To the Electors of the State of Illinois:

The purpose of a state constitution is to establish a structure for government and laws. There are three ways to initiate change to the Illinois Constitution: (1) a constitutional convention may propose changes to any part; (2) the General Assembly may propose changes to any part; or (3) a petition initiative may propose amendments limited to structural and procedural subjects contained in the Legislative Article. The people of Illinois must approve any changes to the Constitution before they become effective.

The proposed amendment adds a new section to the Suffrage and Elections Article of the Illinois Constitution. The section would ensure no person could be denied the right to register to vote or cast a ballot based on his or her race, color, ethnicity, status as a member of a language minority, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or income. At the general election to be held on November 4, 2014, you will be called upon to decide whether the proposed amendment should become part of the Illinois Constitution.

EXPLANATION

The proposed amendment would prohibit any law or procedure that intentionally discriminates or has an unequal effect upon the right of a person to register to vote or cast a ballot based on the voter's race, color, ethnicity, status as a member of a language minority, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or income.

The proposed amendment does not change the requirements for voting. A voter must still be a citizen of the United States, a permanent resident of Illinois for more than 30 days, and be 18 years of age.

Arguments In Favor of the Proposed Amendment

The proposed amendment is a demonstration that the people of Illinois believe all eligible Illinois citizens have a fundamental right to vote, and that laws and regulations that seek to prohibit eligible Illinois citizens from voting in an election should not be tolerated in a civil society. Under the amendment, any law or procedure that has a disparate impact upon the ability of a person to register to vote or cast a ballot based on the voter's race, color, ethnicity, status as a member of a language minority, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or income would be subject to strict judicial scrutiny.

Arguments Against the Proposed Amendment

This amendment is not necessary. Many of these protections are already provided by federal law. The proponents have not identified any instances of voter discrimination in Illinois that would justify the creation of a State cause of action. The proposed amendment will only serve to increase litigation.

Nothing in this Section shall be construed to alter the powers, duties, and responsibilities of the prosecuting attorney. The General Assembly may provide by law for the enforcement of this Section.

To the Electors of the State of Illinois:

The purpose of a state constitution is to establish a structure for government and laws. There are three ways to initiate change to the Illinois Constitution: (1) a constitutional convention may propose changes to any part; (2) the General Assembly may propose changes to any part; or (3) a petition initiative may propose amendments limited to structural and procedural subjects contained in the Legislative Article. The people of Illinois must approve any changes to the Constitution before they become effective.

EXPLANATION

The Constitution sets forth substantial rights for crime victims. The proposed amendment expands certain current rights:

1) Victims are currently entitled to fairness and respect throughout the criminal justice process. The amendment would also provide that they shall be protected from harassment, intimidation and abuse.

2) Victims currently can make a statement to the court when a criminal defendant is sentenced to punishment. The amendment would allow a victim to be heard at any proceeding that involves the victim's rights, and any proceeding involving a plea agreement, release of the defendant or convicted individual, or sentencing.

3) Victims may obtain information about conviction, sentencing, imprisonment or release. The amendment would require prosecutors and the court to notify victims of those events before they happen.

The amendment would also grant additional rights to crime victims:

1) A victim would have a right to formal notice and a hearing before the court rules on any request for access to the victim's information which is privileged or confidential information.

2) A victim would have the right to have the judge consider the victim's safety and the safety of his or her family before deciding whether to release a criminal defendant, setting the amount of bail to be paid before release, or setting conditions of release after arrest or conviction.

3) The victim would have the right to assert his or her rights in any court with jurisdiction over the criminal case, but would not have the same rights as the prosecutor or the criminal defendant and the court could not appoint an attorney for the victim at taxpayer expense.

The proposed amendment would not alter the powers, duties or responsibilities of the prosecutor. Further, a criminal defendant would not be able to challenge his or her conviction on the basis of a failure to follow these provisions.

Arguments in Favor of the Proposed Amendment

Victims of violent crimes deserve stronger protections under the Constitution than are currently provided. Victims should not have to fear intimidation and harassment when they participate in the criminal justice process. Judges must consider a victim's safety when setting bail, deciding whether a criminal defendant should be released during his or her trial, or sentencing a convicted defendant.

Further, victims should also be allowed to object when a defendant or a defendant's attorney attempts to obtain information about the victim that is confidential or private, like the victim's mental health records or personal journals. A judge would still be able to require a victim to turn those records or communications over to the court, but the amendment would allow the victim to object if he or she feels that a privacy violation would result.

A constitutional amendment is necessary because victims need the ability to enforce their rights. This amendment would provide that judges and prosecutors have a constitutional duty to keep the victim informed of developments in the case, and to allow the victim to participate when appropriate.

Arguments Against the Proposed Amendment

The proposed amendment would disrupt the criminal justice process and impede the work of prosecutors. Our criminal justice system tasks prosecutors, not victims, with punishing criminals and restoring justice after a crime is committed. Victims and their attorneys may attempt to take over that important role, second-guessing prosecutors and objecting to decisions made by judges.

Victims already have a right to be present and informed during the process, and Illinois already provides extensive rights to crime victims under the Rights of Crime Victims and Witnesses Act.

The proposed amendment threatens the rights of criminal defendants, both the guilty and the innocent. Our system gives criminal defendants the right to access information, documents and records that could prove their innocence; however, the amendment would give a victim the opportunity to prevent disclosure of certain materials or documents that might prove the defendant's innocence.

At the hour of 6:56 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1169

Offered by Representative Hurley:

WHEREAS, Approximately 6.5 million people in the United States and 1% of the global population have an intellectual disability; and

WHEREAS, In the 1950s and early 1960s, Eunice Kennedy Shriver saw how unjustly and unfairly people with intellectual disabilities were treated and saw that many children with intellectual disabilities didn't even have a place to play; deciding to take action, she held a summer day camp for young people with intellectual disabilities in her backyard in order to learn what these children could do in sports and other activities and not dwell on what they could not do; and

WHEREAS, Throughout the 1960s, Eunice Kennedy Shriver continued her pioneering work, both as the driving force behind President John F. Kennedy's White House panel on people with intellectual disabilities and as the director of the Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr. Foundation; her vision and drive for justice eventually grew into the Special Olympics movement; and

WHEREAS, The Special Olympics strives to create a better world by fostering the acceptance and inclusion of all people; through the power of sports, people with intellectual disabilities discover new strengths and abilities, skills, and success and find joy, confidence and fulfillment on the playing field and in life; and

WHEREAS, The Special Olympics hosts a wide range of training sessions, competitions, health screenings, and fund-raising events for those with intellectual disabilities; the organization also creates opportunities for families, community members, local leaders, businesses, law enforcement, celebrities, dignitaries, and others to band together to change attitudes and support athletes; and

WHEREAS, Anne McGlone Burke, then a Chicago Park District instructor at West Pullman Park, received support from Mayor Richard J. Daley to pursue her vision to organize an event showcasing the abilities of her athletes; and

WHEREAS, On July 19-20, 1968, the first International Special Olympics Summer Games were held at Soldier Field in Chicago; a thousand people with intellectual disabilities from 26 U.S. states and Canada competed in track and field and swimming; and

WHEREAS, The Special Olympics mission of empowering those with intellectual disabilities through sport remains as vital today as it did when the movement was founded; the athletes, administration, and countless volunteers of the Special Olympics are worthy of the greatest respect; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate July of 2014 as Special Olympics Month in the State of Illinois in honor of this great organization and its goals; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Special Olympics as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1171

Offered by Representative Cross:

WHEREAS, On February 25, 2014, the members of the Illinois House of Representatives passed House Joint Resolution 80 which estimated FY'15 revenues at \$34,495,000,000 with bipartisan support, receiving 112 votes in the affirmative and 0 against; and

WHEREAS, On May 27, 2014, House Joint Resolution 100 was introduced which estimated \$35,352,000,000 in revenue for FY'15 even though no changes to the tax structure have been made by either chamber; and

WHEREAS, The new revenue estimate which the current spending plan passed by the Illinois House of Representatives is based relies heavily on the borrowing for other State funds that have a dedicated purpose, an estimated \$650,000,000 in total; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that funds including but not limited to the After School Rescue Fund, Alzheimer's Disease Research Fund, American Red Cross Fund, Amusement Ride and Patron Safety Fund, Anti-Pollution Fund, Anna Veterans Home Fund, African-American HIV/AIDS Response Fund, Assistance to the Homeless Fund, Autism Awareness Fund, Child Abuse Prevention Fund, Childhood Cancer Research Fund, Council on Developmental Disabilities Fund, Disabled Veterans Property Tax Relief Fund, Domestic Violence Shelter and Service Fund, Penny Severns Breast, Cervical and Ovarian Cancer Research Fund, Alzheimer's Disease Research Fund, Hunger Relief Fund, Diabetes Research Fund, Autism Research Fund, Epilepsy Disease Assistance Fund, Military Family Relief Fund, Prostate Cancer Research Fund, Fire Prevention Fund, Hunger Relief Fund, Illinois Clean Water Fund, Illinois Police Association Fund, Illinois Veterans Homes Fund, Illinois Veterans Assistance Funds, Manteno Veterans Home Fund, Mammogram Fund, Multiple Sclerosis Research Fund, Ovarian Cancer Awareness Fund, Quincy Veterans Home Fund, Radiation Protection Fund, September 11th Fund, Support Our Troops Fund, and Violent Crime Victims Assistance Fund are too important to the general wellbeing of citizens of Illinois to be swept for budgetary relief and that no member of the General Assembly supports taking money from these funds for budgetary relief; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to Governor Patrick Quinn, President of the Senate John Cullerton, and Speaker of the House Michael Madigan.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1173

Offered by Representative Moffitt:

WHEREAS, Ronald Wilson Reagan "Dutch" (1911-2004), the 40th President of the United States, is the only U.S. President born, raised, and educated in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan was born on February 6, 1911 in Tampico; his family lived for a time in Chicago, Galesburg, and Monmouth, before settling in Dixon; he earned his degree in economics and sociology from Eureka College in Central Illinois in 1932; after college, he started as a radio sports announcer in the Quad Cities; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan moved to Hollywood and achieved success as a film and television actor, union president for the Screen Actors Guild, and as corporate spokesman for General Electric; he moved into politics and spent 2 terms as Governor of California (1967-1975) and 2 terms as President of the United States (1981-1989); and

WHEREAS, President Reagan returned to his home State throughout every stage of his life; he visited his birthplace, his hometown, and his alma mater, Eureka College; he never forgot his Illinois and Midwestern roots; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan's connection to Illinois is celebrated all over the State; Eureka College is home to "Reagan Forward" and the Ronald W. Reagan Society, whose national membership helps fund scholarships for Reagan Fellows, a museum, a peace garden, a speaker series, a Run with Reagan 5k, and the Mark R. Shenkman Reagan Research Center, housing every book on the 40th President; Dixon is home to the Reagan Boyhood Home and the Dixon Historic Center, a riverfront statue of him on a horse, the First Christian Church where he was baptized, an annual festival, and the beach at Lowell Park where he was a lifeguard; Tampico operates a museum and historic site where visitors can stand in the apartment flat where he was born and see a statue of him as a boy; a section of Interstate 88 is named in his honor, and The Reagan Trail is a designated tourism corridor connecting key points of his Illinois experience; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan is remembered as one of the most consequential world leaders of the 20th century; his commitment to peace through strength helped in the defeat of the Soviet Union, thus ending the Cold War and bringing greater freedom to millions of people; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize and honor the impact President Ronald Reagan had on the State, the country, and the world; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we request the Architect of the Capitol place a statue of President Reagan in the Illinois State Capitol Building or on the surrounding grounds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the statue shall be funded with private donations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Architect of the Capitol.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1179

Offered by Representative McAuliffe:

WHEREAS, Certain communities on the Northwest side of the City of Chicago (including Edison Park, Norwood Park, Jefferson Park, Gladstone Park, and Big Oaks) are affected by the key nighttime air routes serving O'Hare International Airport that converge over these communities; this includes 5 glide paths, major take-off plates, and air routes - all used after 10:00pm; and

WHEREAS, These communities seek a solution to the nighttime sleep interruptions during the hours of 10:00pm and 7:00am, including the shoulder hours as well and wish to be eligible for noise mitigation assistance; and

WHEREAS, These communities are experiencing higher levels of jet noise, especially during phase one nighttime flight operations; and

WHEREAS, Under the existing federal statutory and regulatory schemes establishing noise contours and determining eligibility for noise mitigation assistance, these communities affected by O'Hare International Airport noise are not currently included; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago City Council placed the following referendum on the November 4, 2014 General Election Ballot:

"Should Congress pass a law that requires that the Federal Aviation Administration to revisit the criteria it uses to create "noise contours" that determine which residences near airports across the country are eligible for noise mitigation?"; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express our support for the November 4, 2014 referendum question on noise mitigation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Commissioner of O'Hare International Airport, the Acting Administrator of the Federal Aeronautics Administration, to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation, to each member of the Chicago City Council, and to the Mayor of the City of Chicago.
