HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1143

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders can affect all individuals regardless of racial, ethnic, economic, and social groups; and

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has stated that 1 in 6 children in the United States has a developmental disability, ranging from mild disabilities such as speech and language impairments to serious developmental disabilities, such as intellectual disabilities, cerebral palsy, and autism; and

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders are more common than pediatric cancer, diabetes, and AIDS combined; and

WHEREAS, Studies in Asia, Europe, and North America have identified individuals with an autism spectrum disorder, with an average prevalence of about 1%; a recent study in South Korea reported a prevalence of 2.6%; and

WHEREAS, About 1 in 68 children has been identified with an autism spectrum disorder, according to estimates from CDC's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring Network; and

WHEREAS, The cause of autism spectrum disorders is still unknown, but research strongly suggests that it is caused by certain factors that affect brain development; and

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders have increased tenfold in the last decade and now occur in some form in 1 in 42 boys in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Autism, which is five times more common among boys than girls, usually appears during the first three years of life; and

WHEREAS, Early diagnosis, research, training, education, and therapies are vital to reducing the effects of autism; and

WHEREAS, Current research suspects that there is not a single cause that will ultimately be discovered, but rather a cluster of factors which include genetics, pregnancy/birth complications, viral infections, metabolic disorders, congenital anomaly syndrome (birth defects), and environmental toxins; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate April of 2016 as Autism Awareness Month in the State of Illinois for the purpose of urging both government entities and the citizenry to become aware and educated on the subject of autism spectrum disorders.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1144

Offered by Representative Phelps:

WHEREAS, Dogs have partnered with humans for over 20,000 years, resulting in the close bond and mutual dependence we share today with these wonderful animals; and

WHEREAS, Purebred dog breeds were historically developed to respond to all manner of specific needs of humans, from utilitarian to comfort and enjoyment; purpose-bred dogs, due to their recorded lineage, represent the predictability of size, temperament, coat type, energy level, and trainability that were specifically bred for those tasks that are now invaluable to humans; and

WHEREAS, Purebred dogs were carefully selected to assist mankind in almost all aspects of our lives; these purpose-bred animals tend our flocks, herd our cattle, hunt game on land and water, rid our homes and

barns of destructive vermin, pull our carts or sleds, protect our children, guard our homes, and rescue humans in snow, land, and water; and

WHEREAS, Purebred dogs were developed to perform viable jobs that humans rely upon every day; these dogs act as police officers, protect our military from bombs and enemies, guide our blind, alert the deaf, assist our veterans, act as helping hands to the disabled, alert their owners to various medical conditions, comfort the sick, and are our partners in every human endeavor; and

WHEREAS, Purebred dogs have provided inestimable help to medical science, serving as models for various diseases, advancing both human and canine medicine; and

WHEREAS, Dogs of purebred or mixed heritage should all be valued, but the preservation and promotion of the various purpose-bred dogs should be celebrated and preserved for future generations; and

WHEREAS, Each purebred dog breed represents the living history of mankind's evolution alongside their canine companions, and, as befits their importance to humans, should be preserved as living testament to the partnership between species that is celebrated in over 80 million homes in the United States; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we proudly recognize May 1, 2016 as National Purebred Dog Day in celebration of purebred dogs and the many service and companion benefits they provide; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the American Kennel Club and the Illinois Federation of Dog Clubs and Owners.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1145

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, Someone develops Alzheimer's disease every 66 seconds; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is on the rise with 5.4 million Americans currently living with the disease and an estimated 16 million Americans projected to be diagnosed with the disease by 2050; and

WHEREAS, Currently, 220,000 people in Illinois live with the disease; there will be 260,000 in just nine years; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease will cost Illinois \$1.53 billion in Medicaid funding in 2016; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of death, more than breast and prostate cancer combined, and an unrelenting, progressive condition that destroys brain cells; currently, no cure or even a way to slow the progression of the disease exists; Alzheimer's places significant financial burdens on families and businesses, with businesses losing billions a year in lost productivity and replacement expenses for employees who miss work or quit to care for a relative; and

WHEREAS, In Illinois in 2015, there were 590,000 Illinois family members and friends who provided over 671 million hours of unpaid care, valued at \$8.22 billion, to their loved ones with Alzheimer's and other dementia; and

WHEREAS, The impact of Alzheimer's and other dementia on Illinois families, the health care system, and society as a whole is of great importance; the need for home and community-based services for those with Alzheimer's is on the rise and caregiver stress is at an all-time high; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is a looming public health crisis and we call upon all policy makers to join in the efforts to raise awareness and to serve the hundreds of thousands of persons with Alzheimer's and other dementia in Illinois, their families, and caregivers; and

WHEREAS, On April 14, 2016, Alzheimer's advocates will speak up for the needs and rights of people with Alzheimer's and their families and ask the Illinois legislature to make Alzheimer's disease a priority public health issue in the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we proclaim April 14, 2016 as the Annual Alzheimer's Association Advocacy Day in the State of Illinois.
