HOUSE RESOLUTION 1078

Offered by Representative David Harris:

WHEREAS, The Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability is the highly-respected legislative support agency that closely tracks the revenue received by the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability recently released its monthly briefing for the month ending April 2014; and

WHEREAS, In that briefing, the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability revised its estimate of the revenue that will be received into the General Revenue Fund for the current Fiscal Year 2014; and

WHEREAS, That revised revenue estimate is \$36,661,000,000; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois House of Representatives passed House Resolution 389 on May 31, 2013, establishing an estimated revenue figure for Fiscal Year 2014 of \$35,446,000,000; and

WHEREAS, The Fiscal Year 2014 budget that was passed by the General Assembly was built on the \$35,446,000,000 figure; and

WHEREAS, The new revenue estimate by the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability is \$1,215,000,000 higher than the revenue estimate on which the budget was constructed; and

WHEREAS, The State is now less than 60 days from the end of its current fiscal year, meaning that the agencies and departments of government have operated on the budget that was enacted in May of 2013; and WHEREAS, It is well known that the State has several billions of dollars in unpaid old bills which it is obligated to pay; and

WHEREAS, Using the increase in revenues that are now estimated to flow into the General Revenue Fund for Fiscal Year 2014 would allow the State to substantially pay down its backlog of old bills; therefore, be it RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Comptroller to use all revenues in excess of the \$35,446,000,000 on which the Fiscal Year 2014 budget was constructed to pay outstanding old bills that the State is obligated to pay; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution refers to all General Revenue funds above the \$35,446,000,000 budgeted level that have not heretofore been appropriated in supplemental appropriations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Comptroller of the State of Illinois.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1079

Offered by Representative Moffitt:

WHEREAS, Recognizing that work remains to be done to aid the high number of unemployed and underemployed individuals, the State of Illinois and the federal government have announced major initiatives to promote workforce development activities; and

WHEREAS, These activities are primarily aimed at helping individuals acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to pursue a career in today's competitive job market; and

WHEREAS, As part of these efforts, the State will be promoting a new initiative to increase the work readiness of individuals by obtaining a college degree or career certificate; and

WHEREAS, At the federal level, major efforts are being made to review the nation's workforce and training system to make it more job-driven, integrated, and effective; and

WHEREAS, A key aspect in the State and federal efforts is the active involvement of the private business sector; and

WHEREAS, Workforce Investment Boards provide businesses with an important forum to inform training providers, including the public education system, community colleges, State University systems, and proprietary schools, of the needs of the local business community; and

WHEREAS, Workforce Investment Boards were established by federal law to serve as a vital provider of information, programs, and services to individuals seeking employment, employers, and training providers; and

WHEREAS, Under the authority provided to Workforce Investment Boards, opportunities and funds are available for individuals to enroll in training programs and services at Job Centers throughout the State that give priority to the local business community's current and future needs; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that the Illinois House of Representatives continues to support the role that Workforce Investment Boards play in strengthening their local communities and, by extension, the State of Illinois and the nation; and

WHEREAS, The week of August 25 through August 31, 2014 will be an opportunity for Workforce Investment Boards to highlight and promote the many ways in which they are undertaking this important work; therefore, be it

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1081

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, Quality education that is free from intimidation and terror is a universal right that is of vital importance to human society and a cornerstone of human rights; and

WHEREAS, On April 14, 2014, Boko Haram militants attacked the Chibok Government Girls Secondary School in Borno State, Nigeria and abducted almost 300 female students from the campus; the terrorists subsequently drove them away from Chibok in pickup trucks into the Sambisa Forest; and

WHEREAS, For the past 3 weeks, the Nigerian military has sought these militants and their captives, with little apparent success; and

WHEREAS, Some of the kidnapped girls have been forced into "marriage" with their Boko Haram abductors, while others have been taken across borders to Cameroon and Chad; two of the girls have died from snakebite and about 20 other girls are ill; and

WHEREAS, The United States government has issued a statement of concern over the fate of the missing students, but sterner action may be required to free the students from their captors and assert the freedom of education for all; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge President Obama to do everything in America's power to assist for the release and return of the young ladies abducted by Boko Haram militants; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to President Barack Obama.
