WHEREAS, The Export-Import Bank has helped support exports as the fastest-growing segment of the Illinois economy, accounting for nearly 14% of the Gross State Product and sustaining 210,913 jobs; and

WHEREAS, Fifty-nine countries, including China, France, Germany, Brazil, Canada, and Korea, have export credit agencies that are similar to the Export-Import Bank; and

WHEREAS, The majority of Illinois businesses do not have the global presence necessary to compete against foreign companies that receive support from their national export credit agency; and

WHEREAS, The Export-Import Bank is financially self-sustaining, resulting in almost \$2 billion of profit for taxpayers that has helped to reduce the federal deficit over the last 2 years; and

WHEREAS, The Export-Import Bank helps Illinois businesses to successfully compete in the global economy against foreign corporations; and

WHEREAS, Without swift action, American industries will be at a competitive disadvantage to foreign competitors in the global marketplace, hindering the economic vitality of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The Export-Import Bank provides the necessary tools for economic recovery, future growth, and jobs for the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we strongly encourage Congress to pass a long-term reauthorization of the Export-Import Bank before its charter expires on June 30, 2015; and be it further
