HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

HOUSE RESOLUTION 976

Offered by Representative Costello:

WHEREAS, For decades, Du Quoin mayors and city councils worked without success to procure State and federal funding to build an overpass across the mainline Illinois Central Railroad tracks; and

WHEREAS, Without an overpass, traffic on Main and Popular Streets was unnecessarily blocked by numerous daily freight, coal, and passenger trains frequently delaying emergency services to significant portions of town; and

WHEREAS, The Honorable John E. Rednour, Mayor of the City of Du Quoin from 1989 to 2013, successfully secured funding for construction of the overpass; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Rednour led a walking procession across the completed overpass in 1995; and

WHEREAS, The Popular Street Overpass contributes daily to the smooth, timely, and safe passage of commercial and private traffic through the city and increases emergency access to all parts of Du Quoin; and

WHEREAS, Without the effective leadership of Mayor Rednour in securing the funding necessary to build the Popular Street Overpass, at little or no expense to the people of Du Quoin, the project would not have been possible; and

WHEREAS, On March 10, 2014, the City of Du Quoin renamed the Popular Street Overpass after former mayor, John E. Rednour, in honor of his many accomplishments while in office, most notably, the construction of the overpass; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we recognize the City of Du Quoin on renaming the Popular Street Overpass after former mayor, John E. Rednour; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Du Quoin Mayor Rex Duncan and to the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 980

Offered by Representative Nekritz:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois recognizes the significant impact of its spiritual leaders and pays particular honor to its native born sons; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois values the contribution of such individuals and extols the virtue of them as a means of communicating its honor of such citizens as role models for all; and

WHEREAS, Rabbi Daniel Moscovitz, of blessed memory, was born and raised in Illinois and returned home to direct the operation of and oversee the expansion of the activities of Lubavitch Chabad of Illinois, the regional headquarters of the worldwide Lubavitch movement; he subsequently expanded the movement from a single office in Chicago into 40 centers of goodness and kindness spanning the State from Carbondale to Gurnee; and

WHEREAS, The importance of leadership and devotion to home and community are primary values we cherish and uphold; these values were embodied in Rabbi Moscovitz; and

WHEREAS, Rabbi Moscovitz was beloved by an entire community across the State and across all denominational factions; and

WHEREAS, Rabbi Daniel Moscovitz is survived by his wife, Esther Rochel; his children, Mrs. Shterna Sara Newman, Rabbi Meir Shimon Moscovitz, Rabbi Yosef Shmuel Moscovitz, Rabbi Yehoshua Zelik Moscovitz, Mrs. Rivkah Sternberg, Mrs. Chana Teldon, Mrs. Chava Kagan, Rabbi Leibel Moscovitz, and Mrs. Chaya Mushka Hecht; his parents; and his brothers, Rabbi Moshe Moscovitz, Eli Moscovitz, and Rabbi Mendel Moscovitz; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we, along with his family and friends, mourn the passing of Rabbi Daniel Moscovitz; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we designate April 9, 2014 as "Kindness and Goodness Day" in the State of Illinois in honor of Rabbi Moscovitz and his work; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Lubavitch-Chabad movement as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 984

Offered by Representative Cross:

WHEREAS, Laxative abuse occurs when a person attempts to get rid of unwanted calories, lose weight, "feel thin", or "feel empty" through the repeated, frequent use of laxatives; and

WHEREAS, The belief that laxatives are effective for weight control is a myth; and

WHEREAS, Often, laxatives are misused following eating binges, when the individual mistakenly believes that the laxatives will work to rush food and calories through the gut and bowels before they can be absorbed; and

WHEREAS, Laxative abuse is serious and dangerous - often resulting in a variety of health complications and sometimes causing life-threatening conditions; and

WHEREAS, According to the National Institute of Mental Health, 2.7% of American teens aged 13-18 suffer from a severe eating disorder; and

WHEREAS, Research shows that 10 to 60% of people with eating disorders also abuse laxatives; and

WHEREAS, According to a study done by the American Journal of Psychiatry, mortality rates for eating disorders were 4% for anorexia nervosa, 3.9% for bulimia nervosa, and 5.2% for eating disorders not otherwise specified; and

WHEREAS, Teens who are expected to achieve significantly low weights due to athletics have also been known to abuse laxatives in order to reduce the water weight in their body before performances and weigh-ins; and

WHEREAS, Laxatives as a drug have the properties of tolerance and withdrawal, allowing users to become dependent on them; and

WHEREAS, The Food and Drug Administration has issued a warning about the use of sodium phosphate laxatives; and

WHEREAS, Overcoming laxative abuse requires working with a team of health professionals who have expertise in treating eating disorders, including a general physician, a psychiatrist, psychologist or counselor, and a registered dietician; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that there is created the Task Force on Laxative Abuse within the Department of Human Services Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse to develop a statewide plan to prevent the abuse of laxatives, particularly among minors; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of Task Force shall be appointed by the Secretary of Human Services no later than July 1, 2014; the Task Force shall include:

- (1) the Director of the Department of Human Services Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse or his or her designee;
- (2) the Director of the Department of Public Health or his or her designee;
- (3) the Superintendent of the State Board of Education or his or her designee;
- (4) two persons from families effected by eating disorders or laxative abuse;
- (5) two persons who are recovering from an eating disorder or laxative abuse;
- (6) two persons representing a national eating disorders association;
- (7) two persons representing statewide associations representing nurses;
- (8) two persons representing statewide education associations;
- (9) one person representing a statewide organization representing pediatricians;
- (10) one person representing a statewide organization representing family physicians;
- (11) one person representing a statewide organization representing psychiatrists;
- (12) one person representing a statewide association representing retailers; and
- (13) one person representing a statewide association representing merchants; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Human Services shall facilitate the Task Force and provide the Task Force with administrative support; the Department shall convene the Task Force at least three times and issue a report with findings and recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor no later than January 1, 2015; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor and the Secretary of the Department of Human Services.
