HOUSE RESOLUTION

The following resolution was offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 540

Offered by Representative Madigan:

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Rules of the House of Representatives of the 99th General Assembly are amended by changing Rule 65 as follows:

(House Rule 65)

65. Reconsideration.

(a) A member who voted on the prevailing side of a record vote on a legislative measure still within the control of the House may on the same or the following legislative day move to reconsider the vote. The motion to reconsider may be laid on the table without affecting the vote to which it refers. When the motion to reconsider is made during the last 3 days of April or any time thereafter during the regular session, or at any time during a veto or special session, any member may move that the vote on reconsideration be taken immediately. The member who filed the motion to reconsider may withdraw the motion at any time by filing a notice of withdrawal with the Clerk. A question that requires the affirmative vote of a majority of those elected or more to carry requires a majority of those elected to reconsider. A question in committee that requires the affirmative vote of a majority of those appointed or more to carry requires a majority of those appointed to reconsider; any other question in committee requires a majority of those voting to reconsider.

(b) A motion to reconsider a record vote on the adoption of a floor amendment to a bill may be made only on Second Reading.

(c) If a motion to reconsider is made under this Rule and the motion is later tabled, the question shall not be further reconsidered. This subsection (c) may be suspended only by the affirmative vote of 71 members elected.

(d) When a motion to reconsider is made within the time prescribed by these Rules, the Clerk shall not allow the bill or other subject matter of the motion to pass out of the possession of the House until after the motion has been decided or withdrawn. Such a motion shall be deemed rejected if laid on the table.

(e) A Representative who voted "present" or failed to vote on a question does not have the right to move for reconsideration.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 536

Offered by Representative Bourne:

WHEREAS, Illinois has been a leader in energy production within the United States, in large part due to Illinois' vast coal resources; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has the largest recoverable bituminous coal reserves in the United States, a reserve base larger than all but 6 countries in the world, and the ability to produce all of America's electricity needs for 100 years or Illinois' power needs for 600 years at current consumption rates; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is the largest electricity exporter in the Midwest and one of the largest in the United States, and nearly 45% of Illinois' energy comes from coal-burning plants within the State; and

WHEREAS, Historically, the cost of electricity from coal has been the most economical on the basis of dollars per megawatt hour produced and price fluctuations for coal have been much less than any other fuel source; and

WHEREAS, Coal power plants in the United States have met the environmental challenges of the past 4 decades while meeting the low-cost energy needs of the nation, as coal used for electricity in the United States has increased by 165% since 1970 while key emission rates have declined by 90%; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois coal industry is currently responsible for over \$2,500,000,000 in annual economic activity within the State, including employing roughly 5,000 miners with an average salary of \$85,000 a year, higher than both the United States and Illinois median household incomes; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois coal industry has faced increased environmental regulations in the last 2 decades that resulted in coal production going from 62 million tons of mined coal in 1990 to a low of 31 million tons in 2003 and a loss of 6,500 direct jobs during this time period; and

WHEREAS, The Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 imposed strict sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission standards, making coal mined in Illinois unusable without flue gas desulfurization (FGD) equipment, often referred to as "scrubbers"; and

WHEREAS, Technology can be deployed that allows high-sulfur Illinois coal to be burned efficiently while meeting strict State and federal air emission standards; specifically the State of Illinois should be encouraging the retrofitting and use of advanced clean coal technologies such as flue gas desulfurization, wet electro-static precipitators (wet ESPs), and oxy-combustion; and

WHEREAS, All of the power plants in Illinois which now burn Wyoming coal were originally designed for Illinois coal and the choice of technology was driven in part by the lack of certainty regarding the recovery of investments in wet scrubbers; and

WHEREAS, It is costing Illinois consumers more than \$1,000,000,000 annually to import coal from other states, primarily from Wyoming, while Illinois coal is being exported and used in other states in power plants with scrubbers; and

WHEREAS, Using Illinois coal within Illinois would lead to substantial economic benefits by saving \$1,000,000,000 in transportation costs and creating thousands of new jobs in mining and ancillary industries in currently economically depressed counties in central and southern Illinois and it would create more State and local tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, Using Illinois coal within Illinois benefits the environment as well as the economy by reducing CO₂ emissions through the use of higher rank coals and by reducing rail traffic by 50,000,000,000 ton-miles annually; and

WHEREAS, The recent growth in Illinois coal production has been due to considerable new investment in the Illinois coal fields producing low cost coal and the retrofit of pollution control technology in power plants throughout the United States in response to changes in the Clean Air Act mandating reduced air emissions; and

WHEREAS, The switch to Illinois coal will improve the competitiveness of Illinois power generation as Illinois coal has a lower delivered cost, stable pricing, and higher heat content; once retrofitted with advanced technology, Illinois power plants fired with Illinois coal should be more competitive in electricity markets, thereby helping to insure the continued generation of competitive power for both in-state customers and the out-of-state electricity market; and

WHEREAS, Much of the State of Illinois overlays the Mount Simon Sandstone, a saline filled, porous, deep geological formation of enormous capacity that has been determined to be one of the most significant carbon resources in the United States and its development could result in expanded use of Illinois coal in a carbon-constrained world; and

WHEREAS, It is vital that Illinois coal be considered part of an "All of the Above" approach to energy production in order to keep Illinois as a leader in energy production, job creation, economic growth, and environmental protection; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois Commerce Commission prepare a report on the cost and efficiency benefits of using Illinois coal at Illinois coal-burning plants, including any legislative impediments and the impact on residential and commercial ratepayer; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Power Agency to prepare a report on the effect that burning Illinois coal has on reliability and capacity for the Midwest region and the mechanisms that could be utilized to provide cost recovery of incremental environmental investments to generators switching to Illinois coal; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity prepare a report on the economic benefits and job creation potential from switching to Illinois coal and the result of more coal production; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency prepare a report on the environmental impact (including reduced CO₂ emissions) of burning Illinois coal with the use of flue gas desulfurization equipment, reduced rail travel and associated CO₂ emission reductions, more efficient energy production as a result of Illinois coal's high energy density and the potential for the development of the carbon storage capacity of the Mount Simon Sandstone and the impact of bringing Illinois air emission standards in line with those of the federal government; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Department of Revenue to prepare a report on the impact on State and local taxes from Illinois power plants switching to Illinois coal; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the findings of those reports be presented to the General Assembly and the Governor by October 1, 2015 for consideration and appropriate action; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor Bruce Rauner, the Illinois Congressional Delegation, and all the members of the General Assembly.

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois General Assembly stand united in our strong support of all military personnel who have served and call on all Illinoisans to show support to all those who wear the uniform; and

WHEREAS, Forty-two years ago, World War II veteran Jesse Crow watched as soldiers returned to DeSoto from tours of duty in Vietnam; Mr. Crow fought in Europe as a member of the United States Army's 101st Airborne Division; and

WHEREAS, It is believed by many veterans that after World War II, other wars are ignored or forgotten; Jesse Crow observed and recognized this and dedicated his time to making sure that none of DeSoto's veterans are ever forgotten; and

WHEREAS, In 2001, Jesse Crow began planning to build a memorial in the community; the memorial was built almost entirely with private donations; Mr. Crow designed the 6 1/2-foot tall black granite monument, which sits on a triangular island of land bordered by Illinois Route 149 and Pine and Lincoln Streets; and

WHEREAS, The monument is engraved with the emblems of all the branches of the military and is flanked by matching black granite benches; it bears the names of all DeSoto's past and future veterans, regardless of whether they served in a time of war or peace; and

WHEREAS, Jesse Crow stated, "It is one thing to read history in the pages of a book, but when you see a monument carved in stone, it's forever"; and

WHEREAS, It is important that we urge communities across the State to consider appropriate expressions of support and recognition for veterans living in their midst; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate the portion of Illinois Route 149 East from U.S. Route 51 to the Jackson County Line as the "Veterans Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name of the "Veterans Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Village of DeSoto.

WHEREAS, The Urban Weatherization Initiative (Public Act 96-0037) is administered by the Office of Urban Assistance in the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity; it is the first state-funded weatherization program in the country; and

WHEREAS, The Urban Weatherization Initiative is comprised of 3 main components: the Weatherization Specialist Training Grant, in which grant organizations will provide trainees with the skills they need to become weatherization specialists, including addressing air infiltration issues and installing pipe, duct, wall, and attic insulation; the Home Energy Auditor Training Grant, in which organizations will provide home energy auditor training and prepare trainees to become nationally certified as Home Energy Auditors; and the Residential Weatherization Program, which is designed to employ certified trainees, weatherize homes, create energy savings, and stimulate the local economy; and

WHEREAS, The Urban Weatherization Initiative was created in order to: create jobs and increase skills and career opportunities for the underemployed and unemployed; improve energy efficiency and reduce energy costs in disadvantaged communities; and stimulate local economies by purchasing supplies from local distributors and manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, The Urban Weatherization Initiative will assist citizens in numerous urban communities in Alexander, Kane, Lake, Macon, Peoria, St. Clair, Will, Cook, Kankakee, LaSalle, Madison, Rock Island, Stephenson, and Winnebago Counties; and

WHEREAS, The 2016 State budget has included a total of \$325 million in appropriations for the Urban Weatherization Initiative; and

WHEREAS, These appropriations include \$75 million for cultural site programs, \$60 million for vocational learning programs, \$100 million for housing programs, \$40 million in youth development programs for libraries, park districts, and schools, and \$50 million for weatherization projects; and

WHEREAS, The Urban Weatherization Initiative is an extremely important policy initiative for the State of Illinois; the passage of the program's appropriations is paramount to the growth and stability of our State's urban areas; therefore, be it
