At the hour of 3:07 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

SENATE BILLS ON FIRST READING

Having been reproduced, the following bill was taken up, read by title a first time and placed in the Committee on Rules: SENATE BILL 3033 (Mayfield).

SENATE RESOLUTIONS

The following Senate Joint Resolution, received from the Senate, was read by the Clerk and referred to the Committee on Rules: SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 48 (Tracy) and 49 (Pritchard).

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1110

Offered by Representative Bill Mitchell:

WHEREAS, The Mahomet Aquifer is an aquifer located in east-central Illinois; the aquifer covers an area of over 4,000 square miles in Champaign, DeWitt, Ford, Iroquois, Logan, Macon, McLean, Piatt, Sangamon, Tazewell, and Vermilion counties; and

WHEREAS, The Mahomet Aquifer is a vital source of drinking water for the residents of east-central Illinois, as well as a source for irrigation and industrial use water; and

WHEREAS, The Mahomet Aquifer supplies, on average, 340 million gallons per day of clean consumable water; and

WHEREAS, The population of east-central Illinois residents who depend on the Mahomet Aquifer is expected to grow from a current total of 100,000 to 900,000 by 2050; and

WHEREAS, Any pollution or contamination of the water of the Mahomet Aquifer would be detrimental to all of the residents of east-central Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The United States Environmental Protection Agency is responsible for designating aquifers as Sole Source Aquifers, which helps to protect aquifers from federally-funded projects that may contaminate groundwater; and

WHEREAS, The Mahomet Aquifer is too important of a source of consumable water for the residents of east-central Illinois to be compromised by potential contamination; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States Environmental Protection Agency to classify the Mahomet Aquifer as a Sole Source Aquifer in order protect the residents of east-central Illinois and ensure they have clean drinking water for future generations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution are presented to United States Environmental Protection Agency Region 5 Coordinator William Spaulding, the members of the Illinois congressional delegation, and the Governor.

Offered by Representative Senger:

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD) is a recessive form of muscular dystrophy that causes muscle weakness with symptoms beginning in early childhood and has no cure; and

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is caused by a mutation in the dystrophin gene, located on the X chromosome, which is spread to the child through genetics affecting around 1 in 3,600 boys; women can also carry the gene, but typically do not show the effects of DMD; and

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is not first noticeable at birth, with symptoms usually showing early signs around ages 1-3, but symptoms progressively increase as the child grows older; and

WHEREAS, The early signs of Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy are the child having difficulty walking and running; when holding the child you can feel a looseness of muscles; calf muscles look bulky, but are weak; as the child grows older, they use their hands to help themselves get up; the child's speech development may also be delayed; and

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy can affect boys from any background and is not more prevalent in any race, culture, or socioeconomic background compared to another; and

WHEREAS, There is no cure for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, but treatments exist which have made great progress to help people living with this disease; and

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is a fatal disorder, with those who are affected having a life expectancy of around 25 years; living with this disease is incredibly difficult for the child and their families; and

WHEREAS, The Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy was established in 1994 to help families living with this disease, bring awareness to the public, and raise funds to expand research for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy; and

WHEREAS, The 20th annual conference of the Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy will be held June 26-29 in Chicago; this conference brings families from around the world together to learn about the progress being made in the fight to end Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate the week of June 23-29, 2014 as Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Week in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1113

Offered by Representative Scherer:

WHEREAS, Recognizing that work remains to be done to aid the high number of unemployed and underemployed individuals, the State of Illinois and the federal government have announced major initiatives to promote workforce development activities; and

WHEREAS, These activities are primarily aimed at helping individuals acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to pursue a career in today's competitive job market; and

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1114

Offered by Representative Brown:

WHEREAS, ALS (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis) is a devastating progressive neurodegenerative disease which destroys the ability to walk, speak, eat, and breathe; ALS is sometimes referred to as Lou Gehrig's disease, named after Lou Gehrig, a famous baseball first basemen, whose career was stopped in 1939 when he developed ALS at the age of 36; and

WHEREAS, ALS affects the body by attacking nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord; typical symptoms of ALS include the inability to walk, speak, eat, and even breathe; paralysis can also develop; after the onset of this disease, fatality usually occurs within 2 to 5 years; and

WHEREAS, Every day, an average of 15 people are newly diagnosed with ALS - more than 5,600 people per year; as many as 30,000 Americans may currently be affected by ALS; annually, ALS is responsible for two deaths per 100,000 people; ALS typically affects people over the age of 40, including those who previously enjoyed excellent health in the prime of their lives; ALS is indiscriminate in the types of people who will be affected by it; and

WHEREAS, At present, there is no known treatment or cure for ALS; if a cure or greater understanding of ALS is achieved, then it is likely that this will benefit research into related conditions like Parkinson's, Huntington's, and Alzheimer's disease; and

WHEREAS, Established in 2008, 'ALS Across America' aims to raise awareness about ALS by sharing with the media and public the experiences that people throughout the United States have with ALS; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate the month of May 2014 as ALS Awareness Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the citizens of the State of Illinois to become more aware of the plight of people with this serious disease, support those with this condition, and help to further research into finding a cure.
