on the Chain of Lakes, its 45 miles of waterways, and over 30 bodies of water, and to quickly address issues arising within the Chain of Lakes to continually enhance the quality of the Chain of Lakes; and

WHEREAS, The Fox Waterway Agency has been implementing necessary and reasonable rules to improve and maintain the recreational boating resources of the waterway area to help control flooding of land adjacent to the waterways and prevent waterway pollution, to enhance or improve the quality of the waterway, and to promote tourism; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 2696 seeks to dissolve the Fox Waterway Agency, an agency made up of dedicated local officials who are in the best position to make relevant decisions and react quickly to best serve the people who the Fox Waterway and Chain of Lakes serves; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we object to the passage and enactment of Senate Bill 2696 and encourage all Illinois State Legislators to vote against the bill; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Fox Waterway Agency Chairman Wayne D. Blake.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 87

Offered by Representative Brauer:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has been in economic turmoil for years and has gained notoriety across the country for spending outside of its means and falling into enormous debt that burdens Illinois's taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has a total debt of \$187,000,000,000 equaling roughly \$40,000 in debt per household in the State; and

WHEREAS, A recent Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability report estimates Illinois's unfunded pension liabilities alone total \$100,500,000,000; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Comptroller has reported that the State currently has \$7,000,000,000 in unpaid bills and \$30,000,000,000 in bond debt; and

WHEREAS, In 2011, as a promise to Illinois taxpayers to pay off debt and to stabilize the State's economy, Illinois lawmakers pushed through a record income tax increase that raised the income tax rate on individuals to 5% from 3%, and on corporations to 7% from 4.8%; and

WHEREAS, Since the tax increase was passed, Illinois's pension debt has grown and the State's economy has struggled due to increased spending; and

WHEREAS, The tax increases and irresponsible borrowing have forced businesses and residents to flee the State for more tax friendly and financially stable states that offer more hope for success; and

WHEREAS, The citizens of Illinois have been calling upon their elected officials to stand against wasteful spending and to assure its citizens that the Illinois General Assembly is ready to make the necessary changes to put Illinois on the path to prosperity while giving a much needed relief to taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, Real solutions exist to Illinois's massive debt and spending problems and these solutions exist without increasing the already high tax burden on its citizens; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Illinois Legislature is encouraged not spend outside of its projected 2014-2015 revenue estimate of \$34,495,000,000 as acknowledged in HJR80 of this General Assembly and that every legislator in this State recognize that Illinois can no longer spend more money than it brings in through revenue and can no longer ask its citizens to bear the burden of government misspending; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Legislature is urged to keep its promise and allow the temporary tax increase to sunset on January 1, 2015 as scheduled and to enact real spending reforms.
