CHANGE OF SPONSORSHIP

With the consent of the affected members, Representative Madigan was removed as principal sponsor, and Representative Nekritz became the new principal sponsor of HOUSE BILL 404.

With the consent of the affected members, Representative Soto was removed as principal sponsor, and Representative Lang became the new principal sponsor of SENATE BILL 221.

With the consent of the affected members, Representative Gordon-Booth was removed as principal sponsor, and Representative Welch became the new principal sponsor of HOUSE BILL 3232.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1134

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, Research has found that non-violent youth are less likely to become further involved in criminal behavior if they remain in their home communities and if appropriate services are available that address underlying needs such as mental illness, substance abuse, learning disabilities, unstable living arrangements, and dysfunctional parenting; it has also been demonstrated that it is less expensive than a sentence to the Department of Juvenile Justice; and

WHEREAS, Redeploy Illinois is designed to provide services to youth between the ages of 13 and 18 who are at high risk of being committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice; a fiscal incentive is provided to counties to provide services to youth within their home communities by building a continuum of care for youth who are in the juvenile justice system; counties link youth to a wide array of needed services and supports within the home community, as indicated through an individualized needs assessment; services are provided in the least restrictive manner possible, and can include case management, court advocacy, education assistance, individual/family/group counseling, and crisis intervention; and

WHEREAS, The average annual cost to serve a youth in the Redeploy program in 2013 was approximately 6% of the annual cost to house a youth in the Department of Juvenile Justice; in 2013, the average per capita cost to house a youth at the Department of Juvenile Justice was a reported \$111,000; in 2013, 352 youth

received full Redeploy Illinois program services with an appropriation of \$2,385,100; this equates to an annual Redeploy program cost per youth of \$6,776; in 2012, 238 fewer youth were committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice because of the Redeploy Illinois program, saving Illinois taxpayers nearly \$11.7 million in unnecessary incarceration costs for 2012; the Redeploy Illinois program reduced overall Department of Juvenile Justice commitments in the 4 pilot sites by nearly 50% (599 fewer youth) over the 5 years relative to the 3-year baseline average; research found that court evaluation commitments to the Department of Juvenile Justice in these sites were reduced by 87% over the 5 years relative to the 3-year baseline average; in the first 8 years of the program, participating counties sent 1,036 juveniles to the Department of Juvenile Justice; this was a steep decline from the projected 2,268 youth that were likely to have been sent based on the previous 3-year commitment trend; it represents a 54% reduction in Department of Juvenile Justice commitments over the life of the program; through 2012, the Redeploy program diverted 1,232 youth saving the State a conservative \$60,000,000 in unnecessary incarceration costs; each funded Redeploy Illinois program site is required by statute and contract to reduce its commitments to the Department of Juvenile Justice by a minimum of 25% compared to their baseline; in 2012, compared to the 3-year baseline, the 8 Redeploy Illinois program sites in operation combined to reduce eligible Department of Juvenile Justice commitments in their counties by 64%; and

WHEREAS, Based on its success, the Redeploy Illinois program was expanded from 4 sites to 8 in January 2009; serving nearly 25% of all Illinois counties, the Redeploy sites continued to effectively reduce the incarceration of hundreds of youth while also holding the line on the use of local detention; many counties in Illinois lack the resources to effectively serve delinquent youth locally; a lack of local programs and services plays a significant role in the court's decision to commit a youth to a correctional facility; and

WHEREAS, The funds provided to the Redeploy sites fills the gaps in their continuum of services, allowing them to cost-effectively serve youth in their home communities and reduce the system's reliance on corrections; this progressive effort to build on the work done in other states such as Ohio and Pennsylvania, which successfully reduced juvenile incarceration rates through similarly structured programs, is paying off; 2010 cost benefit analysis indicated that on average, the 8 Redeploy sites reduced their commitments in 2010 by 53% from their baselines; according to the per capita cost of incarcerating one juvenile in Department of Juvenile Justice, this decrease in commitments translates to a \$9,038,927 cost avoidance for the State; youth are being successfully treated in their own communities and kept from the devastation of incarceration, saving the State money, reducing the number of crime victims, and creating safer communities across Illinois; and

WHEREAS, P.A. 98-0060 provides that in a county with a population exceeding 2,000,000, the Redeploy Illinois Oversight Board may authorize the Department of Human Services to enter into an agreement with that county to reduce the number of commitments of juvenile offenders, except that the agreement may encompass a clearly identifiable geographical subdivision of that county; the geographical subdivision may include, but is not limited to, a police district or group of police districts, a geographical area making up a court calendar or group of court calendars, a municipal district or group of municipal districts, or a municipality or group of municipalities; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Department of Human Services and Cook County to enter into all Redeploy Illinois agreements allowable pursuant to P.A. 98-0060; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Redeploy Illinois Oversight Board, the Cook County Board President, the Director of the Illinois Department of Human Services, and the General Assembly.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 98

Offered by Representative Acevedo:

WHEREAS, When patients develop end stage kidney, liver, or heart disease, sometimes the only chance for a cure is a life-saving transplantation; and

WHEREAS, Despite federal laws that stipulate that organs should be allocated regardless of financial status, race, or national origin, in reality, lack of insurance prevents most of the uninsured in need of transplantation from ever getting one; these patients with end-organ failure are high utilizers of costly health care services throughout their lives; and

WHEREAS, Thirty percent of organ donors in the greater Chicago area are uninsured, yet less than 2% of the organ transplants go to the uninsured; and

WHEREAS, For uninsured patients with kidney failure, the Illinois Medicaid program pays for life saving dialysis costing upwards of \$100,000 per year for the lifetime of the patient; however, the program denies payment for life-saving kidney transplants and post-transplant care; and

WHEREAS, Many uninsured patients have family members or friends who would donate an organ, but for lack of insurance coverage, are unable to do so; and

WHEREAS, A program that would extend Illinois Medicaid to these patients would save the program money over time, as the care for a transplanted organ is less than the cost of maintaining a patient on lifelong dialysis; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there is created the Illinois Taskforce on Organ Transplantation for the Uninsured to develop proposals to expand Illinois Medicaid to include coverage for transplantation evaluation, organ allocation, and post-transplant medical care for the uninsured; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members:

- (1) 3 members of the Illinois House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (2) 3 members of the Illinois House of Representatives appointed by the House Minority Leader;
- (3) 3 members of the Illinois Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;
- (4) 3 members of the Illinois Senate appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; and
- (5) 4 members representing non-profit health care organizations, one appointed by each of the 4 caucus leaders; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services shall provide administrative and other support to the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly no later than January 1, 2015.
