HOUSE RESOLUTION 1069

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, Too many minor offenders, especially drug offenders, are sentenced to terms of imprisonment in county jails and the Department of Corrections; and

WHEREAS, Many offenders are sentenced to imprisonment for possession of small quantities of controlled substances; and

WHEREAS, These sentences disproportionately impact the poor and disadvantaged; and

WHEREAS, The costs of incarceration exceed the costs of home confinement and treatment; and

WHEREAS, Confinement of these offenders in jail or the Department of Corrections diverts resources that should be devoted to protecting the public from violent offenders; and

WHEREAS, Attitudes toward drug addiction have changed over the years; and

WHEREAS, Drug addiction is as much a medical problem as a criminal justice issue; and

WHEREAS, Treatment is a preferred disposition to jail time for persons convicted of possession of small quantities of controlled substances; and

WHEREAS, We urge prosecutors and judges to consider home confinement to jail time for these low level drug offenders; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Governor and the Department of Corrections to discourage prosecutors from recommending and judges from sentencing low level drug offenders to the county jail or the Department of Corrections; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Governor and the Director of Corrections to do everything in their power to have low level drug offenders currently serving sentences in Department of Corrections facilities released to home confinement; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor and to the Director of Corrections.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1073

Offered by Representative Bradley:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois currently has 98,353 Medicare eligible retired state employees, teachers, and community college employees who participate in a State health insurance plan; and

WHEREAS, Beginning February 1, 2014, all participating members currently eligible for Medicare must participate in a Medicare Advantage health insurance plan instead of their previous health insurance plan; and

WHEREAS, Due to changing health insurance plans, certain circumstances may force individuals to modify their current health care providers or face increased obstacles to continue with current providers; and

WHEREAS, Individuals have often cultivated relationships over many years with their current medical professionals; and

WHEREAS, The relationship between an individual and his or her doctor often includes knowledge of past treatments, a history of that individual's condition, and a level of trust developed over many years; and

WHEREAS, A disruption in such a relationship between an individual and his or her doctor can be detrimental, especially to the State's elderly population; and

WHEREAS, Such changes can cause members to no longer receive necessary medical procedures, medications, or medical devices in a timely manner; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the members of this body to give further consideration to allowing Medicare eligible members who participate in a State health insurance plan to remain in a Quality Care Health Plan rather than automatically being enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, to assure there will be no disruption in the healthcare relationships such members have previously established or in the receipt of necessary medical procedures, medications, and/or medical devices; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Department of Central Management Services to continue to work with members to aid in the best possible transition to a new health insurance plan as long as such a change is required; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Department of Central Management Services.

WHEREAS, Insurance protects the United States economy from the adverse effects of the risks inherent in economic growth and development while also providing the resources necessary to rebuild physical and economic infrastructure, offer indemnification for business disruption, and provide coverage for medical and liability costs from injuries and loss of life in the event of catastrophic losses to persons or property; and

WHEREAS, The terrorist attack of September 11, 2001 produced insured losses larger than any natural or man-made event in history; claims paid by insurers to their policyholders eventually totaled some \$32.5 billion, making this the second most costly insurance event in United States history; and

WHEREAS, The sheer enormity of the terrorist-induced loss, combined with the possibility of future attacks, produced financial shockwaves that shook insurance markets, causing insurers and reinsurers to exclude coverage arising from acts of terrorism from virtually all commercial property and liability policies; and

WHEREAS, The lack of terrorism risk insurance contributed to a paralysis in the economy, especially in construction, tourism, business travel, and real estate finance; and

WHEREAS, The United States Congress originally passed the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act of 2002, Pub. L. 107-297 (TRIA), in which the federal government agreed to provide terrorism reinsurance to insurers and reauthorized this arrangement via the Terrorism Risk Insurance Extension Act of 2005, Pub. L. 109-144, and the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2007, Pub. L. 110-160 (TRIPRA); and

WHEREAS, Under TRIPRA, the federal government provides such reinsurance after industry-wide losses attributable to annual certified terrorism events exceed \$100 million; and

WHEREAS, Coverage under TRIPRA is provided to an individual insurer after the insurer has incurred losses related to terrorism equal to 20% of the insurer's previous year earned premium for property-casualty lines; and

WHEREAS, After an individual insurer has reached such a threshold, the insurer pays 15% of residual losses and the federal government pays the remaining 85%; and

WHEREAS, The Terrorism Risk Insurance Program has an annual cap of \$100 billion of aggregate insured losses, beyond which the federal program does not provide coverage; and

WHEREAS, TRIPRA requires the federal government to recoup 100% of the benefits provided under the program via policy holder surcharges to the extent the aggregate insured losses are less than \$27.5 billion and enables the government to recoup expenditures beyond that mandatory recoupment amount; and

WHEREAS, Without question, TRIA and its successors are the principal reason for the continued stability in the insurance and reinsurance market for terrorism insurance to the benefit of our overall economy; and

WHEREAS, The presence of a robust private/public partnership has provided stability and predictability and has allowed insurers to actively participate in the market in a meaningful way; and

WHEREAS, Without a program such as TRIPRA, many citizens who want and need terrorism coverage to operate their businesses all across the nation would be either unable to get insurance or unable to afford the limited coverage that would be available; and

WHEREAS, Without federally provided reinsurance, property and casualty insurers will face less availability of terrorism reinsurance and will therefore be severely restricted in their ability to provide sufficient coverage for acts of terrorism to support our economy; and

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, despite the hard work and dedication of this nation's counterterrorism agencies and the bravery of the men and women in uniform who fought and continue to fight battles abroad to keep us safe here at home, the threat from terrorist attacks in the United States is both real and substantial and will remain as such for the foreseeable future; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress and the President of the United States to reauthorize the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore and the Secretary of the United States Senate, and the members of the Illinois congressional delegation.
