Representative Christian Mitchell introduced the following:

**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 49**

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Section 3 of Article IX of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

**ARTICLE IX
REVENUE**

SECTION 3. LIMITATIONS ON INCOME TAXATION

(a) ~~There may be one tax on the income of individuals and corporations. This may be a fair tax where lower rates apply to lower income levels and higher rates apply to higher income levels. No government other than the State may impose a tax on or measured by income. A tax on or measured by income shall be at a non-graduated rate. At any one time there may be no more than one such tax imposed by the State for State purposes on individuals and one such tax so imposed on corporations. In any such tax imposed upon corporations the rate shall not exceed the rate imposed on individuals by more than a ratio of 8 to 5.~~

(b) Laws imposing taxes on or measured by income may adopt by reference provisions of the laws and regulations of the United States, as they then exist or thereafter may be changed, for the purpose of arriving at the amount of income upon which the tax is imposed.

WHEREAS, Over the past 10 years, TAP has grown and developed into the largest statewide autism resource and service network in the nation; and

WHEREAS, TAP currently operates centers or other programs in partnership with the University of Illinois - Urbana/Champaign, the University of Illinois - Chicago, Illinois State University, Southern Illinois University, Easter Seals Metropolitan Chicago, Easter Seals Rockford, Easter Seals Peoria/Bloomington, RCADD - Chicago, Trinity Services, Kreider Services, the Charleston Transitional Facility, UCP Heartland, FASTT - Maryville, Little Friends, Inc., Have Dreams, and the Hope Institute; and

WHEREAS, TAP has provided direct services to more than 7,000 Illinois families and trained more than 61,000 family members, educators, health care providers, day care providers, and first responders; and

WHEREAS, The TAP service model has been validated by researchers at Baylor University; many major national organizations have sought partnership with TAP; and

WHEREAS, Despite TAP's many accomplishments, there remains much unmet need, with more work to be done in Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we congratulate the members of TAP and its many partners for their dedicated service to the families of Illinois and pledge our continuing support to Illinois families impacted by autism; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we designate the date of April 2, 2014 as World Autism Awareness Day in the State of Illinois.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 971

Offered by Representative Sims:

WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, was founded on December 4, 1906, by 7 college men, respectfully known as the "Seven Jewels", on the campus of Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, becoming the first intercollegiate Greek-letter fraternity established by and for African-Americans; and

WHEREAS, The Seven Jewels of the Fraternity, Henry Arthur Callis, Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle Jones, George Biddle Kelley, Nathaniel Allison Murray, Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy, recognized the need for a strong bond of brotherhood among African descendants in this country while stressing academic excellence among its members; the founders recognized the need to help correct the educational, economic, political, and social injustices faced by African-Americans and other people of color; and

WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha initially served as a study and support group for minority students who faced racial prejudice, both educationally and socially, at Cornell University; the Jewel Founders and early leaders of the Fraternity succeeded in laying a firm foundation for Alpha Phi Alpha's principles of scholarship, fellowship, good character, and the uplifting of humanity; and

WHEREAS, Since its founding, Alpha Phi Alpha has consistently supplied its voice and vision to the struggle of African-Americans, people of color, and issues of civil rights around the world; and

WHEREAS, The aims of Alpha Phi Alpha are manly deeds, scholarship, and love for all mankind; and

WHEREAS, The mission of Alpha Phi Alpha is to develop leaders, promote brotherhood and academic excellence, and provide service and advocacy for communities, as exemplified through its national programs, which include "Go to High School, Go to College", which focus on the educational achievement of students in elementary, secondary, and post-secondary schools and has given thousands of dollars in scholarship funds to deserving students; "Project Alpha", which teaches teenage pregnancy prevention and sexually transmitted disease prevention to young males, and the "A Voteless People is a Hopeless People" voter registration and education program, through which thousands of voters have been educated and registered; Alpha Phi Alpha also focuses on providing service through its strategic partnerships with Big Brothers Big Sisters, the Boy Scouts of America, the March of Dimes, the American Heart/American Stroke Association, and the American Cancer Society; and

Trotter and Representatives Al Riley, Arthur Turner, Jr., Emanuel "Chris" Welch, and Elgie R. Sims, Jr., who also serves as the 26th Vice President of the Midwestern Region; and

WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha continues to enrich the lives of its members, who, in turn, provide service and advocacy for the communities they serve with a commitment to service and the uplifting of humanity; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize and honor the 2014 Alpha Phi Alpha Day held at the Illinois State Capitol and welcome the members of Alpha Phi Alpha to the Capitol; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we designate the date of May 14, 2014 as Alpha Phi Alpha Day in the State of Illinois in honor of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, and its continued service and impact on the communities it serves; and be it further

HOUSE RESOLUTION 972

Offered by Representative William Davis:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives are pleased to congratulate the University of Illinois Extension-Cook County on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of its founding; and

WHEREAS, The Smith-Lever Act of 1914 codified into federal law, and provided funding outreach endeavors at the Land-Grant Universities founded by the Morrill Act of 1862; the appropriation for Cooperative Extension as established by Smith-Lever was unique in that it set up a shared partnership among federal, state, and county levels of government; a formula funding mechanism was designed to insure that there was support from each of the levels to help the fledgling system achieve stability and leverage resources; and

WHEREAS, The original formula called for federal funding to be divided in the following manner: 20% shared by all states in equal proportions, 40% shared in the proportion that the rural population of each bears to the total rural population of the several states as determined by the census, and 40% shared in the proportion that the farm population of each bears to the total farm population of the several states as determined by the census; and

WHEREAS, The original formula called for federal funding to be divided in a manner based on the agrarian society; in the 1980s, the University of Illinois Extension-Cook County responded to societal problems which included urban issues; the Extension's funds were comprised of 47% State funds, 32% federal funds, and 18% local funds; and

WHEREAS, The University of Illinois Extension-Cook County continues to provide residents with programs to address urban issues, and in the 1990s, the expansion of urban areas increased; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the continued work the University of Illinois Extension-Cook County does to address the educational programs for the residents of Cook County, congratulate it on its 100th anniversary, and declare May 2014 as a month of celebration; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the University of Illinois Extension-Cook County as a symbol of our respect and esteem.
